A Brief Biography of

JOHANN HARDER

1836-1930

To understand the nature of a personality it is necessary to realize that its make-up is determined by forces deeply rooted in the past. Personality does not develop in a vacuum. It must have both an hereditary basis and an environment that nurtures it. Grandfather's quality of intelligence - his long span of life - and his more than ninety years of rather good health speak significantly of a good hereditary background. The Mennonite way of life in which Grandfather lived his whole life furnished an interesting fertile soil for its growth and development.

Grandfather's Forebears

His Great-Grandfather: In 1803 a Johann Harder migrated with his family from Marienburg a region in W. Prussia; to the Russian Ukraine. This Harder family was one among one hundred and sixty-two families that emigrated in the summer of 1803. Most of these colonists were rather well-to-do farmers. After paying the ten percent emigration tax they still had enough capital left with which to stock up their new farms. Only a small minority had to accept the help of the Russian Government offered poor immigrants. In July 1804 this great grandfather arrived with his family in the newly established settlement on the Molotschna River. He built his home in the village of Blumstein and bought farm #16. He died in 1826. There were five children born into this family: Johann (Grandfather's Grandfather) Abraham - Elisabeth - another daughter whose name has not been recorded anywhere.

His Grandfather: Grandfather's grandfather - also Johann Harder was seventeen years old when his parents migrated to the Molotschna Colony in 1803. Being the oldest son - he inherited the family estate in Blumstein. His 1st wife was Elisabeth Plett who bore him 6 children: Johann (grandfather's father) Abraham - Isbrand - Elisabeth - Helena and Peter. After her death Grandfather's grandfather married Katharina Mandler - who bore him two children: Isbrand and Marie.

His father. Grandfather's father was born on September 15, 1811 in the Harder Home in Blumstein. Being the oldest son he came into possession of the family estate. His father was thus the third Johann Harder to make the living on farm #16. Grandfather's father also was married twice. On October 9, 1834 he married Justina Schulz who had grown up in the village of Friedensdorf. To this union 11 children were born. These were in order of birth: Justina - Johann (Grandfather) - Justina - Abraham - Isbrand - Helena - Heinrich - Heinrich - David - Elisabeth and Justina. His wife Justina died Mar. 8, 1856.

In July of that same year his father married Katharina Schulz who according to grandfather's own records was born August 18, 1839. If this date of birth is correct Katharina Schulz was not only 28 years younger than her husband but also younger than three of her new stepchildren. She became the mother of seven children: Katharina - Aganetha - Anna - Jacob - Jacob - Bernhard and Bernhard.

Although Grandfather's father had eighteen children the high rate of infant mortality of that day swept a surprising number into early graves. Modern medical skills would have prevented much of the waste of babies so common several generations ago. It is interesting to note too that the same given names were used again and again. For example the name Justina appears three times among grandfather's sisters. None of them reached the age of ten years.

It would be quite unfair to grandfather's father if I didn't point out the very significant role he played in Mennonite history in Russia. In 1860 he was ordained as Elder in the large Orloff-Halbstadt Mennonite Church. As elder he demonstrated such fine leadership during a period of great religious controversy that the Mennonite Church in Russia was preserved partly through his efforts and wisdom. Historical accounts of the unlovely religious feud that threatened to destroy the Mennonite Church during the sixties contains the name of Elder Johann Harder again and again as the great champion of tolerance.

And now the Biography

It is rather difficult to write an adequate biography of a person when available information is rather limited. Grandfather left a few written accounts of his life - but they are so devoid of details. Naturally he was not trained or disposed to give a journalistic or a historical account of his experiences. One looks in vain for little human interest stories that add so much color and meaning to a biography. The person writing a biography of Grandfather Harder must put a few small pieces together and attempt to construct the whole picture.

Grandfather's Youth: Grandfather was born in the village of Blumstein which belonged to the Molotschna Colony of Mennonites. According to the Russian Calendar of that time he was born on August 8, 1836. Translated to the American Calendar he was born August 20, 1836. As mentioned earlier in his biography his father was the well-known elder of the Orloff Mennonite Church.

Grandfather spent his boyhood somewhat under frontier conditions. High cultural and spiritual ideals were not generally emphasized. Not only the school but the total life of the colony offered too little that was socially and intellectually constructive. On Sunday morning boys and girls listened to rather lengthy sermons that were read from books. The Sunday afternoons - holidays and many weekday evenings were spent in revelry. There were no planned ~~wholesome~~ wholesome activities to absorb the time and energies of youth. Smoking and drinking were all too common among the boys. Shady stories and wild pranks helped to fill the idle hours. It seems that grandfather was different. He does not seem to have been involved in that kind of life. Never have I heard anyone refer to youthful escapades of Grandfather. His godly parents and his religious inclinations seemingly kept him free from such sinful experiences.

His education was obtained at a small village school in Blumstein. The quality of instruction throughout the colony was not very encouraging. Grandfather seems to have spent one year from home attending the school conducted by the gifted teacher and preacher Bernhard Harder - his father's uncle. There is no record indicating that he attended one of the Centralschulen (high schools) that were being organized at that time in various Mennonite settlements.

On November 16.1858 Grandfather married Elisabeth Fast - daughter of Johann Fast - a teacher at Schoenau. Soon after his marriage Grandfather moved to the village of Friedensruh where he taught in the village school for three years.. Then he moved to the village of Schoenau - where he taught another four years.

Transplanted to Crimea: By 1850 population pressure had become an economic problem for the Mennonites in Russia. The rapid increase in population and the government provision that the entire estate must pass intact to a single member upon the death of the former owner worked a hardship upon those members who did not share the land inheritance. But Grandfather inherited the estate in Blumstein he would have been the fourth Johann Harder to live there. Evidently his father was unable or unwilling to retire thus forcing Grandfather to make his living elsewhere.

A solution of this problem was sought quite early in the purchase of daughter colonies as an outlet for the surplus population. The first daughter community was established in the Crimea in 1862 by a group of Molotschna landseekers who first became acquainted with the fields about Simferopol while engaged in transporting the wounded from the battlefields to their Molotschna homes during the Crimean War.

In the spring of 1865 Grandfather moves his growing family to the Crimea where he bought a small farm. The little village of Annenfeld became his home for the next nine years. The first few years were difficult with the usual problems confronting in any pioneer situation. But after having become familiar with the climate and soil in the crimea he began to prosper. Nine years later in 1874 he was able to sell out with considerable profit and emigrate to America.

When Grandfather and Gransmother with the two oldest children moved to the Crimea they joined a small group of Mennonites that met in various homes to sing pray and search the scriptures for more insight and understanding of God's Word. As mentioned earlier in this biography this was the time that the Mennonite church in Russia had reached a low point in its spiritual life. Grandfather too was concerned with living a more christian life. With his friends he sought to find it.

In 1869 Jacob A. Wiebe a former Elder in the Kleine Gemeinde in the Crimea invited all those interested in greater spiritual life into a new church fellowship. Convinced according to God's Word tha baptism by immersion was most biblical the Grandparents and seventeen others were rebaptized by Wiebe. Then they proceeded to organize a new Mennonite denomination that is still known as the Krimmer Mennonite Brethren Shurch. In 1871 Grandfather was elected to the ministry and assisted the Elder Jacob A. Wiebe.

Migration to America: Among the written records that Grandfather left behind his description of the journey to America is the most complete. But even here one looks in vain for the reasons for the migration. He simply begins by saying "We drove to the depot..."

By 1870 it had become quite clear to the Mennonites in Russia that the Russian government was reversing ist policy towards the Mennonites particularly the issue of military exemption. Realizing that Russia would not long remain a place of religious freedom more than 10 000 made preparations to seek a new land. In 1874 the whole Krimmer Mennonite Brethren Church migrated from the Crimea to the plains of central Kansas. The journey began on May 30.1874 and ended at Peabody kansas August 16 of the same year. the name of the ship upon which

they crossed the Atlantic was the S.S. City of Brocklyn.

Pioner Life in America: Elder Wiebe left his group at Elkart Indiana for several weeks while he went ahead to Kansas to select a place for his group. After he had bought 12 sections of land from the Santa Fe Railroad Co. at \$3.00 an acre he wrote to the group at Elkhart to come. Although most of the families in the group were extremely poor even having borrowed the money for their transportation to America - Grandfather seem to have been more fortunate financially.

At first the whole Krimmer Mennonite Brethren Church which came to America in a body under Elder Wiebe's leadership - attempted to transplant the village system of life so common in Russia. Two mile south east of Hillsboro a site for a village called Gnadenu was selected. Then light board shanties were built walls dug and land prepared for the first winter wheat crop. Prices for various needed seed were high. Wheat was .70 cents and corn \$1.25 and potatoes sold for \$2.00 per bushel. In 1886 grandfather moved out of the vilge Gnadenu and settled upon his own farm as did most of the other families in the village. In America the village way of life was not practical.

Grandmother too was important: Grandmother must not be forgotten in this biography. Nothing is known of her girlhood. At the age of twenty she married grandfather. She seems to have possessed a delicate constitution. In Grandfather's writings there are many references to her illnesses. The many years of pioneer privations first in Crimea - and then in Kansas - put a great strain upon her limited strenght. Then too it must be remembered that she gave birth to ~~xxx~~ eleven children in a time when medical care hospitals and general knowlege of child care were very meager.

Eight year after coming to America the oldest daughter Elisabeth married Jacob Klassen leaving Grandmother alone with all her housework. Since her only other daughter Helena was but a mere child. Grandmother found herself unable to carry all of her responsibilities. One day when Grandfather was working in the yard with his seven boys - Grandmother prevailed upon her husband to assign one of the boys to help her regularly in the house. Grandfather commented to such an arrangement and her son David was promoted to housework.

In 1898 Grandmother died. She and Grandfather had lived together for forty years. At the time of her death most of her children were married and all were grown up. Throughout her whole life she expressed saintly qualities. In one of his writings Grandfather says "She was an angel." The spiritual welfare of her children was of greatest importance to her.

A Journey to the Old Country: Two years after Grandmother's death Grandfather made a journey back to Russia. Having prospered sufficiently he desired to still the deep yearning to see his brethren and sisters again. The privilege to return to Russia for a visit was not granted to very many of those who left it during the period of migration. While there Grandfather met the widow Renetta Schulz whom he married in April 1900. By marrying the widow Grandfather did not only have a new wife but he became a stepfather to her four young daughters.

Grandfather as a Man: Grandfather never wrote a book - he perfected no invention - he created nothe in arts. Grandfather's contribution in the world was his Christian life. He lived what he believed. Grandfather was not perfect. He possessed certain weaknesses. I think one could say that he lacked keen sensitivity to the yearnings

in other peoples souls. He was not harsh - more indifferent to the feelings of others. He just was not sensitive to them. Grandmother's nature was just a little too delicate for him. Then too he was a little too patriarchal in his role of husband and father.

He manifested certain strong personality ~~xxx~~ traits that must be pointed out. Among these stability ranks high in the list. Grandfather possessed an even temperament. He was not driven to and fro by every current of opinion and belief. He was steadfast. Another personality trait that may be listed here was his ability to get along with everyone. Grandfather was never noisy nor inclined to argue with men. He lived in peace with his fellowmen.

In Conclusion: Grandfather died on February 23.1930. He reached the age of 94 years. During these years he lived a good life. His life is a good example for his children and children's children to follow. We who are his descendants have many reasons to be very proud of Grandfather Johann Harder.

This biography could have been and should have been more complete but space in this book was too limited.

Dear Brothers Sisters Nephews and Nieces:

We received your letters and read them with great interest. I am very glad this correspondence in our family can go on in this way. We in our family are all well Happy and of courage. Our daughter Irene with her two children are still living in our house. Wesley her husband is not yet discharged from the navy. Daughter Josephine and Bruce also live in our house and are both working in the City Hospital. Miriam and Jimmy are still in Ottawa. I am as before an accountant for an Insurance Co. I like my work very well. My dear ~~Kxx~~ Kathryn is well and happy and tends to house duties. The weather in December has been very cold for over a week. Some nights 34 below zero. 1945 is now over and looking back we find very many things have happened and much history was made.

On the other side of this page I am briefly bringing a family record of our ancestors. Our parents emigrated from Crimea S. Russia to America and settled on the plains of central Kansas in 1874 in the village Gnadenu of which you see a picture on the other side. To them 11 children were born 8 boys and 3 girls. Five boys and 2 girls were born in Russia and of them one girl died when yet an infant. In America twins were born twice. First 2 boys and of them one died when yet an infant. Second twins were one boy and one girl. The names of the children are John - Elizabeth I. - who died an infant - Elizabeth II. Abram - Isbrand - Henry - David - the twin brothers Bernhard and Jacob - (Jacob died in infancy) the other twins were Peter and Lena.

The first house in the picture of Gnadenau is our old home. The twin brothers and my twin sister and I were born there. Much work poverty and sickness and other hardships made the pioneer years very hard. With tears in her eyes our mother has told us how hard it had been to nurse her last twins through their infant years. We read Psalm 121: 5 "The Lord is thy keeper. The Lord is thy shade upon thy right hand. The sun shall not smite thee by day nor the moon by night." This keeper did not slumber nor sleep over our old pioneer home. We seven brothers and two sisters all grew up and the Lord cared for us preserved us and blessed us wonderfully. The Lord preserved our going out and our coming in on the farm and in schools. You see their pictures on the other side. I am sorry the picture of our sister Elizabeth has not been available. You see the pictures of our parents and our Grandparents. Next you see records of our Great-Grandparents and Maternal Great-Great-Grandparents and one Great-Great-Great-Grandfather born 1694 - 251 years ago.

In the year 1886 when I was 8 years old our parents moved with us out of the village Gnadenau and settled on a farm - the second picture on the other side. Today we look around and we find our parents - our sister Elizabeth - brother Abram - brother Isbrand - brother Henry and brother David are not here anymore. They have died and passed away. Only brother John - the oldest - and the three youngest - brother Bernhard - sister Lena and I are living. The village Gnadenau is no more. All the pioneer homes are gone. The buildings of our old farm are no more. The old fruit and orchard gardens are wiped from the ground. Looking ahead of us we have the promises of a heavenly home bright and fair - no death nor pain shall enter there. There we shall build houses and inhabit them - we shall plant vineyards and eat the fruit of them. We shall not labour in vain Isaiah 65:21. My prayer is that our faith may be stronger - our hope brighter and our love purer as we grow older. I pray to God that our whole spirit and soul and body be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. God be with you all.
