held at Winnipeg, Manitoba, July 3-6, 1976

SECTION A

BUSINESS SESSION I - Monday, July 5, 1976 - 9 a.m.

Chairman - F. C. Peters

Secretaries - C. J. Rempel, D. D. Duerksen

1. Opening of the Convention

Paul Wiebe led in the singing of "How Great Thou Art" and "Come Christians Join to Sing". The moderator read the conference theme from Eph. 3:18-21 and welcomed the delegates to the 65th Convention of the Canadian Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches, thanked the host conference and the City of Winnipeg for the welcome and the facilities and led in prayer. He then introduced Premier Ed Schreyer.

2. Greetings

- a. Premier Schreyer addressed the conference briefly expressing appreciation for this conference having spiritual concerns in a world of materialism and depletion of natural resources. He emphasized the need for reliance on faith rather than on reason alone, in today's world. The Premier extended greetings and good wishes on behalf of all Manitobans.
- b. Councillor Anne Jorowski, who represented Mayor Juba, extended greetings and wishes of God's blessing from the City of Winnipeg. She presented an honorary citizenship award to moderator F. C. Peters. The moderator responded with gratitude saying that the award was presented on his birthday. Delegates and guests sang "Happy Birthday".
- c. Pastor Abe Quiring greeted delegates and guests on behalf of the Manitoba and Winnipeg Mennonite Brethren Churches and extended a hearty welcome to them.

3. Devotions

The moderator called on Rudy Bartel, pastor of Fairview Mennonite Brethren Church, St. Catharines, Ontario to lead in the devotions. He read Isaiah 6:1-13. Isaiah perceived the call of God to a special ministry. Similarly we are burdened to sense the call of God. How can we be sure to discover God's call?

- a. Isaiah experienced personally the unmistakable presence of God.
- b. Isaiah experienced divine cleansing.

These, for Isaiah as for us, are prerequisites for the tasks facing us, difficult though they may be. He then led in prayer. John Martens then served with the song "Into Thy Hands O Lord I Commend My Spirit".

#### 4. Convention Procedures

The moderator announced procedures to be followed re: resolutions and important motions. The secretary made announcements regarding delegate lists which have not been submitted. He then proceeded to read the rules of order. The moderator pointed out that sister delegates, too, are welcome to speak at this convention.

#### 6. Acceptance of New Churches into the Conference

The secretary read the application for membership into the Canadian Conference of the following churches:

- a. Evergreen Heights Christian Fellowship Mennonite Brethren Church, Simcoe, Ontario
- b. Neighbourhood Bible Fellowship, Clearbrook, B. C.

c. Sardis Community Church, Sardis, B. C.

Upon motion these churches were accepted. Because of the absence of representatives from these churches the conference moderator asked moderators of the respective provincial conferences to bring greetings to the newly accepted churches.

## 7. Agenda

The moderator announced several changes in the agenda.

## 8. Conference Executive

a. Report - the secretary read the report as follows:

Since our last conference the Executive Committee has met alone on two occasions and once with the Council of Boards. Between conferences, many questions arise which need clarification and sometimes immediate action and the committee must always be ready to listen, to direct and to act.

It was decided at the last Canadian Conference that the practice of alternating study and business conventions would be discontinued. The decision was to combine study and business at the next convention.

The Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns is charged with the responsibility of planning and conducting the study sessions. This year two papers will be read and discussed. Resolutions based on these sessions will be presented to the delegation.

The first paper to be read on Saturday morning, July 3, has been prepared by John Regehr of our Bible College in Winnipeg. The concern of this study is the ministry in our Mennonite Brethren Conference.

John Regehr will discuss the call to the ministry, touching on the problem of recruitment. Whose responsibility is it to encourage brethren to consider the preaching and pastoral ministry?

The paper will also address itself to various types of pastoral ministries with a definite investigation of the "lay ministry" as we once knew it.

The Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns has selected group leaders who will guide the delegates in discussing the papers in smaller groups. A plenary session will allow the groups to report.

A second paper on Saturday afternoon, prepared by John Redekop of Waterloo, will investigate the research presented in Kauffman and Harder's book: "Anabaptists Four Centuries Later". This research gives a profile of five Mennonite and Brethren in Christ denominations.

John Redekop will look at the "MB data", outline our profile and suggest some things which ought to receive greater emphasis in our teaching. The intent of this paper is to

improve our teaching in the churches by revealing the areas where we appear to be weak.

We plan to prepare several resolutions for consideration at the Canadian Conference in Winnipeg, Manitoba, on July 3-6, including recommendations on the following: (1) endowment fund for the Seminary; (2) appointment of executive secretary; (3) long range planning committee.

There are exciting days ahead at the conference. If each one of us comes properly prepared, with a prayerful attitude and expecting the Lord to meet us, we can anticipate wonderful fellowship, spiritual challenge and gratitude to God for the way he has and will lead our conference.

"Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things shall be yours as well."

The report was accepted.

#### b. Recommendations

The secretary read the prepared recommendations and the reasons leading to the recommendations as follows:

##### i. Possible Relocation of General Conference Seminary

The Recommendations of the Commission on Post Graduate Education recommended as Phase III that,

"The General Conference Seminary Board study the question of the location of the Seminary.

"The recommendation of the General Conference Seminary Board on relocation be referred to the Area Conferences.

"If a decision to relocate were made, a fund drive would be initiated."

(Canadian Conference Yearbook 1973, pp. 35-36).

The Commission further recommended to the Canadian Conference that it do "a feasibility study concerning relocation of the Fresno Seminary to Vancouver." (1973, p. 36)

The latter recommendation was tabled by the 1973 Conference.

#### The Executive recommends:

motion 1. That the recommendation be taken off the table.

motion 2. That a commission be appointed by the executive of the conference to make such a feasibility study and to report the findings to the Canadian Conference in 1977.

motion 3. "That the two recommendations be separated."

CARRIED

motion 4. "That recommendation #1 be accepted."

CARRIED

motion 5. "That recommendation #2 be accepted."

CARRIED but with some opposing votes.

ii. Inter-Conference Consultation

It was brought to the attention of the Council of Boards (January 31, 1976) that a discussion between the moderators of the U.S. and Canadian Area Conferences might be helpful in avoiding possible misunderstandings among area boards and committees. The issue in question was whether one area board could solicit information, funds or support in the other area constituency without first seeking the consent of an appropriate body in the other area.

The Council of Boards passed the following resolution:

"That our moderator discuss the matter with the moderator of the U.S. area and bring the matter to the Canadian Conference for action."

Our moderator has discussed this matter with Bro. Edmund Janzen, moderator of the U.S. Area Conference, and it was agreed to present similar resolutions to our respective Area Conferences.

Be it resolved:

motion: "That boards and committees of one area shall consult with the appropriate board and committee of the other area before soliciting funds, information or support in the other area constituency.

"Where no such appropriate board or committee exists, the request shall be directed to the moderator of the area concerned.

"District and provincial conferences in the two areas shall follow the pattern set for the area conferences.

"It is understood that General Conference Boards in which both areas participate are not governed by this agreement."

CARRIED

iii. Appointment of an Executive Secretary for the Canadian Conference

The Canadian Conference in session July 1975, passed the following resolution:

"That the incoming executive re-examine the concept of an executive secretary as provided for in the constitution and present its findings and recommendations to the next conference in session." (1975, p. 67)

This question had been raised in 1969 by the moderator of the Canadian Conference.

"The executive had been charged with clarifying this question and had appointed a commission in this regard. The question was discussed with the Board of Reference and Counsel. The executive recommended the postponement of this appointment." (1969, p. 57)

The executive took into account the rationale which supported the recommendation to "re-examine the concept of an executive secretary." (1975, p. 67-68)

The following steps were undertaken in studying the position of an executive secretary in the Canadian Area Conference.

1. The executive prepared ten questions which could be directed to persons in similar positions in other Mennonite Conferences.
  - a. Why did your conference appoint an executive secretary and when?
  - b. What is or was your main function?
  - c. What is or was your relationship to the moderator?
  - d. What is or was your relationship to the Conference Boards?
  - e. Do or did you exercise any budgetary supervision?
  - f. Do you or did you have any area of supervision in the spiritual realm? (Such as pastor-congregation differences, etc.)
  - g. What were some of the major difficulties you experienced?
  - h. What were some of the criticisms of your office?
  - i. Was your office filled after resignation and if not then why not?
  - j. Term of office, salary and other benefits?
2. A number of brethren who were or had been in such a position were interviewed.

Paul Krehbiel, Mennonite Conference,  
Henry J. Gerbrandt, Canadian Conference of Mennonites,  
H. H. Dick, U.S. Area Mennonite Brethren Conference, and  
William Neufeld, Pacific District Mennonite Brethren Conference.

3. Where possible, the executive gathered job descriptions and guidelines for executive staff.

4. The executive gathered comments from conference leaders and from the Council of Boards of the Canadian Conference.

5. On the basis of the above the executive met and formulated a recommendation.

The executive recommends:

motion: "That the Canadian Conference not appoint an executive secretary at this time."

CARRIED

Reasons for supporting the recommendation:

1. After discussion with the Council of Boards and various Canadian Conference leaders we concluded that there was little if any, support in the conference for such an appointment.

2. Since several of our conference boards now employ executive secretaries, the appointment of an executive secretary on the area level could possibly lead to duplication.

3. The Canadian Conference presently enjoys strong participation on the basis of dedicated voluntarism. An appointment of an executive secretary could leave an adverse effect on such participation.

CARRIED

#### iv. Conference Committee on Long-Range Planning

Regarding a Conference Committee on Long-Range Planning the executive recommends:

motion: "That a Conference Committee on Long-Range Planning be authorized consisting of the Conference Executive and the chairmen of Canadian Conference boards."

CARRIED

It is planned that such a committee will meet at the same time as the Council of Boards.

#### v. Future Study Conferences

Regarding future study conferences, the executive recommends:

motion: "That the Canadian Conference organize a study conference every second year to precede the regular business sessions. The alternating year would have special messages on pertinent topics but without the formal study procedures."

After considerable discussion this motion was defeated and another motion was made from the floor as follows:

motion: "That a study conference not be called by the executive in a year when other study conferences are held."

This motion was defeated.

No further recommendations were made but the executive was asked to heed the feeling of the brotherhood and to deal with pertinent topics each year as deemed advisable.

vi. Mennonite Brethren Biblical Seminary Endowment Fund

This resolution was prepared by the Board of Management.

I History

A. The General Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches in session at Winnipeg, Manitoba in August, 1975, accepted the following resolution presented by the Board of Trustees of the General Conference, covering funding of the Mennonite Brethren Biblical Seminary.

(In Part) (Page 28, 1975 Yearbook)

"Second Interim 1978-1981

Full support for the Seminary to become the responsibility of the General Conference.

1. A \$600,000 endowment fund for the Seminary shall be raised.

\$300,000 from Canada

\$300,000 from U.S.A.

Earnings to go to the Seminary Subsidy."

B. In anticipation of the above recommendation, the Board of Management provided for information to the Canadian Conference in session in July 1975 in Regina, Saskatchewan, the following proposal #4 (Page 97, Canadian Conference 1975 Yearbook)

"That an endowment fund be established to assist in funding the Seminary operations.

We propose initial establishment of the endowment at the commencement of the second triennium at an amount of \$600,000 to be contributed equally by the Canadian and U.S. Areas at time of establishment. It is proposed that this initial fund be treated as a perpetual trust permitting the use of income only. Subsequent contributions to this endowment fund should be welcomed and solicited and should be used in accordance with the terms of trust upon which they are made. In the event of establishment of such an endowment, we would recommend that the Canadian Conference make its contribution from its available capital funds."

motion: "That the funding of the Seminary Endowment Fund be taken from capital funds in the



Canadian Conference to a maximum of \$300,000 on a dollar for dollar basis with the U.S. Area Conference."

CARRIED

9. Council of Boards

a) Report - The secretary read the prepared report as follows:

The Council of Boards, which comprises the Conference Executive and the six Conference boards, met once during the interim to discuss the various concerns which needed our attention. Most of the boards will meet just prior to the Winnipeg Conference in order to complete their work and present their full reports to the delegates.

Some of the items which received attention were these:

(1) One area conference coming into another area to solicit information and funds. It was recommended that the moderator study this and then bring the matter to the Conference for information and action.

(2) The Board of Evangelism presented recommendations which were accepted as follows: (a) that the Ste. Rose United Church property in Quebec be purchased and the project be presented to our churches; (b) that the churches be solicited for a donation of up to \$6,000 to assist in the financing of the witness which is being planned by our young people for the Olympics in Montreal; (c) that the Dartmouth church building programme be approved; (d) that our own ministers and musicians be used to a greater extent when planning evangelistic and deeper life services.

(3) The Study Commission on Mass Media recommended that we seriously explore the possibility of linking up with our U.S. brethren to prepare TV programs, using the gifts of Paul Lehman. The Board of Evangelism was asked to bring this question to the Canadian Conference this summer.

(4) The Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns recommended and it was accepted that F. C. Peters up-date our Conference resolutions in matters of faith, doctrine and practice.

(5) The Board of Christian Education recommended that the Youth Worker become a joint production of the U.S. and Canadian Conferences. This recommendation will be brought to the Canadian Conference this summer.

(6) The Board of Management reported that no action had previously been taken to approve the Bethesda building project costing \$300,000 (most of this being covered by a Government grant). This was officially approved.

(7) The Board of Higher Education reported the need for the purchase of an additional house to accommodate the larger student body and that this purchase should be made before July. The Board recommended, and the Council of Boards approved that the house be purchased "Subject to conference approval next July."

From this report you will see that much unfinished work needs to be completed at our July Conference. We trust it will whet your appetite and will make you plan to be present.

Please pray for the success of the Conference.

The report was accepted.

#### 10. Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns

a) Report - The chairman, Loyal Funk, read the prepared report as follows:

##### Testing where Mennonite Brethren Stand

Since this year's conference will combine the faith and life emphasis with a business emphasis our board has planned that two important papers be presented and discussed.

Dr. John Regehr is preparing a paper entitled "The Call to the Ministry", which will attempt to show us the biblical approach to finding and calling a minister for the local church. It will seek to come to grips with the problems that have led to a shortage of ministers in our local churches.

The other paper, entitled "An Analysis of Anabaptists Four Centuries Later" will be presented by Dr. John Redekop. This will be a critical study of the research done in the book "Anabaptists Four Centuries Later" by Kauffman and Harder. It will also be an evaluation of our Mennonite Brethren Conference showing our strengths and weaknesses and the implications.

The plan for this part of the conference is that we listen to the papers, then divide into about 15 study groups. In each group a secretary will be appointed who will present main items of the discussion to a findings committee which in turn will summarize the results. Then our board will digest the findings and come to the conference with recommendations.

We are concerned that the Holy Spirit will help us to understand God's Word, to discern our times and our needs and lead us to a consensus of opinion that will strengthen our churches and guide us through the many problems of our days.

##### Pastor Ministry in our Churches

Our board spent a good deal of time discussing the problems related to this important aspect of our work for the Lord. The continuing shortage of pastors for our churches led us to ask our pulpit committee to make a study of the reasons for this shortage. The pulpit committee also continued its effort to help churches find pastors and pastors to find churches. We also hope to be able to recommend a good preaching manual to our pastors.

### Other Conference Needs

During the year, Wally Unger's paper "The Occult" was published in the MB Herald. Another paper entitled "The Christian and Litigation" written by Dr. John Regehr, is to appear soon. We have also asked Dr. David Ewert to write an article on Bible Translations which will help us to decide on a translation to be used in our churches, and would aid us in effective public Bible reading and memorization. We also hope to publish a paper on "Homosexuality" by Henry R. Baerg.

### Updating of Conference Resolutions

Dr. F. C. Peters has accepted the assignment to compile a book that will summarize and update our conference resolutions over the years.

### Evangelical Fellowship of Canada

According to last year's decision we have retained our membership in this organization and brother F. C. Peters has been attending their meetings this past year.

### Capital Punishment

The Herald has published a number of letters on this issue since our last Council of Boards meetings in January. At that session we decided to ask the General Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches to study the issue and to publish a statement.

The report was accepted.

The chairman, Loyal Funk then introduced the book of updated conference resolutions as completed by F. C. Peters who then commented briefly on some corrections and additions still to be made.

### b) Recommendations

#### i. Notice of Motion Regarding Acceptance of New Churches into our Conference

According to the constitution of the General Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches, a church that is accepted as a member in a provincial conference at the same time becomes a member in the Canadian Conference as well as in the General Conference. For this reason our practice of formally receiving churches into the Canadian Conference is not in harmony with our General Conference Constitution. We therefore recommend,

motion: "That we amend our Canadian Constitution in order to bring our procedure in harmony with our General Conference Constitution."

CARRIED

ii. Response to the Paper "Call to Ministry"

- A. We reaffirm that God has given gifts to local churches.
- B. We recognize that the Holy Spirit works through the praying congregation in calling people to specific need-relating ministries.
- C. We encourage congregations to affirm the gifts of God's people and endorse the use of their gifts by means of church program involvement, apprenticeships, such as summer ministries and educational training.

iii. Response to the Paper "Call to Ministry" but with particular reference to the topic "Team Leadership".

- A. Leadership in local congregations be shared rather than the responsibility of one man.
- B. The (s)election of the leadership group in the local congregation be made on the basis of their gifts and their willingness to exercise them.
- C. We encourage the leadership group to prayerfully come to a brotherly consensus as they give direction to the congregation.
- D. We encourage the leadership group to function as a team and thereby be an example of mutual ministry to the congregation. "They must find their own personal needs met by the gifts of the others. They must put their hearts together, not only their heads. ...Only then can they help the church be, not only to run."

After considerable discussion and upon the request of the moderator, this statement was referred back to the board for further study and re-submission to the convention at a later session.

iv. Regarding the Paper "The Mennonite Brethren Church Today"

Loyal Funk, chairman of the board, expressed gratitude for John Redekop's paper and pointed out that no resolutions have been prepared at this point.

11. Mennonite Central Committee

J. M. Klassen, newly appointed Executive Secretary of MCC (Canada) read the following report.

The four of us who are privileged to represent the Mennonite Brethren Conference on MCC (Canada) are happy to have this opportunity to report to you. In addition to the four of us two additional Mennonite Brethren are on the MCC (Canada), Peter H. Peters, as chairman of MCC (Manitoba) and Leonard Siemens as a member-at-large.

All except two of the 28 members were present for the MCC (Canada) annual meeting January 16-17, 1976 in Richmond, B. C. Both Leonard Siemens and J. M. Klassen were re-elected to serve on the Executive Committee of MCC (Canada) which meets four or five times a year to carry on the work between annual meetings.

Of the \$2,378,000 in cash constituency contributions received by provincial MCC treasurers in 1975, \$426,092 was given by Mennonite Brethren contributors. This amounts to about \$23.67 per member. The average giving for all Mennonite and Brethren in Christ members in Canada for the same period averages out to about \$23.13 per member.

In terms of personnel, the number of Mennonite Brethren in the total MCC program in 1975 was 93 out of a total work force of 700. Although the total number of personnel in MCC has declined from 772 in 1971 to 700 in 1975, the Mennonite Brethren component has increased from 74 to 93.

We praise God for the way in which the constituency has been able to give in both money and personnel in 1975. Contributions were up from 1974, as were applications from personnel.

#### Contributions

1. Constituency. Total cash contributions from the Canadian constituency in the year ending November 30, 1975 were over \$2 million, including some \$328,748 from six relief sales and \$227,730 from 21 thrift shops in five provinces.

2. Government Grants. Recognizing the effective distribution channels of the non-government agencies in foreign countries, the Canadian International Development Agency has made more money available to such agencies for projects that are compatible with its humanitarian goals. MCC (Canada) received \$418,300 from CIDA in 1975. A new development has been the participation of three provincial governments in the overseas programs of private agencies.

#### MCC (Canada) 1975 Program

1. Voluntary Service. In 1975, MCC (Canada) VS became involved in 13 new projects, while several involvements were ended. Eighty-two volunteers served in Canadian projects at year's end -- an increase of 20 over 1974.

2. Peace and Social Concerns. MCC (Canada) sponsored the publication of Making a Killing: Canada's Arms Industry by Ernie Regehr, which outlines how the Canadian government speaks of non-violent solutions to problems but sells guns for profit.

3. Native Concerns. Menno Wiebe as director of this portfolio has been actively involved in the land rights question among native people. As a member of the Interchurch Task Force on Northern Flooding in Manitoba, he assisted in setting up a public enquiry into the Manitoba Hydro Development project on the Churchill-Nelson River system.

4. Ottawa Office. William Janzen became director of the newly-created Ottawa office during 1975. He serves as liaison between government and individuals and church groups of the constituency.

5. Self-Help, Material Aid, Thrift Shops and Relief Sales Several thousand women and a few dozen men are involved in their home communities as volunteers working with the Self-Help Crafts program, which markets crafts made by low-income people around the world, material aid centers and thrift shops. In addition, thousands of people in Mennonite communities in five provinces raise money for the MCC general fund by helping out at relief sales.

6. Baptist-Mennonite Relations. MCC (Canada) representatives met with leaders of the Baptist Federation of Canada last September to discuss the role of Anabaptists and Baptists in society. It was agreed that the two groups would set up a believers' church conference for 1977.

7. Staff. The Winnipeg staff has doubled in the past year to 14 persons to accommodate an expanding program and increasingly heavy workloads in two major departments. The position of administrative assistant was temporarily created in the overseas department to handle the project submissions to governments and to do research on overseas development. An assistant director was also appointed in the VS and personnel services department, and a full-time information services director replaced the part-time services of Larry Kehler.

#### 1976 Projections for MCC (Canada)

1. Budget. A budget of over \$3.5 million was approved by MCC (Canada) at the annual meeting in January. Financial contributions from the Canadian constituency were slightly ahead of last year for the first third of 1976.

2. Food Bank. MCC (Canada) has initiated a food bank project which will utilize the resources of the wheat farmers in our constituency. To explain it simply, the food bank models itself on the Joseph of Egypt, who stored grain in the plentiful years so that in famine there was food for everyone. Details of the chain of organization beginning with the farmers' donations of wheat and ending in a food-deficient area as an aid to development programs are being worked out by a food bank board appointed by MCC (Canada) at the January 1976 annual meeting.

3. Offender Ministries. MCC (Canada) and the U.S. ministries section of MCC have appointed a consultant for offender ministries for a two-year period in the person of Edgar Epp, formerly deputy minister of corrections for B. C.

4. Overseas Service. MCC (Canada) continues to forward contributions designated for overseas projects to headquarters at Akron, Pa. Canada's participation in planning has increased because of the involvement of CIDA and provincial governments in funding some projects.

5. Alcohol Study Project. In January MCC (Canada) approved a survey project which is to determine the constituent members' attitudes toward alcohol. Its purpose is to find out where Mennonites stand on the issue and evolve a witness on that basis.

6. Russian Delegation. An MCC-sponsored visit by three Baptists and one Mennonite from the Soviet Union in May is to be returned by a North American delegation in fall.

7. Personnel. A crisis could be developing in personnel. Applications are down considerably from last year in both the U.S. and Canada. In December, January and February, the peak recruitment period, applications are down 20 in Canada from last year. When we look at the need in the world for people to offer their skills and personnel resources, we are reminded of Jesus' comment recorded in Matthew 9:37 and 38: "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." (NIV)

#### MCC International Program

1. Statistics. A total of 700 persons and \$10,442,000 in cash and material aid were given by the constituency to meet human needs through MCC in 1975. MCC was involved in 58 countries with personnel in 38.

2. Vietnam. A large aid effort is planned for Vietnam in 1976 as a result of recommendations made by a delegation of Mennonites who visited Vietnam in November. The effort is to demonstrate to the people and government that Christian love responds to human need wherever it exists.

3. Guatemala. An above-budget response of \$250,000 was given to a house-building program in Guatemala, where an earthquake in February left over one million people homeless.

#### Conclusion

As a people who wish to respond in the "Jesus way", Mennonites and Brethren in Christ continue to be challenged by the events of our times. Together with other components of the church, MCC has the opportunity to show compassion and love, to be a tool in the hand of the Master.

"As opportunity offers, let us work for the good of all, especially members of the household of faith."

Since J. M. Klassen has been appointed Executive Secretary of MCC (Canada) as of September 1, 1976, the conference should elect another member to the MCC (Canada) board.

#### 12. Closing

After some announcements, the session closed with prayer by George Konrad, acting president of the Mennonite Brethren Biblical Seminary.

- a. Paul Wiebe led the delegation in the singing of two songs "Spirit of God, Descend Upon My Heart" and "Like a River Glorious".
- b. Devotional
  - i. Rennie & Jenny Regehr gave a piano and violin musical number.
  - ii. Eugene Gerbrandt, assistant moderator introduced Agatha Bock, teacher and missionary in Brazil, and HCJB radio, Quito, Ecuador and Kathryn Klassen, widow of H. F. Klassen and deaconess in the Elmwood Mennonite Brethren Church. They gave inspiring testimonies of how God led them. They were thanked for the "uplifting testimonies."
  - iii. Paul and Katie Wiebe sang a duet "Be Glad and Be Joyful".
- c. The moderator, F. C. Peters welcomed the following fraternal delegates:
  - i. Gerald Gerbrandt of the General Conference of Mennonites. He extended best wishes to our delegates and conference.
  - ii. F. D. Reimer of the Evangelical Mission Church greeted the delegates by stating that they were twin-brothers with the Mennonite Brethren. He extended greetings and best wishes.
  - iii. Hans Wiens of Brazil expressed gratitude for the love and help of the brethren in North America. He spoke words of greeting on behalf of the moderator of their conference in Brazil. He greeted the delegates with two verses from Heb. 13:8 and vs. 6.
- d. The assistant secretary, David Duerksen then read the minutes of the proceedings of the morning session of July 5. The motion to accept the minutes carried with a few corrections.

14. Mennonite Brethren Biblical Seminary

The moderator then called on George Konrad, acting president of the Mennonite Brethren Biblical Seminary to give a brief report. He read I Peter 1:21 and expressed gratitude for the following.

- a. a dedicated and competent staff.
- b. the appointment of David Ewert to the faculty.



- c. A dedicated and committed student body. He reported that a large majority of the students are presently working in the churches in the area.
- d. For a large committed class of graduates. A recent study showed that:
  - 17% of pastors in Canada are seminary graduates and,
  - 23% of pastors in U.S. are seminary graduates.
- e. He was grateful for prospects for the coming year. Enrollment prospects are strong. He expressed appreciation for the Canadian members of the board -- H. J. Block, H. Dueck, J. Redekop, H. Voth, and L. Siemens.
- f. The presidential leadership question was a key issue for the board last year. George Konrad has accepted the position for one year. The seminary faculty and board want to address themselves to the concerns of the churches. He reported that the congregations frequently ask the seminary for suggestions of people for the pastorate. In return they want to ask the congregations when they last sent someone to the seminary.

The moderator thanked George Konrad for the report and gave the delegates an opportunity to direct questions regarding the seminary. H. H. Dick, retiring president, was asked to direct a few comments to the delegates. He urged the delegates to give prayer and moral support for George Konrad. The moderator asked H. H. Dick to convey greetings on behalf of the Canadian delegates to the brethren at Fresno.

#### 11. Mennonite Central Committee (cont'd)

J. M. Klassen was called forward to answer questions re the work of MCC (Canada).

Question: Are the exchange visits with the Russian Baptists and some Mennonites a good thing or does it complicate relations with some of the brethren in the Soviet Union?

J. M. Klassen reported that the purposes of the visits are to promote dialogue between Christians but that this practice is under constant review. One individual expressed objection to MCC sponsoring the publication of Making a Killing. C. J. Rempel asked the delegates to offer prayerful support for J. M. Klassen as the new executive secretary of MCC (Canada).

#### 15. Financial Statement and Budget

- a. D. E. Warkentin, chairman of the Board of Management called on the Conference treasurer, J. J. Riediger to highlight the financial report as follows. Please see pages 22-59.

The report was accepted.

- b. J. J. Riediger presented the corrected proposed budget. He drew attention to the fact that the budget would cost \$38.00 per member from a Canadian membership of 19,300.

#### 16. Pause

- a. The moderator asked Paul Wiebe to lead the delegates in the singing of "Come Christians Join to Sing".

## 17. Board of Higher Education

H. H. Dueck, chairman of the board, drew attention to the following reports:

### a. Report of the Board

#### Master Planning Commission Set Up

Greetings with Psalm 100:4 - "Be thankful unto him, and bless his name."

This is our response to the wonderful leading of the Lord in developments of the college and the other activities of the board during 1975-76.

The board is gratified to know that the plans made a year ago, in order to develop a closer relationship with the local churches and constituency, have brought a favourable response. In many instances we have been encouraged by the support in prayer, in student enrolment and finances, which have been received from all provinces of the constituency.

#### MB Bible College and College of Arts

The board is grateful that the college has had another very successful year under the leadership of Henry G. Krahn. When the record enrolment became evident last August the college administration, together with some board members and friends, made some very hasty contingency arrangements in order to renovate and prepare all possible residence spaces for the students.

As we now project another 20% increase in full-time enrolment for next year, it has become clear that additional residence accommodation must be acquired. This was presented to the Council of Boards meeting in January, which gave tentative approval to purchase a building subject to ratification by the conference in July. Current plans are to purchase a 12 suite apartment near the campus for approximately \$156,000 for our married students, with the mortgage to be repaid on a self-liquidating basis.

In order to meet some of the rising costs the board rates have been increased to \$625 per year and the room rates to \$225 per year.

The annual Institute for Ministers and Laymen held at the college had 35 registrations. In addition to the college faculty members, the ministry of J. B. Toews and Elmer Martens from the seminary was very much appreciated. It is planned that the format of an annual institute on the college campus will be continued.

Plans are also underway to make such courses available on an extension program basis together with seminary faculty members in the provinces. The next one planned will be held



in Ontario in November.

In order to make the institute available to more members from all the provinces, and also in order to reduce the cost to the conference, the board has authorized the college to plan the next institute on the basis that the travel of a designated number of registrants from each province will have 50% of their travel costs paid, with the appeal that the local church would provide the remainder.

The board has established a Master Planning Commission consisting of board members, faculty members, and members-at-large, under the leadership of Dr. Henry Krahn. The function of the Master Planning Commission is to assist in the development of plans leading to a balanced growth of the College. This requires a positive, dynamic closeness between the college and constituency. It also requires a bold, goal-directed vision for the future. As long range plans are formulated they will be presented to the board and then shared with the conference.

The board also gave a notice of motion in January of its intention to request an expansion of the MBBC Educational Endowment Fund, which currently stands at \$57,000. Our goal would be to increase it to \$300,000, which would assist us in generating some funds in order to help reduce the heavy annual grant from the conference budget. Some discussions are presently underway with the Board of Management to utilize some of the funds from the current capital fund, as well as to collect additional funds for the future. It is anticipated that the 1976-77 budget expenditures will be \$482,000, of which \$253,000 will be required from the conference.

We want to take this opportunity to express our deep appreciation to the churches and individuals in the fund raising banquets who have assisted us in realizing our goal of collecting \$60,000 in donations for the 1975-76 budget.

We are very grateful for the excellent faculty members and staff who carry out their work with great dedication to the brotherhood. In September, 1976 we welcome Dr. John A. Toews back as a member of the faculty. He had spent 20 years with the college before. Dr. John Regehr will be away from the campus next year on sabbatical.

The board has also undertaken a detailed study of its by-laws and revised them with the view to simplifying the work and responsibilities in relation to the college. It has been decided to discontinue the College Committee and replace it by three smaller committees of the board, as follows: Academic Affairs Committee, Finance and Property Committee, and Personnel Committee.

#### Historical Committee

1. The general principle of three archival centers for the Mennonite Brethren Church in North America is now in operation. Some members of the constituency are still confused as to which materials go where, but hopefully with persistence this can be rectified.

2. The agreement for cooperation with the archival centers of the General Conference at CMBC and at Conrad Grebel College has been signed, and some interchanges of information are occurring.

3. Translation of P. M. Friesen's book is proceeding and is now in its second stage, in which an editorial committee is reviewing the first draft translations.

4. Proposals for the formation of a Mennonite Brethren Historical Society of Canada were formulated in response to the "Unofficial Resolution" listed on p. 64 of the 1975 Canadian Conference Yearbook - passed in Regina. As well as the proposals for a Centre for Mennonite Brethren Studies in Canada were also developed.

We are, by these proposals, starting to utilize the resources which are becoming available. Hopefully this can implement the ultimate goals of the Historical Committee - to help the church make its decisions today by assessing the past and thereby charting the course for the future.

#### Inter-School Relations Committee

Some specific steps were taken this year to establish closer communication between the various institutions of the brotherhood. On October 16 and 17 the committee sponsored an Inter-School Consultation, which was attended by the principals of the three Christian high schools, the deans and presidents of our three Bible institutes, the dean and president of the college, and several members of the board.

A major paper was presented by Dr. John Redekop entitled, "Mennonite Brethren Schools in Canada: An Analysis of Institutional Objectives". The paper dealt with the stated objectives of our various institutions and attempted to evaluate these both in terms of the particular school as well as the larger brotherhood.

The consensus of the participants was that this type of consultation was very worthwhile, and that another consultation should be planned for October, 1976. The major thrust of the next consultation would be devoted to defining the theological and philosophical foundations of education in Mennonite Brethren institutions, as well as identifying the practical implications of these for curriculum and campus life. It has also been decided that the consultation will be expanded to include the Seminary.

Arising out of our consultation last October, was a suggestion that the board produce a publicity folder for prospective students in which all the institutions be allowed space to present their programs for a common approach to constituency relations. This is presently being pursued, and should be

ready for distribution early in the next year.

### Student Services Committee

This work was carried out under the direction of Dr. James Pankratz from the college faculty. He has travelled into each of the provinces to meet with groups of students and establish contacts with those people responsible for student service activities in local centres.

He reports that contacts with students have convinced him that the most effective relationships in the ministry to post-secondary students are established by people on a given campus or in the local church. The task of student services is as much with the churches as with the students from the churches.

We must, as a brotherhood, learn how to use the experiences and insights of our students. They also want to share their enthusiasm and discovery, not only the trials of their faith. Our willingness to incorporate their experiences into our church life must be demonstrated by our trust and interest in them.

A meeting of student service workers and committee members from each of the provinces is being planned during the Canadian Conference sessions in Winnipeg.

### Summary

We are very encouraged by the new sources of support and interest in the program of higher education in the constituency. We also feel that we are achieving a closer identification of the individual roles of the institutions, as well as a willingness to cooperate in those areas where the institutions have much in common. As these programs increase in scope and complexity we also become aware of our need to plan for balanced and consolidated growth.

Your continued moral, financial, and prayer support is the source of our encouragement to move ahead.

### Recommendations

The following will be presented to the convention:

1. That the conference ratify the purchase of a student residence.
2. That a Centre for Mennonite Brethren Studies in Canada be established at the college.
3. That a Mennonite Brethren Historical Society of Canada be established.
4. That the conference approve the expansion of the Educational Endowment Fund at the college to \$300,000.

### Grateful For Strengthened Level Of Support

## Personal Reflections

It is a privilege to be involved in a program of higher education that seeks to recognize the Lordship of Christ in every aspect of its diverse program. Although it is evident that there is still a wide lag between our educational objectives and where we are, it is a thrill to work with board members, faculty and students who deliberately seek to follow Christ.

The renewal of interest in the college and the growing awareness that it has a vital role to fulfill in the life of the Mennonite Brethren Conference in Canada, is a real encouragement to the faculty.

The increased enrolment has contributed significantly to the overall optimistic spirit on the campus. The letters of encouragement from friends of the college and the sacrificial giving of many assures us of continued support from the constituency. The promotional efforts of Board members have been remarkable. If present giving trends continue, the financial objectives, hesitatingly set last year, may actually be achieved.

In all of this I sense the presence of the Spirit of God and it causes me to join the Psalmist when he says, "The Lord has done great things for us whereof we are glad." I believe God has even greater things in store for us if we will follow the advice expressed in 2 Chron. 7:14, "If my people who are called by my name humble themselves, and pray and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land."

## The MBBC Model is Sound

It is my impression that the overall program as it has developed during the past few years at MBBC is sound and uniquely suited to the needs of the youth of the Mennonite Brethren Conference.

We are presently committed to a program that leads to a Bachelor of Religious Studies degree and a B. A. degree in conjunction with the University of Winnipeg. Students enrolled in our programs may take majors in Theology, Contemporary Ministries, Music and the Liberal Arts. It is therefore my impression that the overall program is sound and is in keeping with the broad outlines established by the Board of Higher Education in January 1973.

It is not my intention in this report to provide an analysis of the present MBBC model. Let me simply suggest several reasons why I think it is unique and relevant.

1. It is based on a philosophy of education geared to the needs of our youth and to the needs of the church.

2. It allows MBBC to define its distinct role within the context of other MB post-secondary schools in Canada and the U.S.

3. It relates the curriculum to both the program of Christian education in our MB churches and to the program of higher education adopted at the university.

4. It is a model which allows the church to finance an integrated program of higher education without using vast financial resources which would deprive other church-related agencies of financial support.

5. It relates the basic objectives of the college directly to the mission of the church.

#### The Program Needs to be Developed

Though the model as such is sound, it needs to be developed. Herein lies the great opportunity and challenge for the immediate future.

During the past few years the energy of the board was spent in what could be called a survival program. The conference is greatly indebted to those who faithfully stood by the college during those years of trial. The renewed interest in the college by MB youth and the supporting brotherhood indicates that we are well on our way to a healthy recovery.

The years of trial however have left the institution in an underdeveloped state. It will take the prayers, dedication and sacrifices of many to bring MBBC to a state in its development which is becoming of an institution that is vitally related to the program of the entire Canadian Conference. To develop the program, then, constitutes the real challenge of the future.

#### Faculty

To develop the program of the college we need a faculty that is adequately qualified, is deeply committed, and is endowed with the gift of teaching. The rapidly changing world in which we live demands that the faculty use their minds to grapple with current intellectual thought in order to assist our youth in dealing with the welter of ideologies competing for their allegiance.

The faculty, moreover, must make a concerted effort to influence students in the direction of God's purpose in matters of lifestyle and faith and show great sensitivity and concern for the student's total well-being. The faculty of a church-related college must provide quality education to those preparing for church-related ministries and encourage students to become involved on many levels in the work of our MB Conference.

I consider it a real privilege to work with a youthful faculty which is deeply committed to the Lord and the conference. The faculty collectively provide a vigorous spiritual and intellectual challenge to each other and to the students. Faculty, moreover, are encouraged to share a vital concern for the welfare of all community members and to enter into their lives as counselors, friends and mentors.

The faculty turnover has been low during the past few years, which has contributed significantly towards continuity and stability. The faculty-student ratio was 1/18 (excludes administration) during the past year and may be considered near the optimum level, since the faculty work load is very heavy. It is envisaged that the ministry of the faculty will be extended more effectively into the constituency as we develop the extension education program.

### Students

Students to a large extent determine the character of a college. MBBC attracts students with different aptitudes, interests, and concerns. In the main, however, MBBC students are serious-minded young people who are searching for meaning in life and purposeful involvement.

The entire program of the college is designed to encourage students to understand that a college education is not to be viewed as a passport to a position of ease, wealth or power. It is to be seen as a call to discipleship. Students are encouraged to accept Christ's claim that it is costly to be a disciple. To be a true disciple means identifying with the sufferings of Christ; in practical terms it means identification with the ministry of reconciliation in a broken world.

We are pleased that a large number of students are responding to Christ's call to discipleship. Some 28 of our students will be involved in church-related ministries during the summer of 1976. We are confident that many more will be witnessing in their place of employment.

It is our objective to help MBBC become the melting pot for the youth of our Mennonite Brethren Conference. It is a well-known fact that there are many regional differences represented in the Canadian MB constituency. From the Christian point of view, these differences should be utilized to enrich our brotherhood rather than to allow them to divide us. What better place is there to develop an understanding and appreciation for these provincial differences than at a conference college?

It is gratifying to see the bonds of friendship and fellowship develop within the context of our college community. It is my firm belief that in this way the college is in a unique position to contribute towards conference unity.

### Curriculum

The distinctives of an institution are reflected in its curriculum. MBBC is attempting to develop a curriculum which is based on the objectives of the institution and the diverse interests and needs of Mennonite Brethren students. It is our understanding that the task of higher education is more than the transmission of the heritage of the past; it must include searching for truth and preparing youth for the future.

It is our objective to offer a variety of courses that introduce students to biblical and historical Christianity and which will give them a firm grasp of Scripture. Students

are also encouraged to take courses in the social sciences and humanities in order to understand better the world in which they live. It is our conviction that in order to develop their intellectual gifts students must read, write, discuss and dispute; students need the stimulus of fresh ideas and the discipline of controversy.

The present curriculum is divided into four departments - Theology, Contemporary Ministries, Music, and Humanities and Social Sciences. Courses in all four departments contribute toward one or both of the degree programs offered at the college - Bachelor of Religious Studies (B.R.S.) and Bachelor of Arts (B.A.)

The Contemporary Ministries major was only introduced last year and already a number of students are fulfilling their field work requirement in a supervised Christian service assignment this summer. Students in all programs must take courses in theology, biblical studies and practical ministries. They are then urged to relate their Christian faith to a broad spectrum of disciplines in order that their whole education may be permeated with a Christian world-view.

As we move ahead we want to keep in mind the words of Paul expressed in I Cor. 3:10 "Let us be careful how we build." We recognize that the work of the college is not our own - it is the work of the church, the work of the Lord. We must therefore move forward courageously but responsibly. We must move forward together.

To assist us in moving forward responsibly the board has created a Master Planning Committee. The committee consists of several board members, three faculty members and representation from the conference at large. We look forward to working together with this committee. We do covet your prayers and continued support.

#### c. Mennonite Brethren Historical Society Report

##### Purpose

1. To interest the Canadian Mennonite Brethren constituency in its own heritage.

2. To interest the Canadian Mennonite Brethren constituency in the Archival Centre and the Centre for Mennonite Brethren Studies.

3. To itself become informed about the heritage of the Mennonite Brethren church, and more specifically about the various aspects of research currently being carried out.

##### Responsibilities

1. To inform the Mennonite Brethren constituency about its own heritage - conferences - lectures - banquets -



publications.

2. To support the Archival Centre and the Study Centre in their collection of materials and research projects.

3. To raise funds for the various aspects of Mennonite Brethren research.

- Archival Centre
- Centre for Mennonite Brethren Studies
- MBBC historical library
- Any additional projects.

4. To become informed about Mennonite Brethren heritage and research, and help interpret this to the Mennonite constituency, and the public at large.

#### Organization

1. Membership is open to anyone of the Mennonite Brethren constituency interested in his heritage and history.

2. Executive consists of 5 members, at least two of which should be from the Advisory Committee of the Centre for Mennonite Brethren studies.

3. Interest in the society should be fostered all across Canada. Initially provincial liaison can be established by appointing regional society representatives among the interested members - later the executive could be organized so as to include at least one representative from each area.

4. The Historical Committee is directly responsible for the Society to the Board of Higher Education and the conference. It reports to the board and conference on behalf of the society and interprets and implements board and conference decisions regarding the society.

5. Funds required from the conference shall be obtained through the Historical Committee. Private funds or membership dues can be used for society projects or to help fund other agencies as required (e.g. centre research).

#### Centre for Mennonite Brethren Studies in Canada

##### Purpose

1. To research and encourage others to research and critically evaluate Mennonite Brethren history.

2. To study and encourage others to study the faith, life and work of the Mennonite Brethren in the present context.

3. While emphasis will be on Mennonite Brethren, it is hoped that the scope of research will go beyond specific geographic and conference boundaries.

4. To make known to the constituency at large the results of this study and research, hopefully to help shape the course of Mennonite Brethren in the future.

#### Responsibilities

1. To be directly involved in Mennonite Brethren research and studies -- utilizing the Archives, the MBBC historical library or any other relevant source material.

2. To direct or supervise the research of others, e.g. specific assignments to students at MBBC.

3. To encourage research by other scholars or constituency members.

4. To encourage the development of, and help in, the improvement of the Archival Centre and the MBBC historical library.

5. To make known to the constituency at large, or to special groups of interested people, the results of research at the centre.

- use of material in lectures or seminars.
- publication of articles in conference papers or specialized journals.
- publication of pamphlets or books.

6. The general philosophy will be that of actually carrying out and supervising research, rather than emphasizing the public relations or the fund raising role.

#### Organization

1. The Historical Committee of the Board of Higher Education is directly responsible for the centre to the Board of Higher Education and the conference. It reports to the board and the conference on behalf of the centre and interprets and implements board or conference decisions regarding the centre.

2. The Advisory Committee shall consist of 5 members:

- Conference Archivist,
- "Resident Scholar",
- Representative from MBBC history department,
- Board Member (Higher Education), and
- Member-at-large.

3. Funds required from the conference shall be obtained through the Historical Committee. Private funds may be solicited directly for special projects. It is anticipated that the Historical Society will also be interested in providing additional funds if required.

4. The centre will hopefully act as a source of inspiration and information for the Historical Society. Two members of the Advisory Committee shall be on the executive of that organization.

5. The MBBC historical library is under the direction of the librarian of MBBC, and the archives under the direct supervision of the Historical Committee. It is hoped, however, that the centre will use these resources extensively and help in their development.

6. The Advisory Committee should feel free at any time to form sub-committees for special projects or purposes, utilizing experts or interested individuals from outside the organization as required.

7. Should other institutions in Canada feel that they may want to contribute substantially to the work of the centre, then the Board of Directors could be enlarged to include a representative from that institution.

#### Recommendations

1. That the conference ratify the purchase of a student residence.

2. That a Centre for Mennonite Brethren Studies in Canada be established at the college.

3. That a Mennonite Brethren Historical Society of Canada be established.

4. That the conference approve the expansion of the Educational Endowment Fund at the college to \$300,000.

#### d. Supplementary Report of the Board of Higher Education

During the board sessions at this convention, several additional items were dealt with which we would like to share with the brotherhood.

1. As reported earlier, we found it necessary to find more residence accommodation for the anticipated 150 full-time students at college next year. Together with the Board of Management, we have made a purchase of a 12 suite apartment building for \$156,000, subject to the approval of the conference. This building is only 5 years old and located very conveniently on Henderson Highway at the corner of Mighton Avenue, which will be used for our married students. One of our existing buildings, McIntosh Hall, is in very poor condition, more distant from campus and only has 2 apartments. In order to reduce the size of the second mortgage on the Mighton Apartments, we are asking permission to sell the McIntosh property, so that we will have a net gain of 10 apartments.

It is also the policy of the board, that the room and board component of our budget be self-sustaining and self-amortizing. To achieve this goal, we have taken action as follows:

- the cash flow for room and board will be separated more clearly from other expenditures in future, so that actual expenditures can be allocated more clearly.

- the residence rates on all existing accommodations have been raised by rates varying from \$5 to \$20 per month effective January 1, 1977.

It will not be possible to be totally self-sustaining immediately, but it is our goal to achieve this position in several years.

2. The board has dealt extensively with several personnel matters. Due to the resignation of Brother Vern Ratzlaff as Dean of Students, the board has appointed Brother James Pankratz to this position.

The board has also had extensive discussions concerning the continued employment of a faculty member who has encountered serious difficulties in his marriage, so that some action by the board has become necessary. After serious consideration of the matter by the college faculty, College Committee and board of the implications for our brother, for his service as a faculty member, for the college and for the constituency, the board has sought prayerfully to find the most helpful solution by considering a variety of options. We are indeed fortunate, that these can be carried out jointly with the pastor of the family's home church. The board has finally come to the decision that the most redemptive approach for the immediate future would be to continue his appointment for one year (1976-77), with the stipulation that he not function publically on behalf of the college, speak in chapel services, etc; that he actively seek the assistance of a marriage counsellor; that he seek the continued fellowship of the Christian community; and that he resolve to maintain as close a contact with the family in order to affect a reconciliation as quickly as possible.

The board wishes to underscore the gravity with which it views the breakdown of marriage. It also wants to convey to the brotherhood how we have struggled to find a way of helping the family redemptively in this dire hour of need. It is good to know that we could counsel with the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns in this matter. We ask for your prayerful support and confidence in us in implementing this difficult decision. Indeed, we would plead with you to give us your trust to proceed on the basis of confidential information shared with us.

3. The budget has given us continued concern. Upon reviewing the tentative 1976-77 budget estimates, it became possible to reduce the grant for the college by \$37,750. We are discussing our financial relationship with the University of Winnipeg, because at present our tuition fee structures must be the same. With the lack of availability of government grants, this creates an additional burden on the college budget. We want to express our deep appreciation to everyone again, so that it was possible to raise more than \$62,000 in church offerings, donations and special efforts independent of the conference grant. May the Lord reward each of you richly.

It is also evident that the college program is financially unique because its budget demands approximately 80% for salaries in order to carry it out.

4. The board also discussed the expansion of the Educational Endowment Fund of the college, which presently stands at \$68,000. We have decided after consultation with the Board of Management, to defer our recommendation for the expansion of the Endowment Fund for the college, but wish to study specific proposals to be presented to the brotherhood at a later date.

The following were then called to give brief reports:

i. H. H. Dick, chairman of the College Committee reported on the need for the purchase of the Mighton Apartments. He stressed the fact that it was a sound investment.

ii. Helmut Huebert reported on behalf of the Historical Committee. He stated that,

- a) The general principle of archival work is well established. Cooperation between the various Mennonite Brethren centers as well as CMBC and Conrad Grebel College has been realized.
- b) He said that we need to assess the past so that we can chart the future better.
- c) Br. Huebert demonstrated publically how he carried on the editorial work and made a few corrections in the Mennonite Brethren Historical Society of Canada report.

iii. H. Giesbrecht gave a brief verbal report on the work of an archivist. He stressed the importance of keeping good records in the local churches and in the provincial conference committees.

iv. H. Heidebrecht, chairman of the Inter-Schools Committee reported on the first meeting of the representatives of the Mennonite Brethren Bible schools, Mennonite Brethren high schools and the Mennonite Brethren Bible College. He projected another meeting next October 21, 22 with J. B. Toews as speaker. It is expected that the topic for consideration will be Theological Influences and Issues.

v. Jim Pankratz reported on Student Services. He noted that it is a coordinating service for post-secondary students across Canada. He stressed that the real work has to occur on the local church level. The Student Services Committee only gathers and shares information.

vi. H. Krahn, president of the college, expressed gratitude for the students and the support of the conference.

He went on to express satisfaction with the pattern of the enrolment. The figures indicate a stabilizing trend. The Contemporary Ministries Course is well accepted. The scholarship fund is growing.

vii. Dave Redekop reviewed the financial report.

Questions regarding the college will be taken up in the evening session.

18. The moderator asked for pertinent announcements re meal and evening session.

The fraternal delegate, J. D. Friesen of the Evangelical Mennonite Mission Conference of Canada was introduced. He conveyed greetings from his conference whose convention was concluded last week. He then spoke the closing prayer.

Rudy Bartel, chairman of the Board of Evangelism read his prepared report.

How the Board Functions

The Board of Evangelism meets twice a year to review the work that has been placed under its jurisdiction and to develop strategy that is practical, progressive, and Christ-centered. The meetings of the board coincide with the sessions of the Council of Boards in January and the Canadian Conference in July.

The board consists of 11 members. Rudy Bartel, St. Catharines, is the chairman; Peter Boschman is the vice-chairman, and James Nikkel the secretary.



To give indepth attention to the three areas entrusted to this Board (Evangelism, Mass Media, Canada Inland Mission work), the board is divided into three commissions. The findings of these three commissions are presented to the entire board for further counsel and then for action.

## Areas of Work

### Evangelism

Our churches are manifesting a new interest in the area of evangelism. There are many Bible study groups and prayer groups that act as evangelism cells. We have older people and younger people who are interested and willing to be led out into a witnessing ministry. People are being accepted into our churches today who have been won to the Lord through the preaching ministries and also through the personal witnessing of individuals. We are grateful for the things that are happening in our congregations today. The Board of Evangelism has been instrumental in assisting in the following specific areas:

a) The Seminars on Evangelism - Seminars on evangelism were conducted in British Columbia, Saskatchewan and Manitoba. The B. C. Seminar of Evangelism, January 19-23, had an average attendance of 92. The Alberta/Saskatchewan Seminar at Hepburn, January 26-30, had an average attendance of 112. The Manitoba Seminar in Winnipeg, February 2-6, had an average attendance of 34. The members of the resource team were J. J. Toews, Henry J. Schmidt, Elmo Warkentin and Henry Brucks. The response to these seminars was very encouraging.

b) The Crusades - Crusades have been conducted during this conference year in a number of churches. The Messengers and an evangelist served in the following churches.

c) Deeper Life Services - "Deeper Life" and "Bible Conference" ministries were organized and conducted in various churches in our Canadian provinces. We thank God for the blessings of the Lord upon these ministries.

d) Summer Olympics - Three teams, each with twelve young people, will be going to Montreal in July. These teams, representing Columbia Bible Institute, Bethany Bible Institute, and Winkler Bible Institute, will unite with the young people from our Quebec churches to carry out a witnessing ministry to the visitors and participants at the Olympics in Montreal. They will be singing, testifying, and distributing Christian literature from various strategic centres. The Danny Wolfes

and the Herb Wiens' are organizing and directing this special ministry.

### Mass Media

During the sessions of the Canadian Conference at Regina in July 1975, the following recommendation was accepted: "We recommend that the Board of Evangelism initiate a Study Commission in response to the invitation of the Manitoba Conference to explore ways and means whereby the Canadian Conference can be invited to participate in/or assume programming operational responsibilities of the Gospel Light Hour, now known as Mennonite Brethren Communications."

A Study Commission represented the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns, the Board of Management, the Board of Christian Education, the Board of Evangelism, and representatives of the Manitoba Mennonite Brethren Communications met in Winnipeg on October 31 and November 1, 1975. Their report and suggestions were presented to the Council of Boards on January 31, 1976.

The Council of Boards advised the Board of Evangelism to continue to study this matter and then present it to the July Canadian Conference in Winnipeg. After studying the importance of Mass Media and its potential in our Canadian Conference, we realize that the responsibilities to be considered under the umbrella of Canadian Mass Media must include:

- a) a service assistance to all our Canadian Conference boards and the entire constituency;
- b) a service body that would represent the Canadian Conference interests in the Canada/U.S. Media ministries;

The Board of Evangelism is considering suggesting to our Canadian Conference the establishment of a board on the Canadian Conference level, called the Board of Mass Media.

### Canada Inland Mission

The Lord has done great things during the past year in Nova Scotia and in Quebec. The work in Nova Scotia has centered around the Dartmouth Church. The Dartmouth Church Council extended an invitation to the Hartley Smith family to accept pastoral responsibilities of the Dartmouth Mennonite Brethren Church, and they moved to Dartmouth in July 1975.

The Lord has used the Smiths in the ministry to this congregation. People have been won to the Lord. They have had two baptismal services, and seventeen members have been added to this congregation.

Through faithfulness of the local congregation and the assistance of Mennonite Brethren churches across Canada, enough funds came in to meet the requirements that justified this church's appeal for conference assistance in purchasing the church building. The church property has been purchased and on May 2 the congregation dedicated these new facilities to the Lord.

The Waterloo congregation in south eastern Quebec represents our only English language church in that province.

This church congregation was received as a member church into the Canadian Conference in July 1975. The George Wiens' have worked with great dedication in Waterloo, helping this church to establish itself on a solid foundation. There have been difficulties, and there have been victories. We want to continue to uphold this work in our prayers.

The work in French Canada has experienced the particular blessing of the Lord. There have been conversions and numerous baptismal services during this year. An additional national worker entered the ministry and became a leader in one of the churches. Another one is entering the ministry this coming summer.

During this conference year, an evening Bible course was offered for four months to interested people and fifteen young people enrolled. This initial step encouraged us to move in the direction of establishing a Bible Institute in Quebec.

The Lord guided matters so wonderfully in bringing the necessary things together, that we can present to our Canadian Conference the Bible Institute of Quebec. We have been able to purchase the Ste. Rose Church and property for a very acceptable price. This church will effectively serve the programs envisaged for Quebec.

The Lord has also added another couple, Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Wiens, of Winkler, Manitoba, for the Bible training ministry. The churches across Canada have encouraged us very much through their prayers and their gifts.

We thank the Lord for the new open door in Quebec, and we would appeal to our entire brotherhood - brethren, please pray for us.

At this point Laurie Taylor and Grant Ross of Nova Scotia thrilled our hearts with two sincere and refreshing testimonies.

Henry Brucks, executive secretary of the Board of Evangelism gave additional information about the planned witness at the Olympics and the Bible Institute in Quebec, as well as the purchase of the Ste. Rose Church.

Ernest Dyck of Ste. Therese, Quebec elaborated on the curriculum of the Quebec Bible Institute and solicited prayerful support of this relatively new work in Quebec.

Alden Ticehurst of Waterloo, Quebec gave some information about the history of this congregation, greeted the convention delegates and thanked for the assistance our conference has given to them.

Marcel Caron of Ste. Therese Church directed a few remarks to convention delegates. He thanked the conference for our prayers. He mentioned that Quebec doesn't need fish, but people who can show them how to catch fish.

Appreciation was expressed for the meaningful testimonies given by our delegates. The report of the Board of Evangelism will be continued on Tuesday.

Wilhelm Matthies of Germany, formerly from the Mennonite Brethren congregation of Karaganda, Russia was asked to direct a few remarks to the convention. His remarks in German were translated into English by Frank Peters. He spoke of the Karaganda congregation of approximately 900 members and reported that it is the only registered Mennonite Brethren Church in Russia. It functions under some difficulties but the Lord is blessing the church. He expressed appreciation for the opportunity of being present at this convention. He then closed the session at 9:20 p.m. with prayer.

26. Preliminaries

Roland Sawatzky led in the singing of "Praise to the Lord" and "All the Way My Saviour Leads Me". Mrs. Betty Suderman served by singing "Psalm 23". The moderator expressed gratitude to those who ministered to us in song at this convention. The moderator also expressed appreciation for what the brethren from other cultural backgrounds (Quebec, etc.) had meant to our conference and called upon Marcel Caron to address the convention. As a basis he read Romans 9:15,16,18 and emphasized the foreknowledge and the grace of God as found in these verses. He then related in an interesting and appealing way the story of his conversion and closed his remarks with a prayer in English and in French. Mrs. Suderman sang "I Will Sing Thee Songs of Gladness".

The moderator called upon the secretary to read the minutes of the third business session and moved their adoption. The minutes were adopted with one correction.

10. Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns (continued from Session I)

re: Resolution in Response to the Paper - "Call to Ministry" and particularly to "Team Leadership".

Loyal Funk read the re-drafted resolution which was then discussed.

Amendments to the Resolution

The following amendments were proposed:

"That we add the words 'spiritual maturity, their gifts' to section C".

CARRIED

"That we use the words 'towards a congregational consensus' in the place of 'to the congregation'".

"That we begin section C with the words 'We re-affirm the election' instead of 'The election'".

All three amendments were accepted

The corrected resolution was then presented as follows:

motion: Re: Team Leadership

- "A. We reaffirm the many blessings that have come to our congregations through God-anointed pastors.
- B. God has given many gifts to the church to complement the work of pastors and we encourage

that these be utilized in shared leadership in our congregations.

- C. We reaffirm the (s)election of the leadership group in the local congregation be made on the basis of their spiritual maturity, their gifts and their willingness to exercise them.
  - D. We encourage the leadership group to prayerfully come to a brotherly consensus as they give sensitive direction toward a congregational consensus.
  - E. We encourage the leadership group to function in unity and thereby be an example of mutual ministry to the congregation."
- CARRIED

Harold Jantz made an announcement encouraging the use of "Rejoice" in family devotions, called attention to the survey re M.B. Herald, and invited reporters and writers for the Herald to a meeting during dinner.

25. Board of Evangelism (continued from Session III of Monday Eve.

Rudy Bartel, chairman, asked Peter Klassen, chairman of Canada Inland Mission Committee to make a few remarks. After sharing a few details with the convention, Peter Klassen read the CIM recommendations and moved their acceptance

a. Recommendations of the Canada Inland Mission Committee.

Peter Klassen read three recommendations for which the following corrections were suggested.

- i. "Conference" changed to "churches" in section A.
- ii. Insert "the Quebec Churches and the Board of Evangelism" in section B.
- iii. "French churches", changed to "Quebec churches" in section C.

The revised resolutions were then presented as follows:

- motion: A. "That we recognize the generous support of the churches in the purchase of the church building at Dartmouth, Nova Scotia and at Ste. Rose, Quebec, and in their support of the Olympic witness."
- B. "That we endorse the action of the Board of Evangelism and the Quebec churches in establishing the Quebec Bible Institute."

The representatives of the Quebec Churches will be meeting for a conference, September 10-12. Special events taking place that weekend will be the dedication

of the Ste. Rose building, and the opening of the Quebec Bible Institute program. Therefore we recommend,

- C. "That the churches of the Canadian Conference announce these events and join our Quebec churches in prayer and praise to God for this occasion."

Upon motion, the resolutions were accepted.

b. Report of Media Committee

The chairman called on Neil Klassen, chairman of the committee who read his report as follows:

Information Only - \$5,000 has been budgeted to test one ½ hour L. P. Lehman TV program on a Canadian market.

1. Production and duplication of two 15 minute radio programs for the purposes of auditioning and analysis among the Canadian constituency is being planned.  
Budget - \$500.00

2a. A children's TV series of 13 half hour programs by Mennonite Brethren Communications is now in production stages. This project has utilized resource people from several provinces. Others are to be involved. The Board of Evangelism recognizes the need for such a series and encourages the Canadian churches to use and support these programs.

b. \$4,000 has been budgeted to market this series in provinces outside of Manitoba.

The report was accepted.

c. Report of the Evangelism Committee

Rudy Bartel reported as follows:

1. Over the past number of years many of our churches have benefited from the ministry of the Messengers Quartet. Since the termination of the work of our conference evangelist the Messengers have continued their ministry with a number of different brethren serving as evangelist. We as a board continue to endorse the ministry of the Messengers and commend them to our churches for continuation of Team Crusades.

2. The Messengers are being encouraged by our board to negotiate directly with our churches concerning crusades. The responsibility for crusade arrangements will now rest with the local church and the Messengers Quartet whose address is 1 Grenada Drive, St. Catharines, Ontario L2M 2S4 - telephone (416) 934-5979.

3. Negotiations for future crusades can begin immediately, with a new financial policy as proposed by the Board of Gospel Messengers Incorporated. The new financial policy affects all crusades beginning on January 1, 1977.

4. We are including \$10,000 in the budget for the purpose of subsidizing Mennonite Brethren Churches (with a membership of less than 100), who wish to arrange for crusades with the Messengers. Such negotiations for subsidy are to be initiated by local churches with the executive secretary of the Board of Evangelism.

5. Local churches are encouraged by the Board of Evangelism to develop and use strategies of evangelism on the local level through the building of reproducing disciples where II Timothy 2:2 is implemented through such approaches as the Campus Crusade Way of Life Plan, Kennedy Evangelism Explosion Plan, etc.

6. An Evangelism Contingency Fund of \$5,000 is being included in the budget for the purpose of furthering the cause of evangelism through seminars, revival and deeper life seminars, etc., using various personnel.

The report was accepted.

d. Financial Statement of the Board of Evangelism (see page 40.)

The chairman of the board called upon the conference treasurer to present the financial statement for the Board of Evangelism.

The report was accepted.

e. Budget

The conference treasurer presented the budget for the Board of Evangelism. (See page 55)

The budget was accepted.

With the acceptance of the budget, the recommendations of the Media Committee as well as those of the Evangelism Committee of the Board of Evangelism were covered.

27. Report of Board of Missions and Services

Vernon Wiebe read Psalm 89:1 and reported. He pointed out that our missions program has become large and specialized and as a result contact with local churches is at times in danger of being weakened. He pointed out that a Canadian office had been established to facilitate their contact. He then introduced Fred Epp, Missions and Services assoc. secretary for Canada. The aim of the area offices is to work together with the area home mission. Vernon Wiebe recognized Anne Ediger, Emma Lepp, D. B. Wiens, William Thiessen, Peter Kroeker, Abe Neufelds, and the Sylvester Dirks who are serving in various ways. He reported that J. J. Toews has been released to serve in Columbia Bible Institute. At the last meetings of the Board twenty-three new long-term workers were added to the ranks this year. Resources to do the work are available. Average Canadian giving in support of Missions and Services is \$67 per member.

## 29. Board of Christian Education

### a. Reports

Henry Petkau, chairman called upon Victor Neufeld, vice-chairman of the board, who in turn called upon executive secretary, John Unger who reported briefly on his planned prospective ministries. He reported also on the prospective Christian Education Conference and Banff '77. Victor Neufeld then elaborated on the report of the Board of Christian Education as follows:

The ministry of Christian Education centers around the teaching of God's Word so that there will be nurture and evangelism followed by nurture as the believer and local church grow in the grace and knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ. The task of the Board of Christian Education is to assist the churches in fulfilling this ministry.

The board believes that while the message is timeless, methodology and emphases change. To be effective we must remain acquainted with developments and trends in Christian Education. The board will devote time at the July sessions to the pursuit of such studies. This year Lawrence Richard's recent book, A Theology of Christian Education, is under study.

We are grateful for the work being done by the executive secretary, John Unger. He has devoted approximately 50 percent of his time to assignments at the local church level and at conferences and conventions.

Office work load has been especially heavy in the absence of a U.S. executive secretary. This vacancy has necessitated that all editorial work for the Sunday School Adult Quarterly, the German Lektionsheft, the Calendar of Activities, the Youth Worker, and part of the National Youth Week material be done through our Winnipeg office. At present this work load is being studied in an attempt to establish a balanced distribution.

The board wishes to remind the constituency that the Winnipeg office serves as a resource center for Sunday School, youth, club, and music activities. Provided upon request at no charge are cassette tapes, source books, curriculum guides, and other helps. Those requesting the use of such materials are asked to honor the 3 week "rental" period.

Book review services are also provided through the Provident Bookfinder, to which the board subscribes and makes available to all Mennonite Brethren church librarians.

The executive secretary has also worked at developing liaison between the Canadian and provincial Boards. This has been done through the exchange of minutes and joint sharing of provincial and national concerns. We believe this is a good thing and commend and encourage provincial boards in this kind of interaction.

At present final plans and arrangements are being made for the October 15-17, 1976 Christian Education Convention in Ontario. We are grateful for the willingness of the three St. Catharines churches to host this event. Guest speakers are Dr. Kenneth Gangel and Dr. John Wilson.

Plans for Banff '77 are also progressing satisfactorily. Edmund Janzen, president of Pacific College, will be the guest speaker. Because housing facilities at the Banff School of Fine Arts have been restricted, the board has been forced to limit the number of applications to approximately 750. Tentative plans are to make the age cut off at Grade 12 or age 17.

To assist those who travel greater distances (i.e. Ontario and Quebec) an equalization formula is being devised to distribute costs more equitably.

The board wishes to present two recommendations to the July convention.

1) That the Youth Worker, presently published by the Canadian Board of Christian Education become a joint venture of the Canadian and U.S. Area Conferences. The United States Board of Evangelism and Christian Education has shown interest in the Youth Worker and expressed a desire to be involved in its production.

The Youth Worker, published twice yearly, is not a magazine. Rather, it is a resource book for youth sponsors. Joint publication could provide greater unity between area conferences in areas of Christian Education. It would also provide a greater source of contributors. The cost of production would be shared by both conferences and thus be less burdensome.

The board is of the mind that should the Canadian Conference accept this recommendation, the Youth Worker could become the responsibility of the General Conference Board of Christian Education.

2) The Board of Christian Education further recommends to the conference the appointment of an associate executive secretary. The board believes this is necessary because:

a) The work outlined in the mandate and understood by the board is beyond one man's capabilities.

b) There is a growing need for resources in the area of youth work. Should this appointment be approved, the individual chosen would have expertise in this area.

c) Provincial Christian Education boards have expressed the need for more resources and are looking to the Canadian level for assistance.

d) The appointment of an assistant to the executive secretary would, on balance, be more economical than appointing provincial personnel.

The board has considered alternatives to a second appointment. Three of these are:

a) Working arrangements with Bible Institutes and MBBC.

b) Encouraging provincial appointments.

c) Assigning editorial responsibilities to others and involving more resource personnel within the constituency.

Whatever merits the above alternatives have, it remains the board's belief that the recommendation as presented is in the best interests of Christian education within the constituency.

#### Report by John Unger

Learning is a fundamental process of life. Every individual learns and through learning develops modes of behaviour by which he/she lives. Each generation has been able to profit by learning from the experiences and discoveries of the generations that preceded it; each contributes to the ever-growing fund of human knowledge and skills - including Christian Education.

The educative process can be shared in many ways by the teacher, the learner, the teaching methods, the choices of curriculum, and the social policy which governs our educational philosophy. Many nuggets of gold are still dormant in the soil of learning within our churches' educational endeavours. Others are being tapped with remarkable discoveries.

One of the enjoyable discoveries for me has been the realization that we have numerous gifted individuals within our conference who have much to offer to our churches in the endeavours of Christian Education. An impressive list of personnel has been recorded in our office, with more names to be added. These persons constitute a "resource list" as a fund from which we can draw support for educational seminars. It has been enriching to work with over forty of these during my brief term here in office.

We have experts and qualified resources in all areas of major educational emphasis. Certain individuals are assuming leading roles in the fields of educational administration. We have a number of educators serving in the field of teacher training. We have leadership in the ministry of club programs

for children and youth.

Possibly our greatest numerical resource is in the educational ministry itself, where talent and understanding is expressed at varying age levels of children, youth and adults. We also have good librarians who can help us understand operational procedures for effective service with books. Each province has persons interested in Christian camping. Much can be learned about God through outdoor education.

An increasing number of Christian counsellors are able to direct us in better understanding of persons and how to deal with them. Our media personnel is likewise a sizeable group, who can help us use more effectively the tools now available to us.

Today we have persons working in the medical profession who can help us understand matters pertaining to practical everyday living. These are sincere, committed persons who are concerned about ethical decision making in daily life. We have educators who have studied problems of family living, problems of sociology, and the accompanying behaviour patterns. The above list of resources is incomplete, but it points to the great potential.

On the second half of the ledger we express our needs. We have needs in many areas of our church life. Our churches are open to new insights in administration, leadership, youth services, music in the church, and a multiplicity of educational media.

When resources and needs meet dialogue is established, producing change through new insights, new goals and new challenges. These can be faced at the local church, regional, provincial or national levels. Education in the church touches every area of life. It influences our physical, social, emotional and spiritual vitality. It shapes our destiny. Christian education is one of the great ministering agencies of the church.

During the past 22 months of involvement (August 1, 1974 to May 31, 1976), I have had the opportunity of serving in 63 of the 132 Canadian Mennonite Brethren churches. By province the ratio is as follows:

- 11 out of 38 churches in British Columbia
- 2 out of 14 churches in Alberta
- 12 out of 30 churches in Saskatchewan
- 24 out of 27 churches in Manitoba
- 14 out of 18 churches in Ontario.

The length of ministry in each church varied from one session to three days. This has totalled 155 workshops, 91 messages and 6 panels or forums. Additional services were offered in non-Mennonite Brethren churches, Bible schools, private high schools, colleges and at conventions and retreats as opportunities presented themselves. In addition the host of resource persons greatly added to the services rendered.

How can the local church plan for a Christian Education

convention? Begin by arranging a suitable time in the calendar. Contact our office in Winnipeg to clear the dates. Then offer suggested areas of need, so that topic ideas and personnel may be matched. Indicate the length of the convention. Generally they have begun Friday evening and concluded on Sunday.

The Christian Education office works with the church contact persons to develop a detailed agenda, meaningful and suited to the size and request of the group. At least 3 to 6 months of advance planning is necessary for implementation of the program. The more specifics we receive the better our opportunities of ministry.

A convention should do a number of things for us. It should include an inspirational tone throughout. It should include a wealth of sharing of information. It should help each individual to be better equipped for teaching. It should help us see life in its deeper spiritual perspective, so that greater fulfillment may be experienced in our lives.

The teaching task will continue. It will no doubt vary in method and style, but learning will not cease. We are a vital part of the process.

To what end do we teach? We are chosen of God to care and share in the fruits of the Spirit. We are helping individuals become God's people today. This is what Christian Education is designed to do.

The report were accepted.

b. Financial Report

The financial report of the board was presented by the chairman. See page 39.

The report was accepted and a discussion of various aspects of the work arising from all reports followed.

c. Recommendations

The following recommendations were presented:

- i. Re: Youth Worker becoming a joint venture of Canadian and U.S. Area Conferences.

motion: "That the Youth Worker, presently published by the Canadian Board of Christian Education become a joint venture of the Canadian and U.S. Area Conferences."  
(Accepted)

The United States Board of Evangelism and Christian Education has shown interest in the Youth Worker and expressed a desire to be involved in its production.

The Youth Worker, published twice yearly, is not a magazine. Rather, it is a resource book for youth sponsors. Joint publication could provide a greater unity between area conferences in areas of Christian Education. It would also provide a greater source

of contributors. The cost of production would be shared by both conferences and thus be less burdensome.

The board is of the mind that should the Canadian Conference accept this recommendation, the Youth Worker could become the responsibility of the General Conference Board of Christian Education.

ii. Re: Deferring of Appointment of Associate Executive Secretary

The Board of Christian Education wishes to defer the recommendation of an associate executive secretary. The board is still of the mind that:

- a) The work outlined in the mandate and understood by the board is beyond one man's capabilities.
- b) There is a growing need for resources in the area of youth work. Should this appointment be approved, the individual chosen would have expertise in this area.
- c) Some provincial Christian Education boards have expressed the need for more resources and are looking to the Canadian level for assistance.
- d) The appointment of an assistant to the executive secretary would, on balance, be more economical than appointing provincial personnel.

The board has considered alternatives to a second appointment. Four of these are:

- a) Working arrangements with Bible Institutes and MBBC.
- b) Encouraging provincial appointments.
- c) Assigning editorial responsibilities to others and involving more resource personnel within the constituency.
- d) Decreasing number of church visits per year.

The deferral of the recommendation is made with the intention of further studying all possible alternatives.

Following several expressions in favour of having an assistant to the executive secretary, the following motion was made from the floor.

motion: "That the Board of Christian Education be encouraged to appoint an associate executive secretary if a suitable person can be found."

The motion was seconded but deferred for discussion to the afternoon session.

After announcements by Abe Quiring, the moderator closed the morning session with prayer.

motion to amend: The following amendment was moved and seconded.

"If satisfactory alternative arrangements cannot be made, the Board of Christian Education should report to either the Council of Boards or the conference in session before any appointment is made."

Motion: "That the motion as amended be accepted."

Budget

The budget which appears in the financial report was adopted upon motion.

33. Board of Publications

H. H. Voth summarized the published report. The following report was accepted.

Report

It has been said - in fact, by the editor of the Mennonite Brethren Herald, quoting a noted historian (perhaps

somewhat facetiously) - that one of the problems that seems to accompany "a civilization nearing its end is a cancerous growth of publications."

As we survey our achievements in the area of publications we cannot speak of a cancerous growth. Rather, we believe that we can report wholesome progress in the routine work and also some growth. That this is so must be attributed first of all to the gracious provision and blessing of our Heavenly Father and secondly to the faithful and conscientious labor of the staff involved. This wholesome progress manifested itself in the following areas.

#### Mennonitische Rundschau

Despite several difficulties (such as a prolonged postal strike) this paper, now in its 99th year of publication, continued to appear regularly in the homes of 5,400 subscribers. A breakdown of distribution of subscribers is as follows:

If the MR is to be an effective link with brothers and sisters in other lands it needs to be sent by air mail. The General Conference action of last August to decline approval of a \$3,500 subsidy to make such mailing possible, has necessitated a search for other sources of revenue. These have not yet been fully found.

In spite of the increasing work load, occasioned in part by the need to translate into German much of the material that is printed in the MR, the editor, Brother Erich Ratzlaff, reports that he is optimistic and willing to continue in his work.

#### Mennonite Brethren Herald

In comparison to the 99 year history of the Mennonitische Rundschau, the Mennonite Brethren Herald, in its 15th year, is relatively young. During the winter months the circulation rose to somewhat over 9,600 copies; in summer this number diminishes by about 300. In his report to the board, the editor, Harold Jantz, says, "We need to keep on asking ourselves whether the writing and publishing we are doing needs to be done." His answer is, "Yes, quite emphatically yes."

As the editor sees it, the function of a strong church paper (and we accept the Herald as such) is fourfold:

1) It should regularly provide helpful, stimulating and instructive articles which our readers could appropriate for



their Christian lives.

2) It should provide a rich source of news about the important events in the life of our denomination in the first place, but then also in the life of the church worldwide.

3) It should draw attention to and give leadership editorially on issues with which we as Christians need to grapple.

4) It should provide the kind of family and personal information which helps us feel that we are truly part of one another.

We invite your reaction to these statements of function. How well is our MB Herald doing in fulfilling this purpose?

In his report the editor shared in some detail, his view of his task. It would seem right that we should include part of this in our report.

"We are one evangelical Mennonite group within a number of other church groups and a much larger relatively unchurched population. On all sides we are exposed to many ideas and media influences, many of which propagandize for particular points of view, and frequently convey the attitude that God does not matter. We want to say, by the subjects we touch and the life of the church we portray, that commitment to Christ and his Word and to his people makes all the difference in the world.

"We believe that it is more important than ever that the church and each community of believers such as ours have a vital channel of communication and information. Can you imagine a year in which there would be no means of passing news from any of our churches on to the rest? Recently I talked to a Mennonite Brethren church leader from the Soviet Union, where such a link is not available. For years they have made it their business, he said, to try to locate groups of Mennonite Brethren throughout the country, yet even now they are locating new groups - sometimes only a handful of people - that they never knew existed. They have no means of passing printed information about their history to one another, no way of reinforcing in print the teaching about Mennonite Brethren emphases which they believe to be important.

"We feel it is our challenge to try to work responsibly with the issues which confront us as Christians in the world. A sense of Christian restraint in a time of inflation, concern for the Third World, the secularism of Canadian education, the assaults on the family, the problems of conscience of people within a force-oriented labour movement, male and female roles in a time of changing attitudes, TM - all of these have been issues we've faced while also concerning ourselves with those matters which are very much a part of the inner life of the church.

"Ask yourself whether the church can do without a vital press. And if you feel it plays a key role, could we ask you to pledge yourself to pray for the ministry of the Herald?

Could we also ask you to recommend it to new readers? And could we ask you to use it to extend the witness of our brotherhood by planting it with the opinion leaders in your community, the local papers, civic leaders and professional people, and in local schools and libraries? We believe new areas of witness are enlisting your help to exploit them."

### The Print Shop

The 1975 conference year began with the challenge of finding a new manager for the print shop. In spite of all our efforts, no satisfactory permanent solution to our need has been found.

Jim Friesen, our production manager, has capably filled in as "acting manager", but this places an extra burden on him, in addition to an already heavy work load. However, in cooperation with board member Neil Fast, he has kept the physical plant operating smoothly and the anticipated expenses and sales were kept within the expected limits. Budget figures for sales and expenses were, respectively, \$325,000 and \$310,000; and the anticipated figures at year end should be \$345,000 and \$327,000.

An arrangement had been made for equipment study. However, due to lack of permanent management the study was not carried out and no significant capital expenditures were made.

The board appointed a committee, including representatives of the editorial staff, the Board of Management and the Board of Publications to study the advisability of continuing to operate our own print shop to print our periodicals. The committee reported that if the print shop, a) has the needed capacity; b) can handle our major publications; c) can do other work for conference and church-related agencies; d) has the necessary accessibility, we should continue to operate it.

### Publication of Books

There has been some activity in this area during the past year. A third printing of The Earth Is Round, (2,000 copies) has been completed. The first two printings totalled 5,000 copies. Arrangements have been made with Margaret Epp to write the story of the church in Vienna, probably in the coming year. Private funds have made possible the printing and distribution of some of Brother H. H. Janzen's writings: Der Roemerbrief, Und Ich Sah, and Jesu Reden Ueber Die Letzte Zeit. Helmut Huebert has been giving the board valuable assistance in the work of publishing books.

### Fellowship Bookcenter

Together with the Conference of Mennonites in Canada we have continued to operate the book store. Harold Paetkau, who served as manager since the beginning of the cooperative venture, resigned, and a new manager, Henry Harder, has been appointed. In addition to general Christian literature, the store seeks to provide a good supply of denominational and anabaptist literature. Operation during this past year has remained fairly stable and continues to show a small profit.

## Cooperation with Christian Leader

In keeping with the recommendation we accepted at the conference in Regina last year, our editorial staff of the Christian Leader met in Denver last fall and again at the end of May. Progress has been made in arranging editorial co-operation and in planning, preparing and publishing a special "youth insert".

We are grateful to God and our editorial and printing staff for what has happened this year. We trust God to make that fruitful which was done in his Spirit and according to his will.

The report was accepted.

H. H. Voth elaborated on the restructure of the board. A question and answer period followed. The editorial policy of the M.B. Herald was also questioned. The nine points which are printed in the pamphlet published under the title "Belief, Practice and Audience" were reviewed. A thought was expressed that the Herald should never publish any articles which would be contrary to our established principles and doctrine.

The editor of the Mennonite Brethren Herald, Harold Jantz, spoke to the convention and introduced his assistant Allan Siebert. He mentioned several ways in which we as churches and individuals can contribute to the paper.

## Budget

Neil Fast, chairman of the board, referred to the financial statement and the budget which had earlier been accepted.

Appreciation was expressed for this year's conference insert which was considered to be a very fine issue.

## 34. Special Music

The mixed quartet from the Fort Garry Mennonite Brethren Church sang its second number "Lo, My Shepherd Is Divine".

## 35. Board of Management

Dave Warkentin summarized the printed report which appears in the conference insert.

## Report

### Bethesda Home

The past year has been full of activity and excitement for those of us involved in the administration and work at Bethesda. We are thankful for the Lord's help and guidance and blessing.

A constant effort has been made to improve the life of the 120 or so residents living at Bethesda. This has been

done by improving program, facilities and staff involvement.

After a number of months of intensive planning, a shift to a new method of caring for the residents is being introduced. The "medical model" has given way to the "developmental model" with a greater emphasis on providing a normal living environment, thus helping the resident to develop to the best of his/her ability toward as normal a life as possible. Although this type of program has been demanded by the government department, we agree that it is a genuine improvement.

Not only will the residents benefit, but staff also will find their work more interesting and challenging. Certain staff changes have been necessary. In addition to changes relating to program, special efforts are being made to improve staff relations in other areas as well.

The therapeutic swimming pool which was donated to Bethesda by an interested and grateful family of one of the residents, was officially opened in July '75. It has been a great asset to the recreation and rehabilitation program. A new workshop/maintenance shop is nearing completion. The much-needed kitchen expansion will also soon be finished. All these improved facilities help make Bethesda a better place for residents and staff.

The Ontario Government Department of Community and Social Services continues to fund operating expenses. The funding of capital expenses is under negotiation. We are thankful for the friendly and helpful working relationship we enjoy with various officials in all areas of the work. It does make the work much easier and more productive.

#### Conference Physical Assets

The Property Committee inspected the Ste. Rose Church property in Quebec and negotiated the final purchase. The other Quebec properties were also visited, as were the Nova Scotia properties.

Observations and recommendations were referred to the Board of Evangelism.

Conference Property Insurance is assessed periodically and kept up to date.

#### Conference Offices

The second floor of the Christian Press building is now mostly filled with conference offices. The board endeavours to help manage and coordinate staff working there, equipment, etc., to insure maximum efficiency and hopefully continued and maximum cooperation.

#### Salary Schedule

Reviewing salaries and establishing equity of salaries among conference workers is an ongoing process, especially in times of rapid inflation. Considerable time and energy is expended in reaching equitable salaries as well as other ben-

efits.

### Financing

Most provincial area conferences have in recent years changed their methods of funding from that of levies to free-will giving. The air of change has also touched the Canadian Conference. Although funds to the conference treasury are still calculated on a per capita basis, the amounts required are indicated as "norms".

Furthermore, we have seen some boards shifting their dependence for funds more and more to offerings collected specifically for designated purposes. With the pressure of dollars increasing, another method is now under more serious consideration than heretofore. We have endowment funds in the Canadian Conference administered by the General Conference Board of Trustees. At this July '76 conference, decisions will need to be made concerning the establishment and funding of endowment funds for both the Mennonite Brethren Seminary and MBBC. To be considered are the philosophy and desirability of endowment funds, the amounts to be set for these funds, and the method of acquiring funds.

We want to help one another to be faithful stewards in the use of the material goods God has given us.

The report was accepted.

He presented a supplementary report as follows:

Of the six sections in the constitution outlining the board's responsibilities, five deal with matters that concern most or all the other five boards of the Canadian Conference. So we repeatedly remind ourselves to "...in humility think more of others than we do of ourselves. None of us should think only of our own affairs, but should learn to see things from other people's point of view (Phil. 2:4) (adapted from Phillips Translation). That requires special wisdom for which we must rely on God. (Proverbs 2, James 3). We trust that our efforts are always constructive and helpful in the end.

We report briefly on three areas of board responsibility:

a. "Providing Salary Schedules for Conference Personnel"

i. To enable us to carry out this responsibility meaningfully, one of our recommendations requests necessary information from all boards concerned.

ii. Employees Group Insurance Plan. This has been improved in a number of areas upon approval of those concerned.

b. "Carrying Out Required Budget Control"

To enable us to fulfill this responsibility, one of our recommendations deals with a method of carrying out

such control.

We are also concerned that in some instances more detailed accounting be instituted in order to more accurately indicate or reflect actual costs of individual buildings or programs. We are working towards this end where the need appears to exist. The principle is applied equally to all boards.

The actual method of interaction between boards and/or treasurer(s) on budget and financial matters has also been developed in order to facilitate proper functioning.

c. "Administration and Supervision of all the Physical Assets of the Conference"

i. It is our feeling that proceeds from the disposition of capital assets of the conference belong to the conference. The conference then decides where such proceeds should be applied. We have always taken this position.

ii. We have examined the Mighton Street Apartment, the purchase of which has been proposed by the Board of Higher Education, and we concur with them that it is a wise move.

The move to dispose of the McIntosh property also seems reasonable to us.

iii. We are proposing an alteration/renovation project for the front portion of the conference building, the rationale being as follows:

- The front-face of the building will look more presentable (actually very pleasing) and will be more practical.
- The resulting provision of additional space and reorganization of space will make it possible for the Christian Press to rearrange their entire operation, making it more functional and efficient and allowing for installation of better equipment.

The capital expenditure for this improvement and for repair of the roof is estimated to cost \$20,000. (You will have the opportunity to vote on this item in the budget).

iv. Insurance coverage on conference assets will be increased substantially in the near future.

d. "Some Observations About Our Giving Patterns"

It is encouraging that our giving has increased again in most areas, although the overall increase has been the lowest % of the past four years. Increased funds were also received for Canadian Conference budget

requirements, but we received the lowest % in the past five years of the budgeted amount required. In the past few days we have again heard of the important work of the Lord that our donations to the conference budget support. On behalf of the other boards, we would encourage and challenge the sisters and brethren in the churches across Canada to give as much as possible but at least up to the suggested norm. As you have heard, that is \$38 per member.

### Recommendations

- I. In order to comply with the constitutional requirements of the Board of Management of "... providing salary schedules for conference personnel." (Article E, Sec. 6), we recommend

motion: "That the following information be supplied by the conference boards when submitting their proposed salary schedules:

- a) the reference groups that are used to establish salary schedules, and
- b) job descriptions for each class of employees or employee."

- II. In order to enable the Board of Management to carry out adequate budgetary control, we recommend

motion: "That over-expenditures or re-allocation of budgetary provision by any board be allowed only upon application to and approval by the Board of Management for such changes and upon ratification by the conference."

Both motions were accepted.

- III. In order to facilitate the purchase of the Mighton Apartment for the MB Bible College, we recommend

motion: "That the conference authorize the Board of Management to make a loan of \$156,000 to facilitate the apartment purchase."

Moved by Dave Warkentin, seconded by H. H. Dueck

Accepted.

### Financial Report

J. J. Riediger referred to the financial report which was accepted. See pages 22-59.

### Budget

J. J. Riediger referred to the budget as it appears in the financial report which was approved upon motion.

### Budget

The budgets for the Board of Spiritual and Social Con-

cerns and the General Conference were presented and upon motion were carried.

The Ontario Conference has invited the Canadian Conference to come to the Wilfred Laurier University in Waterloo for the 1977 Canadian Conference.

At this point the delegates were divided into fifteen groups for the discussion of the presented paper. They met in different rooms under the direction of previously appointed leadership.

#### 5. Plenary Sessions

At 11:15 the delegates re-assembled to share some of the remarks as expressed in group discussion. The author was asked some questions which he answered and elaborated upon.

(Individual remarks are not recorded here as the findings committee is to bring a report which will be ratified by the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns and will be recorded later).

6. Closing

After a few announcements, the meeting closed at 12:00 noon with prayer by Vernon Wiebe of Hillsboro, Kansas.

STUDY SESSION II - Saturday afternoon, July 3, 1976 - 2 p.m.

7. Song Service and Opening Prayer

Paul Wiebe led in the singing of "Word of Life, Divine and Holy" and "Be Thou My Vision" after which John Baerg of Clearbrook, B. C. led in prayer.

8. Special Music

Lloyd Penner of the River East Mennonite Brethren Church, Winnipeg, Manitoba, sang a solo entitled "Love One Another".

9. Scripture Reading

As an introduction to the afternoon session, the chairman, Loyl Funk read James 1:22-25.

10. Study Paper "The Mennonite Brethren Church Today" - by John Redekop

(The manuscript cannot be published but one copy will be placed in our official minutes file).

11. Special Music

Lloyd Penner brought a second solo entitled "Consider and Hear Me".

12. Discussion Group

At this point the delegates again gathered in smaller groups for the discussion of the presented paper.

13. Plenary Sessions

At 4:30 p.m. the delegates re-assembled to share some of the remarks expressed in the group discussions. The author was asked various questions which were answered.

## SECTION C

### SPECIAL SERVICES

Saturday Evening, July 3, 1976, 7:30 p.m. - reported by Allan Siebert

The evening program, "Serving in the Seventies", which was chaired by H.H. Dueck and sponsored by the Board of Christian Education, opened with congregational singing led by Henry Peters. John Unger welcomed the group and led in the invocation.

Several musical groups took part in the service, including Elsie, Don and Gareth - a Winnipeg folk group, Living Water - a Winnipeg instrumental ensemble, Joy Sounds - a mixed octet from Saskatoon, and Genesis - a male trio. Each presented some numbers. Several musical styles were represented.

Larry Thiessen reported on his service last summer in Dartmouth, Nova Scotia, working with the church there. He challenged the young people present to get involved in Christian service.

Fred Stoesz, who had recently worked with World Impact in Los Angeles, also gave his testimony. "Apply yourself in meeting people's needs, ... and above all meet their spiritual needs," he said. "For God's sake, get involved with people."

Jim Pankratz spoke briefly about the upcoming Banff '77 retreat for youth.

The evening's speaker, Murray Phillips, prefaced his remarks with some background on the Second Mile Community (located near Kenora) in which he is involved. Its goals were to study the direction of our culture and how to speak to it; to share deeply with others our Christian faith experience; and to be an effective outreach through the community. He expressed gratitude for the influence of Mennonite Brethren in his life.

In a talk he titled, "Who Turned on the Dark?", he examined the current mood of despair evident in modern culture and challenged young people not to "reflect back the world's despair" but to live as salt and light in the world. "Sometimes our Christianity will bring us into direct conflict with North American society," he said. He added a challenge to church leaders to give young people a chance to work in the church, noting that they are the church of today, not tomorrow. "Shine as light in the world," he concluded.

An offering for the work of Christian Education was taken during the service.

After the closing, the youth present were invited to share refreshments and a "Youth Social Hour".

English Worship Service of the Canadian Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches, Winnipeg Convention Centre, July 4, 1976  
10 a.m. (As recorded by D. D. Duerksen)

1. Victor Toews, worship leader and chairman of the host churches, welcomed delegates and guests and called upon the congregation to rise as the mass choir under the direction of Alan Janzen, Fort Garry Mennonite Brethren Church, sang the call to worship "Give Ear to My Words, O Lord". He then called upon Abe Neufeld, Austria, to lead in the invocation.

2. Invocation

Brother Neufeld extended greetings from the Mennonite Brethren Church in Vienna with Psalm 126:3. He also brought greetings from the European Mennonite Brethren Conference as well as from the congregations in USSR. For the invocation Brother Neufeld read Acts 3:1-10 and emphasized three aspects of the discerning church.

- a) The discerning church has the right attitude to things possessed.
- b) The discerning church becomes the healing community.
- c) The discerning church recognizes that it is part of God's plan.

His comments were followed by his prayer of invocation.

3. Congregational Hymns

Paul Wiebe led the congregation in the singing of "Come Let Us All Unite to Sing" and "Praise The Lord".

4. The choir now sang "Lord, Our Creator" by Mendelssohn.

5. First Message

Henry Unrau, pastor of the Lakeview Mennonite Brethren Church, Lethbridge, Alberta brought the first message on the theme, "The Church of Jesus Christ, a Discerning Community". He emphasized four areas of discernment. The Christian ought to discern (1) God's love to us, (2) the lower nature that still plagues us, (3) the lordship of Christ in our lives and the role of responsibility to see sinners saved. Using John 4, Mark 6, and Luke 7 as a basis he drew from the life of the disciples three examples of lack of discernment.

John 4 - Disciples living was interfered with by a seeking soul.

Mark 6 - Disciples resented their interruption of leisure.

Luke 7 - Discernment of the disciples is dulled by their cynical analysis syndrome which leads to an apathy stifling love and compassion. In each of the three chapters Christ is ready to correct the disciples in their lack of discernment. The example of David, Acts 13:22 and 36 illustrates positive discernment evident in David's being a real person, in his gratitude and in his faith. Brother Unrau concluded with a challenge to be a discerning community

of believers.

6. The first message of the morning was followed by the choir selection "Ye Servants of God" which was followed by an offering for Missions and Services and the congregational hymn "Crown Him With Many Crowns" sung with variations to the accompaniment of organ and trumpets.

7. Second Message

Loyal Funk, pastor of Frasersview Mennonite Brethren Church and chairman of the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns used Galatians 6:1-5 and Psalm 55:22 as a basis for his message. Appropriately he emphasized that the discerning community is a burden-bearing community. He developed three thoughts.

- a) Every man will bear his own burden - on the one hand man is individually responsible before God.
- b) Bearing each other's burdens by attempting to restore one another in a spirit of meekness, by speaking more tenderly words of encouragement.
- c) Ultimately it is the Lord who helps us to bear individual burdens as well as burdens of others.  
Psalm 55:22.

8. Following this message the choir sang "The Beatitudes" by Evans with Jake Klassen, Steinbach Mennonite Brethren Church as soloist.
9. Brother Funk gave the benediction which was followed by the choral benediction "Lord, Now Let Thy Servants" by Lovelace.

German Worship Service of the Canadian Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches, Winnipeg Convention Centre, July 4, 1976  
10 a.m. (as recorded by G. Friesen)

1. Invocation

After the introductory remarks by the leader, Wm. I. Neufeld, the congregation sang several songs. A quartet from Winkler, Manitoba brought a special number in song. D. B. Wiens led in the opening prayer.

2. Message by Henry Penner of Saskatoon.

The text was Acts 14:19-27.

The Church a Discerning Community

Our time is marked by progress. New techniques are old before they appear on the market. Radio and TV have established good communications in the world today. Foreign countries have become our neighbours. The question is:

Where are we going?

Are we going to keep the Christian faith in this world



where evil seems to reign today? Will we be able to be the salt and the light in our world today?

The Lord has promised that the Church of Jesus Christ will not be destroyed.

What are some of the characteristics of the Church of Jesus Christ?

- a) The Church of Jesus Christ is aware of the evil in this world.

Persecution is the lot of many Christians today. Satan attacks the church today. He tries to make the Christians lukewarm. Conformity to the world - another danger for the church. Satan also tries to bring disunity into the church. But we know the Lord is still reigning.

- b) The Church of Jesus Christ has a responsibility to meet the needs of others in this world.

First to meet the needs of fellow Christians, but at the same time it goes beyond its boundaries. Where are the men and women today who are ready to go and work for the Lord inspite of all the attacks of Satan?

- c) The Church of Jesus Christ looks after good and healthy spiritual growth.

We need brethren and sisters rooted in the Word of God. The home is the centre for Bible instruction. Parents have a special responsibility in teaching their children the Word of God.

- d) The Church of Jesus Christ lives only from the grace of God.

Only the grace of God will bring us to our final destination.

- e) In the Church of Jesus Christ different experiences are being shared with fellow brethren and sisters, but also with people around us.

### 3. Music

After another special number by the quartet from Winkler, Manitoba an offering was held resulting in \$1,306.21. The congregation joined in singing a hymn.

### 4. Message by John Baerg of Clearbrook, B. C.

The text was I Thess. 1 to the end of the chapter.

#### Introduction

Does your church have the name in the community that Christ rules in the church?

- Paul preached the whole Word to the Church at Thessalonica. Paul preached in the power of the Holy Spirit. Are we filled and lead by the Holy Spirit?

- Paul preached the Word courageously because he knew that in the Word were the answers for men's problems.

- Many churches are in ill condition today because the Word has been preached in an unconvincing manner.

- It is time to start preaching the whole Word. There is nothing in the Word we have to ashamed of.

- Are we living our faith also during the week and not just on Sunday?

- The guidelines and the power are contained in the Word of God.

- The church was patient in hope.

- Persecutions came in, but the church remained patient.

- Do we have the assurance that the victory is ours?

What was the reaction of the world to the Church at Thessalonica, verse 9? They saw that they had turned to Christ and were serving Christ.

- Are you a happy child of God? If not, give yourself unconditionally over to Christ.

- They served a living God in the Church at Thessalonica. They turned away from idol worship.

- They were waiting for the return of Jesus Christ. The result was that this Church because a testimony and example for others.

## 5. Music

The quartet sang another song.

## 6. Closing

The meeting closed with prayer.

Vesper Service of the Canadian Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches, Winnipeg Convention Centre, July 4, 1976, 5 p.m. (as reported by D. D. Duerksen.)

1. H. H. Voth, moderator of the Manitoba Conference welcomed the guests and turned the chairmanship of the meeting over to H. H. Dueck, chairman of the Board of Higher Education.
2. Brother Dueck introduced members of the faculty and members of the board on the podium and called upon president Henry Krahn for the invocation.

3. Brother Krahn introduced the theme of the afternoon by stating that the major objective of the college is to help students to find true freedom in order that they be able to serve mankind. He read I Cor. 9:19-23 and led in prayer.
4. A select choir under the direction of John Martens sang "My Soul Wait Thou Upon The Lord".
5. Roland Sawatzky led the congregation in the singing of several verses from "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God".
6. Esther Wiens introduced the drama "Circle Beyond Fear" with musical interludes written by Peter Klassen. The drama depicts man's alienation from God represented particularly in the portrayal of Cain who moves in a vicious circle of fear, but who is redeemed by God's mark of mercy portrayed by characters representing the true church. The truth of the love and mercy of God sets man free and leads from the vicious circle of meaninglessness to the circle beyond fear.
7. Testimonies
  - a. Doug Schultz spoke as past student body president and shared his excitement about MBBC and shared several problems which are dealt with by the combined efforts of students and faculty.
  - b. James Pankratz made reference to some 1,000 Mennonite Brethren students involved in post-secondary education. He pointed out that the Christian faith is precious, but not weak. Students ought to be encouraged to ask, to re-examine, to challenge, and to grow. He expressed gratitude to Christian friends who had encouraged him in his quest. He concluded with the statement "All honest questions, examinations and challenges lead to Him who is the truth."
8. After a solo by John Martens and a choir selection, J. A. Toews spoke on "The Truth That Liberates" emphasizing that the truth that sets free is (a) inscripturated truth, (b) integrated truth, and (c) incarnated truth.
9. Dan Block extended an invitation to all alumni members to meet at 7:30 at MBBC.
10. The meeting was brought to a conclusion by Henry J. Dick who led in prayer after the choir had sung "Hallelujah".

German Service at the North Kildonan Mennonite Brethren Church, Sunday, July 4, 1976, 8:30 p.m. (as reported by D. D. Duerksen)

After Alfred Dick had led the congregation in the singing of several German songs, Pastor William Neufeld welcomed the congregation and led in the invocation with appropriate scripture passage and prayer. He then called upon John Wieler of MCC (Canada) who introduced Wilhelm Matthies, one of the founders of the Mennonite Brethren Church at Karaganda, Russia, now residing in Germany.

Brother Matthies read Psalm 90:1 as a basis of his paper dealing with the conditions of the Mennonites in USSR. In his paper he gave a brief survey of the history of the Mennonite Church in Russia since the Revolution. Then he proceeded to trace in somewhat more detail the establishment of the only legalized Mennonite Brethren congregation in USSR through the years 1956-1968. In 1968 the church, built with the permission of government authorities was dedicated. Presently this church has a membership of 900.

In his paper Brother Matthies pointed out that while the Mennonite Brethren Church of USSR recognized the common elements of faith with the Russian Baptists, it was incorrect to regard the Baptist delegation to America as representative of the Mennonites. He then proceeded to outline twelve distinctives. In conclusion he had three requests to brethren in America. (a) Remember the brethren in USSR in prayer, (b) try to understand brethren in Russia, and (c) pray for a Moses and the possibility of an exodus.

In the discussion and questions which followed John Wieler pointed out that the Baptist delegation which visited America recently was not regarded as a delegation representing Mennonites, but that in discussion with the Baptist brethren, many concerns regarding Mennonite distinctives had been shared with the Baptist brethren.

After an offering to be divided in half for Missions and Services and MCC, Brother Matthies closed the meeting with prayer after the congregation had sung "Keiner Wird zu Schanden".
