July 2nd - 5th, 1977

BUSINESS SESSIONS

BUSINESS SESSION I - Saturday, July 2nd, 1977, 1:30 p.m.

Chairman - Herbert Brandt

Secretaries - C. J. Rempel, John Wittenberg

Song Service

Jake Willms directed the delegates in the singing of "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name", "I Know Whom I Have Believed" and "Beneath the Cross of Jesus".

Opening

The welcome to the delegates and guests by Herbert Brandt, Assistant Moderator, included a special recognition of those who were attending their first Mennonite Brethren Convention. Herb Neufeld led in the opening prayer.

1. Preliminary Business Items

a. Minutes

C. J. Rempel explained that the minutes for this Convention would be reported in our Conference book in two sections as follows:

A - Business Sessions

B - Study Conference, Devotional Messages and Special Meetings

He then read the minutes of the morning study session which were approved with several changes having been made.

b. Time Schedule

The time schedule was announced as follows:

9:00 a.m. - 12:00 noon

1:30 p.m. - 5:00 p.m.

7:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m.

c. Rules of Order

The secretary read the rules of order by which this Convention will be conducted. He also read the definition and duties of each delegate as follows:

"Serving as a delegate is a trust. Delegates are chosen not only as representatives but also as responsible persons expressing their convictions and insights to the best of their ability under the direction of the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, in the gathered assembly the delegate shares in a decision-making body which both represents and is the church at that particular moment."

d. Appointments

The following appointments were announced and ratified by the delegates:

- i. Assistant Secretary - John Wittenberg
- ii. Ballotting Committee - Henry Esau, Chairman
- iii. Resolutions Committee - H.H. Voth, John Eckert
- iv. Parliamentarian - John Redekop

e. Agenda

The agenda was reviewed and accepted.

f. Constitutional Change Regarding New Churches

C.J. Rempel reported on the vote of the churches on the constitutional change with reference to the acceptance of new churches.

Churches reporting - 61. Breakdown as follows:

"Yes" votes	- 41 - 1931 votes
"Unanimous"	- 1 - no votes recorded
"100%"	- 2 - no votes recorded
A tick in the "yes" column	- 16 - no votes recorded
"No" tick mark	- 1 - no votes recorded

In view of the fact that no actual "no" votes were recorded, our present constitution calls for this change now being in effect. The present constitution is hereby considered as officially changed.

The change in the church directory will record the following:

2. Conference Message - by F.C. Peters - "For Such a Time as This"

The following is an outline of the main thoughts expressed in the message. The complete message will be published in Section B, pages 111 - 115.

Brother Peters developed the following thoughts:

a. Mennonite Brethren need to face the question of denominational identity.

- i. A first century faith
- ii. A twentieth century mission

- iii. The historical roots
- iv. Evangelical fellowship

b. A Functional Policy

- i. We define our brotherhood as extending beyond the local church.
- ii. We must decide whether the General Conference is the basic conference structure or whether it is a federation of two area conferences.

c. Mennonite Brethren must maintain a sense of direction

- i. Our theologians must give us a Mennonite Brethren version of Anabaptism.
- ii. We must maintain a balance between proclamation and service in the name of Christ.
- iii. In our world fellowship we wish to maintain our sense of identity as Mennonite Brethren while co-operating with others.
- iv. We must achieve a renewed sense of leadership.

Response to the Message

Various comments were made to the message. A question was raised about dropping the label "Mennonite". Brother Peters responded by saying he had not suggested the dropping of the label but that he had said the Mennonite Brethren must become willing to face a discussion of such a possibility. The comment was made that such a suggested "openness" to a discussion of the word "Mennonite" was appreciated.

The need was expressed for a paper on this issue to be written and circulated among Mennonite Brethren congregations for their discussion.

Ed Janzen and Dave Warkentin served with two violin and tenor duets - "Come Love, Come Lord" and "Evening Prayer".

4. Conference Executive

a. Report

C. J. Rempel read the prepared report.

Some of the duties of the Executive Committee are: to represent the Council of Boards between sessions, to prepare recommendations for conventions and to plan conventions.

This we have done.

The Committee met on six different occasions, either alone or with other boards or committees such as the Long Range Planning Committee, the Council of Boards and the 1977 Convention Planning Committee.

One of the recommendations presented to the annual meeting of the Council of Boards dealt with the duties of the Long Range Planning Committee which was formed at last year's convention. The duties, accepted by the Council, were these:

1. To review present conference structures with a view to making the modifications required to keep our conference machinery current with the times.

2. To anticipate needs in the Canadian Conference and to project objectives for the direction of conference activity.

3. To authorize studies with respect to overall conference structure policy and work and to present these with recommendations to our conventions.

With the approval of these guidelines, three Study Commissions were approved and commission members appointed as follows:

1. A study designed to formulate the basic objectives of the Canadian Area Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches.

Members of the Commission: H.H. Dueck, chairman, Rudy Bartel, Isaac Block.

2. A study on conference leadership in the Canadian Mennonite Brethren Conference.

Members of the Commission: Herbert Brandt, chairman, Loyal Funk, Herman Driedger.

3. A study on the inter-conference structure and function within the Mennonite Brethren Churches of North America.

Members of the Commission: J.A. Toews, chairman, F.C. Peters, Edmund Janzen.

One unfinished item of business from last year's Convention was completed. It dealt with the question of the interest and support within the Mennonite Brethren constituency, especially in B.C., to relocate the Biblical Seminary to Vancouver. The appointed Commission presented its findings, which revealed very little support for such relocation. These findings were accepted by the Council of Boards with the following recommendation:

"The Commission recommends to the Canadian Conference Executive that the matter of the relocation of the Seminary be left to the Seminary Board charged with that assignment by the General Conference.

Further, it recommends that the commission be dissolved and that the Conference Executive report this action to the Canadian Conference Convention in July, 1977."

This recommendation was adopted at the Council of Boards meeting in January with a further accepted recommendation as follows:

"To authorize the Conference Executive Committee to transmit this information to the Seminary Board of the General

Conference."

The advisability of cancelling the mid-term meeting of the Council of Boards was also discussed. Each board was asked to register its feelings on the matter with the Conference Executive Committee to formulate and to present a recommendation to our next convention.

Upon motion, the report was adopted.

Then followed reports of the three commissions as follows:

i. Objectives of the Canadian Area Conference

H.H. Dueck, Chairman, presented his report.

Progress to Date

On behalf of the Commission, a letter was sent to 30 brethren in the Canadian Conference who were in positions of leadership in various boards, committees and churches, which outlines the nature of our assignment, as well as an invitation to share needs within the brotherhood. Only 5 responses were received, so that the information collected was not very representative. Maybe this indicates that we are not too sure of our needs, and thus would find it difficult to articulate anything on paper.

The questions we asked were twofold:

1. What would you consider to be the long range needs of the Canadian Conference?
2. What should be the objectives of the Conference to meet these needs?

Interim Findings

As a beginning, we agreed that the following should be included as needs to be met, in order of priority:

1. Unity. This will be fostered by
 - 1.1 keeping Christ central
 - 1.2 holding and teaching a high view of Scripture
 - 1.3 strengthening the evangelical voice within the Anabaptist family
 - 1.4 promoting loyalty to the brotherhood and its projects so that we would decrease a proliferation of our missionary and educational efforts.
2. Evangelism. This is seen to involve
 - 2.1 reaching our own
 - 2.2 reaching our community
 - 2.3 reaching out to the world with the Good News.

3. Instruction

As outlined in item 2.1, we have a continuing need to reach our own families, which implies a greater need to teach them. As pressures from interdenominational institutions and para-church agencies increase, we need

- 3.1 to strengthen the theological roots of our church members
- 3.2 to teach a clearer Scriptural understanding of our brotherhood on moral and ethical issues.

4. Stewardship of Resources

We need a re-evaluation of our emphasis on

- 4.1 the commitment of people for Christian service
- 4.2 pulpit supply in our churches; particularly smaller ones
- 4.3 use of our buildings (churches, institutions, etc.) and finances.

Recommendations

We recommend that the program planning for the 1978 Convention include:

- 1. That the Conference Executive Committee appoint a brother to prepare a study paper dealing with
 - 1.1 enunciation of the needs of our brotherhood
 - 1.2 presentation of specific objectives by which such needs could be met.

The members of the Study Commission could continue to act as resource persons.

- 2. That the presentation of this paper at the 1978 Convention be dealt with in a format employing workshops as at other study conferences.
- 3. That the Convention then draft an official statement which would outline:
 - 3.1 needs arising out of the discussions
 - 3.2 objectives to meet these needs, which would serve as guidelines for Conference boards in their projections of future programs.

Upon motion, the report and recommendations were accepted.

ii. Conference Leadership

Herbert Brandt, Chairman reported that only 3 replies had been received but that these could be used as resource material for a paper. The proposal is to continue the study by commissioning a paper to be presented at a future convention.

iii. Inter-Conference Structure

J. A. Toews, Chairman, reported that the study will now begin since the U.S. Area is ready for dialogue about this matter.

b. Future of Council of Boards

C. J. Rempel reported on the future of the present Council of Boards. The need for its existence was questioned. It was created when our business conventions were held every two years instead of every year as now is our custom. On the present basis, we are really vesting power for a six month period. The thought was expressed that we could decide not to meet during the year but leave our constitution unchanged. Following further clarification the following resolutions were presented:

Motion: "That the Council of Boards not meet between Conventions for the next two years unless the Executive of the Conference deems it necessary."

CARRIED

Motion: "That we encourage all Boards to conduct their business once a year."

CARRIED

Boards are asked to advise the Conference Executive as to their plans for any meeting.

c. Relocation of Seminary to Vancouver

Herbert Brandt, chairman of the findings committee, to study the interest of the Vancouver area to relocate the Seminary to that area reported finding little interest for such a re-location. The information was passed on to the Seminary Board and the committee has been dissolved.

Upon motion the report was accepted.

5. Nominating Committee

W. J. Schmidt, chairman, presented his report, as follows:

The result of our work will in part be evidenced as the Conference elects people to the various positions of service. It was our desire to select suitable candidates, keeping in mind needs, geography, age, etc. A considerable number of those contacted declined to stand. Since we could not meet, our preparations and decisions had to be made by mail. This made the approach somewhat unilateral and response difficult.

Nominating candidates is an important matter as those selected will have a far reaching influence on the direction of our Conference and the work to be done. Any suggestions as to how this could be improved would be welcome.

Upon motion the report was accepted.

The following recommendations were presented:

Motion A: "That the Secretary of our Conference or the Chairman of the Boards inform the Nominating Committee of the persons whose terms have expired as well as those who constitutionally cannot stand for re-election."

An amendment was proposed, as follows:

That the words "Chairmen of the Boards" be deleted.

CARRIED

Amended Motion: "That the Secretary of our Conference inform the Nominating Committee of the persons whose terms expired as well as those who constitutionally cannot stand for re-election."

CARRIED

Motion B: "That the Boards have the privilege of suggesting candidates for their respective

Boards."

CARRIED

Motion C: "That a greater effort be made to involve our junior talents."

Amendment: Two amendments were accepted to change the word "junior" to "younger" and to add the words "sisters of our conference".

Amended Motion: "That a greater effort be made to involve our younger talents and sisters of our Conference."

This motion was defeated

6. Board of Spiritual & Social Concerns

a. Report

Loyal Funk, chairman, presented his report.

Church Needs to Look Again at its Life

A large spectrum of responsibility is vested in the Board of Spiritual & Social Concerns. One specific area, that may well be the most vital in our brotherhood is expressed by the divinely inspired writer in Jude 3, "Beloved, while I was making every effort to write to you about our common salvation, I felt the necessity to write to you appealing that you contend earnestly for the faith which was once for all delivered to the saints."

Certainly, matters of "the faith" are foundational to any work assignments that come to this Board. The Board serves as a consultant body to other working Boards and Committees. It responds to requests from the various Provincial Conferences and specifically to requests from local churches who struggle with questions and challenges both in areas of doctrine and polity. The past year has been no exception to the mandate as spelled out in the conference constitution.

From last year's study sessions, a number of steps were taken to make lasting profitable results. Particularly the paper, "Anabaptists Four Centuries Later", gave occasion to a series of some fifteen brief papers by a number of conference leaders' which are appearing in the Herald from time to time at the discretion of our Moderator. These are drawing responses from our constituency and in fact are 'sharpening' our awareness of trends which need to be evaluated in the light of the Holy Scriptures.

Some of the work of the Board is necessarily behind the scenes because it deals with matters that are either local or provincial in nature. Much of this is interpretive and confidential in nature and thus the work might be likened to an iceberg where the bulk of the work and concern is not readily visible. Hopefully, the spiritual warmth of the response and the keenness of action is more like a Pacific breeze that cheers those who are influenced to godliness both in knowledge and action. The Board makes itself available for consultation and appreciates the intercessory support of our people and churches.

At this conference session, we have responded to an appeal from the Board of Evangelism to make provision for a position paper which is to deal with matters of evangelism and the winning of souls for Christ. The Board of Evangelism has drafted a paper which will reflect that Board's position and allow for study sessions in keeping with past precedent. It is hoped that a renewed vigor for soul-winning will result from this effort and the following interaction.

Various appeals have been made for re-evaluation of social concerns and behaviour which vitally affect our brotherhood. This includes projection to make provision for a study paper on the subject of the "Polity of the Mennonite Brethren Church".

There appears to be an increasing awareness among us that the prevalent concept of local autonomy may at times negate our concept of brotherhood, particularly in areas of social responsibility. This reflects itself in a stance of cooperation in areas in which we feel comfortable and in agreement and makes allowance to withdraw in areas where local or regional circumstances find points of tension of less than wholehearted agreement. Thus a local church or group may not identify with positions 'hammered out on the forge of brotherhood consensus' after prayer and Bible study. It is of course necessary that the brotherhood as a conference periodically restate or re-define applications of doctrinal and polity positions which may change in the passage of time and circumstance. Yet the timelessness of the Holy Scriptures is never negated even when it becomes necessary to study again or state again our understanding of what the Bible teaches. Special dependence upon the Holy Spirit our indwelling guide should be in our conscious mind and behaviour.

Requests have come to define or re-define conference positions with respect to our social interaction and behaviour in society. In some issues we refer to General Conference statements of faith and/or polity whereas in others we make assignments to brethren to come to grips with an issue to determine whether or not a re-statement is warranted and advisable. An illustration of this is the recurring question about whether individuals who have been divorced and remarried may serve in the office of minister or deacon. We have taken the position that our recent General Conference decisions are clear and recent enough not to warrant another study at this time.

An example where study and help is requested, on the other hand is the now increasing struggle in local churches with the issue of 'social drinking' which seems to be on the increase to the degree that it may be well for us to 'look again' at the position of 'total abstinence' which is our official stance. It seems that most of our struggles are in areas of application of the 'new life' and that we are not greatly at disagreement on primary doctrinal stands. It will not do for us to deny reality by closing our eyes to practices which become common even in the face of a conference position. Consequently the Board is always concerned that a true and proper Scriptural stance be maintained.

The Board is charged with 'pulpit committee' responsibilities which are sometimes difficult to exercise because of distance factors. Nonetheless, we stand ready to aid churches in any ways in which we can. We are grateful that an in-

creasing number of pastors are available to alleviate the shortage experienced till now. We would like to appeal for a united spirit of prayer to God for spiritual fervency, faithfulness to his Word and love for each other which is our most powerful testimony as a brotherhood. A summation in the words of the Elder John in I John reflects this truth: "Little children, let us not love with word or with tongue, but in deed and truth...."

Upon motion the report was accepted.

b. Recommendations

The following recommendations were presented:

i. Notice of Motion to change the constitution.

Upon the request of the Board of Higher Education, a provision is to be made to include the President of the Alumni Association of the Mennonite Brethren Bible College on the aforesaid Board. For this reason the following motion is presented.

Motion: "That the Board of Higher Education be constituted in the following manner:

- five members elected from the five provincial conferences
- five members elected at large
- the President of the College Alumni Association to represent that Association membership."

One less member-at-large will then be elected at the convention.

It is the intention to formalize the constitutional change for the 1978 Convention.

ii. Motion: "That we continue our membership in the Evangelical Fellowship of Canada."

Both motions were accepted.

Dave Warkentin, chairman, reviewed the prepared report.

Grateful for Bethesda Home

We praise God for blessing us another year at Bethesda Home, our care facility for the mentally retarded in Vineland, Ontario. It has been a year of settling into a changed program and new facilities.

The 120 residents are offered new activities from time to time to enable them to acquire new skills and increase meaning and enjoyment in life. For example, some are eager to attend classes where a trained teacher sees that primary reading and writing skills are learned. At other times craft skills such as those taught in the new pottery program challenge and thrill the hearts of the residents. Donations of necessary equipment by interested families helped to make this new program possible.

The new workshop is now almost completely equipped and in full use. The more spacious environment is a tremendous asset. Recreation is another important part of the resident's life. A full and varied program in the pool and gym and the outdoors involves all but those few who are completely bedridden. Some even enjoyed a camping out experience last summer.

Improvements in the lounge areas have helped to make life more home-like and beautiful. In fact, the staff are continuously striving to make life as natural as possible for our residents. The chapel services have been divided to more closely accommodate the interest levels. Evening devotions add to the spiritual influence and religious experience.

Bethesda has many grateful and interested families whose relatives are residents. They provide moral support, and often respond in practical ways in the form of specially designated donations, used to enrich the life of their loved ones. We are always concerned about our responsibilities in providing a home for these loved ones in a manner that is agreeable to the families. Special efforts to keep them informed and involved are made on an individual and group basis as the needs arise.

Training programs for staff have also been a prominent aspect of the activities at Bethesda this year. Other similar facilities have often been visited by various personnel. All these efforts by staff for self-improvement help provide new challenges and new insights for an improved performance. In the end it means a better life for the residents. "Given a loving and stimulating environment, mentally retarded people are capable of accomplishing much more than was once believed possible. In fact, many can become self-sufficient," or at least able to function again in a less sheltered situation.

The facilities are in good condition and quite adequate now, with the new kitchen, new dining rooms, some new offices and new workshop, all in full use. The Department of Community and Social Services of the Ontario Government funds all operating expenses, replacement of equipment, and a good portion of the cost of new equipment. They are most accomo-

dating and helpful.

Conference Property

During the past year the Conference office/Christian Press building has received a face-lift. The new front and sign have decidedly improved the appearance of the building exterior. Some interior renovations, including improved air circulation and conditioning, have made the interior more functional and pleasant.

Salaries

Salaries for Conference personnel have been kept to the recommended increase under the federal Anti Inflation Board guidelines.

Finances

At the time of this writing all boards were keeping well within their respective budgets. As usual, churches are behind in forwarding their funds to the Conference treasurer. This habit necessitates short term loans and interest expenses. It would be helpful if we could train ourselves to be prompt as individuals and churches in giving responsibly, i.e. sufficiently and on time - the mark of good stewards.

After a discussion the report was accepted.

b. Financial Report

The report was presented by J. J. Riediger, Treasurer, See report, pages 17-57.

A discussion period followed, where many questions were asked and clarified.

Upon motion the report was accepted.

c. Elections

The Board made a request that the elections be carried out at this session. Three persons are to be elected to this Board.

Method of Contribution by Provincial Conferences

1. All funds for the Canadian Conference budget are forwarded through the provincial treasurer.
 2. Alberta, Ontario and Saskatchewan treat the Canadian Conference budget contributions as designated funds. The funds are forwarded as received on a monthly basis. They include Conference assessment, Conference Sunday, Easter Sunday, College and special collections. Saskatchewan at its 1977 Convention agreed to assume total liability for the Canadian Conference norm.
 3. Manitoba Conference incorporates the Canadian Conference budget as an addition to its provincial budgets and assumes full liability for it. The special collections of the Conference budget are treated as designated funds and are forwarded as received.
 4. The B.C. Conference has varied their approach to the Canadian Conference on various occasions. Up to 1970 all assessments were paid out of the Conference treasury and all special collections were treated as designated funds and forwarded.
- 1970-71 a different approach was taken. The Conference assessment and all special collections were incorporated into the B.C. Conference budget and fund disbursements were made to all B.C. Conference Boards and the Canadian Conference assessment, and special collections are disbursed on the basis of % of income. This principle was adopted for a number of years. Then it was changed to exclude the College special collection item from the over-all budget which was treated as a designated fund from the churches. A year later all special collections were eliminated from the total B.C. Conference budget and funds coming in were treated as designated funds. At present the Canadian Conference assessment account is still included in the B.C. Conference budget and paid out according to the % revenue received on the accepted budget.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
May 31, 1977

1. To assist its membership to more readily determine the financial position of the Conference, it has changed its method of Balance Sheet presentation for this and future years. In the past it was the practise to segregate the assets and liabilities of the Revenue Fund and Capital and Loan Fund. This method of presentation was found to be cumbersome and without meaning to the average reader of the financial statements. The accompanying combined balance sheet consolidates the assets and liabilities of both funds, segregating only the surplus accounts.

Song Service

Henry Peters led the congregation in the singing of "O For a Thousand Tongues to Sing" and "Only Thee".

Opening

F. C. Peters welcomed the delegates and guests and made a few appropriate philosophical remarks about the behaviour of Christians and led them in prayer.

1. Special Message

"Manifests for Discipleship" by Myron Augsburger.

As a basis for his remarks he read Luke 9:23 and Luke 14:25-35. He said discipleship means:

- a. To study and use the Bible daily, coming to it with my mind made up to obey it.
- b. To seek, above everything else, the will of Christ and to act in faith.
- c. To honestly face my problems and accept my responsibility for them and seek Christian victory in all of life.
- d. To live by love and non-violence, promoting the way of peace.
- e. To establish priorities for personal behaviour which authenticate my profession of relation to Christ.
- f. To place the advancement of the Kingdom ahead of everything material, social, political and personal in the practice of stewardship.
- g. To actively witness to others among whom I move in daily life, in a manner which respects their personality.

F. C. Peters appropriately thanked Myron Augsburger for his meaningful service to the Conference.

Special Music

Margaret Boldt and Anne Dick played a violin duet.

9. Fraternal Delegates and Guests (cont'd)

Edmund Janzen, Moderator of the U.S.A. Conference greeted the delegates and visitors with Phil. 1:9-11. He referred to the basic issues facing their Convention.

10. Minutes

The secretary referred to the minutes recorded for the Saturday evening, Sunday morning and Sunday vesper service, which were not read since they do not contain items of business. John Wittenberg, Assistant Secretary, then read the minutes of the Saturday afternoon business session. After some corrections were made, the minutes were adopted.

8. Board of Management (cont'd from Saturday afternoon)

d. Budget

The preliminary budget was presented for information only. Additional budgetary items were presented for acceptance.

Motion: "To accept the budget of the Board of Management, the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns, the Capital Expenditures and the General Conference."

Upon motion this was approved.

e. Bethesda

The chairman, D. E. Warkentin, presented a report dealing with the possibility of a change of the status of Bethesda, to a non-profit Ontario-based institution

Report

The Canadian Conference first accepted responsibility for Bethesda in recognition of a need to provide a service to our national constituency. Changing needs, alternate facilities and governmental involvement have resulted in Bethesda presently serving a very local area. Moreover, the type of care provided has also changed drastically. The institution now serves adult retardates and is fully funded for its operations by the Ontario Government. (At a current annual level of about \$2 million)

Recent changes in program and in government departmental responsibility have resulted in funding changes as well. A long standing arrangement by which we received about \$30,000 annually is now being terminated. We had looked to this item to fund our share of capital projects so that Bethesda would not become a budget item for the Conference. A special committee of the Board of Management has been negotiating with the Ontario Government in this respect. While no specific resolution can yet be reported, several possibilities are under discussion. We stress that all of these remain purely speculative at present.

One of these is of special interest to our Board, however. It would provide a cash settlement in consideration of transfer of the Bethesda assets to a separate non-profit corporation which would have a local Ontario M.B. Board. It has been our consensus that a local body could best operate Bethesda and this now appears consistent with the views of the ministry. Bethesda would in all events continue as a Mennonite Brethren institution in its principles, emphasis, and ownership.

This is no more than one of several possibilities, and negotiations may take quite a different turn. Yet the ministry is interested to know now if this possibility should be pursued in detail by them and hence we seek your reaction. We will probably need to reach some resolution before the next annual convention and we therefore propose that the Conference resolve as the motion below reads.

Several questions and concerns were raised. Concerns were also expressed about the transfer of assets which really belong to the Canadian Conference. The following recommendation was made:

Motion: "That the Board of Management be authorized, if it deems fit, to incorporate a non-profit, Ontario based corporation and to transfer to that corporation such assets of Bethesda as it considers necessary, with the possibility that ownership or operation of this proposed corporation ultimately rest in the Ontario M.B. Conference, if that can be negotiated."

Upon motion this recommendation was accepted.

13. Board of Christian Education

a. Report

The chairman, Henry Petkau, introduced the Board members and referred to the report.

Board Looks For Stronger Youth Ministries

Christian Education seeks to present the Gospel through a variety of church related programs for the purpose of communicating the truths of Scripture so that individuals may come to know Jesus Christ in a personal way and grow toward spiritual maturity.

The Board of Christian Education is concerned that church educational programs continue to honour Christ's command in Matthew 28 to "Go and teach all nations...teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you." The church must continue to provide evangelistic outreach and "teach and preach Jesus Christ" (Acts 5:42).

A complete Program of Christian education will serve to strengthen believers through opportunities for growth through varied means on the level of the child, youth and adult. Christian education also has a vital role in the development of Christian discipleship; in building the church and its leadership; and in providing Christian nurture so that believers might more fully understand the basic aspects of their own church and have an intelligent concept of why they are Christians.

To enable the Board to stay in touch with the most recent developments in Christian education, the July board sessions each year include a time for study. At the 1977 board meetings two publications will be reviewed. Mennonite Education: Why and How? by Daniel Hertzler presents a philosophy of education for the Mennonite Church, while a second book, Reshaping the Teaching Ministry by Paul M. Lederach, is an analysis of the educational program in our churches.

Congregational Resource Centre

As a Board, and on behalf of the Conference, we want to acknowledge the work of John Unger, the executive secretary. His tireless efforts and energies have found him in many churches across all provinces over the past year.

During the past fiscal year John served the congregations with 57 messages, 82 workshops and participated in six panel discussions. He participated in Board sessions of provincial conferences in B.C., Alberta, Manitoba, and Ontario, as well as the national sessions in St. Catharines, Winnipeg, and Calgary. The office workload still includes considerable responsibility in the area of editorial work for the Sunday School Adult Quarterly and the Lektionsheft.

We are happy to report that Dennis Becker has been appointed to the office of executive secretary for the United States Conference. This provides for a shared responsibility in publishing the Youth Worker and the Calendar of Activities, etc. It should be noted, however, that while working together with the United States Conference provides a beneficial liaison, and removes some individual responsibility from the office of the Canadian executive secretary, it has not lessened the workload significantly, since consultation and reviewing the combined efforts is still required to keep the material relevant and meaningful. Publications are needed in a variety of educational services; e.g. ushers, librarians, leadership training, media, etc. Tools for analysis and implementation to aid church workers are in continued demand.

It has been brought to the attention of the Board, that not all Christian education workers in the churches are aware of the resource center in Winnipeg. Materials and aids for Sunday school, youth, mid-week clubs and music activities are available upon request. There is no charge for a variety of cassette tapes, source books, curriculum guides and other helps. The material may be ordered for a three week period.

With the growing libraries in most of our churches, librarians and interested readers may request book reviews, another service provided by the Winnipeg office through the Provident Bookfinder, to which the Board subscribes.

The liaison developed between Canadian and provincial boards, especially as it relates to an exchange of board minutes, a joint sharing of provincial and national concerns, the planning of workshops, special seminars, and conferences, has proven most productive. The office of the executive secretary will continue in this direction as time permits.

National Convention

During the week-end of October 15-17, 1976, the three St. Catharines Mennonite Brethren churches hosted the National Christian Education Convention in Ontario. The convention was attended by over 700 delegates, with 150 coming from the western provinces. The major sessions along with the exhibits were held in the Scott Street Church, with workshops and meals available in all three churches. Following the convention 100 evaluation forms were sent out for response from delegates. Of the 73 percent returned, 51 percent felt that the convention was excellent with 22 percent evaluating the sessions as good and none considering the convention only

fair. Dr. Kenneth O. Gangel's presentations and the congregational singing received the most positive feedback.

Banff '77

On December 29, 1977, some 660 young people, 60 advisors, and approximately 30 workshop leaders will gather at the School of Fine Arts in Banff, Alberta for Banff '77, the three-day Mennonite Brethren National Youth Rally.

The Banff '77 convention will provide special music, provincial features, Christian dramas and inspirational messages by Edmund Janzen, president of Pacific College, at each of the general sessions, with workshops (20 options for each session) and recreational activities to be included as part of the total program package. The Youth Rally will conclude with a Sunday morning, New Years Day service on January 1, 1978.

A travel equalization plan has been established to offer financial assistance for those coming from more distant parts of Canada. The proceeds from this levy will make up a "travel pool" toward which different groups may contribute to assist needy individuals with a travel grant.

The Board of Missions and Services is providing a suggested youth project as a special effort to express our gratitude to God in a service through financial support. More detailed information will be forthcoming.

We invite your prayer support for the Banff '77 National Youth Rally and all the participants.

An Associate Executive Secretary

At the Canadian Conference in Winnipeg last July the following motion was accepted:

"That the Board of Christian Education be encouraged to appoint an associate executive secretary if a suitable person can be found. If satisfactory alternative arrangements cannot be made, the Board of Christian Education should report to either the Council of Boards or the conference in session before any appointment is made." (Canadian Conference Yearbook, 1976, pp.98-99)

Following the conference the Board has actively pursued a careful examination of possible alternatives to the appointment of an associate executive secretary.

The Board has been aware for some time that the executive secretary has been carrying an extremely heavy workload. (Appeared on the January, 1972 Board of Christian Education agenda and minutes.) Instead of discontinuing a number of aspects of Christian education for which the executive secretary is responsible, the Board feels strongly that as a conference we should continue to strive as much as possible to promote growth of our Christian education ministries.

Based on the findings of the study, the Board of Christian Education reported to the Council of Boards meeting at Calgary in January that a committee had been appointed to search for an associate executive secretary. The search committee has contacted a possible candidate for the position and carried out an interview. The candidate has expressed positive interest in the assignment and a willingness to consider this ministry pending conference approval. The Board

is most confident that the candidate will meet the requirements of the office of associate executive secretary.

As a Board we are concerned that the Christian education programs in our churches continue to focus on reaching individuals with the Gospel and guiding them into Christian living, involving children, youth, and adults.

The theology of our Christian education programs must be in keeping with the theology of the pulpit, and the aims of these programs must relate to salvation, Christian growth, and Christian service.

Help us pray that these objectives may be realized.

Upon motion this report was adopted.

During the discussion, regret was expressed that attendance at our Youth Conventions is limited.

b. Recommendations

The following recommendations were made:

Motion 1: "That the Canadian Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches ratify the appointment of Br. Ron Penner as the Associate Executive Secretary of Christian Education."

During the discussion a thought was expressed that we need more local participation in church programs. The appointment of an Assistant Executive Secretary was thought to be precedent-setting and should be re-considered.

Motion: "That the motion of last year, recommending the appointment of an assistant executive secretary be rescinded."

A discussion followed during which this motion was questioned from the standpoint of what it would do to boards which plan in accordance with recommendations and mandates given to them at previous Conventions. A motion was made -

Motion: "That we vote by ballot."

This motion was carried

The voting by ballot was then carried out, resulting in the following:

To rescind	143
Not to rescind	253

By this vote, the Convention must return to and deal with Motion 1, which will take place during the afternoon session.

Motion 2: "That the Canadian Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches become cooperating users of the Foundation Series Curricula for Youth and Adult."

A discussion followed during which concern was expressed that a commitment would be tantamount to the endorsement of a product which has not yet been produced. Favour for this recommendation was also expressed, based upon material already available, and now being written, and the discussions and

consultations which have taken place.

This motion was accepted by a majority vote.

9. Fraternal Delegates and Guests (cont'd)

Charles Seidenspinner, Chairman of the Evangelical Fellowship of Canada, was asked to bring fraternal greetings. He spoke of the blessings received during his presence at this Convention and our efforts to build bridges. He also referred to the aims and activities of the Evangelical Fellowship of Canada.

15. Board of Publications

a. Report

H. H. Voth brought the report.

A Year of Milestones

In ancient times the wise preacher said, "of making many books there is no end...." If we take the term "making many books" in its broadest meaning, the resources under the supervision of the Board of Publication have contributed their part to this on going production. Much good and helpful material has been written, printed and published in this past year. We are grateful for the opportunity to report on our part of this work.

The Christian Press

Very important to the work of "making books" is the press, and we have a press that has served us well. We are fortunate to have a manager who has a vision for service to the brotherhood. In his first year in office, Victor Schmidt reports: I must say that a few things are beginning to fall

into place...I am beginning...to understand the significance that a publishing and printing facility like ours (has for) our brotherhood in that it knits us more closely together in various endeavours.... We exist initially to serve our brotherhood.

Our print shop is now reasonably well equipped, greatly improved by the addition of new equipment in the recent past. Optimum use of staff in a small shop such as ours where changing technology constantly calls for new skills continues to present a challenge. We feel that the manager has been able to rearrange assignments with a minimum of dislocation.

The Christian Press derives its revenue from two sources: the one, the printing of the two Conference publications, the other, "job printing". The first is a fairly constant quantity; it is the latter which can be helped to grow. Despite the fact that the Winnipeg printing industry has proved to be in depressed state (several of the major printing firms here were on a three-day week) and that we were for a good part of the past year without a manager, and in spite of the fact that our expenses increased by 22% to our \$378,000 we will be able to finish the year with a modest profit. We are optimistic that next year the job printing work will increase.

Book publication continues to be an important aspect of the work at the Christian Press. At present work has been begun on the 1,000-page translation of the P.M. Friesen book, Die Alt-Evangelische Mennonitische Bruderschaft in Russland, a project which is receiving much emphasis and care; it must be well done. Several other books are either in the planning stage or also being worked on. A serious attempt has been made to move books that have been printed in the past and of which considerable stock was in storage. For the most part these were not the responsibility of Christian Press but of the persons or Committees that had them printed.

We are grateful to God for the staff working at Christian Press. The manager reports that staff relations are good and that he expects a new wage settlement to be reached in the month of June.

Mennonitische Rundschau, 100 Years Old

Erich Ratzlaff, our editor, reports that the abundant grace of God has permitted him to complete his 10th year of work on the paper. The MR itself has begun its 100th year of publication. From its early beginning as the Nebraska Ansiedler it has appeared continuously during the past 100 years. As a Conference we would like to pause and give thanks to God at this convention for this achievement. A special centennial issue of the MR has been printed which traces the history of its publication from early beginning to the present, together with sample excerpt from earlier editions.

Circulation at present still stands at the 5,000 mark of which 3,800 go to Canadian addresses. The other 1,000 go to readers in South America, Europe and the U.S.A. Through natural attrition the number of readers, in the past 10 years, has dropped by about 1,500. Brother Ratzlaff is grateful for the competent assistance he received from his secretary, Miss Lilly Kliewer, and for the good working relationship he enjoys with the press and the M.B. Herald.

Continuing problems with the post office seem to plague the distribution of the MR, but attempts are made to resolve these as they arise.

Mennonite Brethren Herald

In his report to the Board, the editor reviews the role which the M.B. Herald fills in the brotherhood. In part, this is what he says: We'd like to think that in its 16th year the Herald is not merely growing up, but already well-accepted as an integral member of the Mennonite Brethren family, even if it occasionally finds itself in tension with some other members of that family.

I would like to answer three questions that we are sometimes asked or that are implied in statements to us by our churches.

Why do we need a conference paper?

We need a church paper to keep us in touch with one another. We can't foster unity when we are without information about our churches, the programs of our conference boards, the work of our leaders, or the happenings within our families. We need a constant flow of information, and the Herald provides it 26 times a year.

We need a way of communicating a vision, of building support and providing inspiration. Many times our conference moderator, our Missions/Services secretaries, or the individuals within many of our churches have used the pages of the Herald to inspire and encourage us in the Lord's work.

The Herald is one of our most effective teaching tools. Articles, columns, editorials, even new features, give us new ideas and help us to grow in our understanding. Nearly ten thousand copies go out every second week during the winter months - potentially reaching 25,000 readers - providing us as a conference with a most significant teaching tool.

The Herald also gives us the opportunity to talk (back) to one another. We feel that one of the greatest strengths of a good publication is the chance it gives to many people to challenge someone else's statements, to set forth a better position, or simply to affirm a view with more good comment. We have been blessed with many letter writers. They are a credit to the brotherhood.

A conference paper is in some ways the face of the conference. It mirrors the life and striving of a people of God. It measures the creative impulses which exist within these people and gives them an outlet.

Nevertheless, the question must be answered, is what we have worthy of our support?

We think it is and these are some of the reasons: We have a healthy circulation. Now in the vicinity of 9,400 and close to ten thousand during the winter months (when we add many student subscriptions), we have one of the largest circulations among evangelical denominations in Canada.

We believe our mode of circulation is also a good one. Every member family who wish an English-language periodical, receive the Herald. (Those who prefer a German-language

paper receive the Mennonitische Rundschau.) The result is that this link gets into a very high percentage of our homes every two weeks, an important reason for feeling close to one another.

We have an involved readership. We possess our own publishing house. Over the years we have built up a very health reservoir of good writers, and nearly every issue we introduce a new one. Some of our columnists are among the most respected within the entire Mennonite brotherhood.

We are respected for what we are doing. The Herald is read by a substantial number of church leaders, newspapers and magazines outside the Mennonite Brethren conference, where it is respected and noted for its liveliness and reportage. Our articles are quite frequently reprinted in other publications.

Is the Herald worth the investment we as a brotherhood make in it? We hope our answer continues to be yes.

What are we trying to accomplish?

That question could have many answers. We would like to aid our growth as Christians. Christians are to enter into this world with a message of healing and redemption. We would like to help them grow as disciples.

We would like to communicate that the gospel is truly good news. The Bible has a liberating, radically new message for a jaded, self-seeking world. We would like to be part of that telling.

We would like to strengthen our commitment to work with one another. What is a conference of churches? It is a gathering of churches who share a common history, love a common Lord, make a common confession, and have committed themselves to a common task. We want to strengthen our commitment to one another.

We believe that it is no liability to be known as Mennonite Brethren (when all the facts are in). We believe, moreover, that God has given us marvellous tools for our common task. We have a strong missions program, providing us with opportunities to plant churches in more than a dozen countries. We are related to a relief and development program which is known around the world and has probably been as much of a credit to the church of Jesus Christ as any other single effort of the evangelical movement in North America. We participate in schools which taught 1,850 Canadian young people last year, about 1,200 of them from our own churches. We have a generous constituency, which gave between \$7-8 million dollars through our Canadian churches to all causes last year. We have a corps of committed church workers serving across this country and a large supply of highly motivated young people coming from our schools who want to join us in some witness and service assignment. Above all, we have a great God, who allows us to join him in his mission to this world. I think many of us don't realize all we have going for us. We would like to strengthen our commitment to walk together into the open door the Lord has set before us.

Fellowship Books

Our common venture with the Conference of Mennonites has

continued another year of operation, specializing in such things as conference publications, Anabaptist and educational materials. In spite of the fact that we again have had to look for a manager (we hope to announce the appointment of a manager at the July convention) the store has been kept successfully in operation by the members of the committee of supervision.

We are grateful to God for the resources we have. God has blessed and made them fruitful in this past year. We also know that there is room for improvement. To achieve that improvement, we ask for you to pray and work with us.

The chairman called on several people to address the delegates as follows:

i. Erich Ratzlaff

Bro. Ratzlaff stressed his pleasure in the continuing large readership of Die Rundschau and his gratitude to those who provide regular correspondence. I Samuel 7:12 was the Scripture on which Ratzlaff based his comments. The 100th year of publication does, indeed, mark a milestone. 100 years remind us of fleeting time and of our own lack of power. He quoted, "We are editors by the grace of God." Special mention was made of the value of the paper for the "Ansiedler" in Germany. "Ebenezer" is a challenge to salvation, dedication, and hope. To God be the Glory.

ii. Harold Jantz

Harold Jantz referred to essays in the Herald and Christian Leader regarding the Articles of Faith written by M.B. Leaders. Then he mentioned the growing acceptance of the Herald in publishing circles. He encouraged delegates to buy a copy for the local papers and for any guests in local congregations.

iii. Neil Fast

Neil Fast expressed much pleasure in introducing Victor Schmidt, the manager of The Christian Press to the Convention.

iv. Victor Schmidt

Victor Schmidt appealed to the convention to make use of the Christian Press facilities. He called on J.B. Toews to speak about the publishing of P.M. Friesen's book in the English Translation.

v. J. B. Toews

J. B. Toews described the importance of the book, "The Evangelical Mennonite Brotherhood in Russia" for our whole Mennonite constituency and for historians in general. The book is described as the best and most authentic historical document about that time and culture.

vi. Neil Fast

Neil Fast discussed the financial report.

Upon motion all reports were accepted.

b. Recommendation

Recommendation regarding periodicals The Mennonite Brethren Herald and the Mennonitische Rundschau.

16. Board of Evangelism

a. Report

Rudy Bartel read the report

A Wide Door for Evangelism

In I Corinthians 16:9 Paul says, "...there is a wide open door for me to preach and teach here. So much is happening, but there are many enemies."

During the conference year 1976-1977 our vision for the great open door for evangelism before us has been enlarged. Many good things have happened in our churches. In spite of adversities, the Lord has granted many victories for which we praise and honour him.

Some objectives of the Board of Evangelism during this year were: to keep the burden of evangelism vitally alive in our conference, to help clarify our understanding of the biblical concept of evangelism, to provide opportunities to discuss the practical implications of various methods of evangelism, to reach out in a church planting ministry in areas of need and to utilize the various avenues of media in propagating the Gospel and establishing churches.

Ministries in Evangelism

We are grateful to God for persons who have been converted and added to our churches through evangelism. We realize, however, that the task is far from finished.

Over the years our churches have used a variety of methods to reach people with the Gospel. This past year crusades, with various evangelists, were held in a number of churches

across Canada. Seminars on evangelism were conducted to help churches reach out in their respective communities. The Deeper Life Conference encouraged and fostered spiritual growth in the lives of Christians. All the pastors received the book, How to Have a Soul Winning Church, by Gene Edwards, as well as study papers on "Conversion" by Billy Graham and John H. Neufeld.

A questionnaire, studying what is happening in evangelism outreach in our churches, was sent to all pastors. About 50 percent of the pastors responded. It is interesting to note that the Bible teaching and preaching ministry is still being used by the Lord to bring about conversions that lead to active church membership.

At the January Council of Boards sessions, our Board expressed the need to employ a second man to serve as Minister of Renewal and Radio with responsibilities in evangelistic crusades, evangelism seminars, family life seminars and the production of a 15-minutes English radio program. Approximately 10 percent of our church members have received some training in lay evangelism through Campus Crusade, the Kennedy plan, Billy Graham, etc. The Minister of Renewal could assist local churches in providing some basic motivational principles on how these methods can be applied.

An area that needs study is that of planting churches in mushrooming city suburbs. Our Board desires to give leadership in developing a strategy to plant churches in growing cities. To begin dealing effectively with this question we will need to unite with our provincial forces.

The next decade will be a crucial one for us as Mennonite Brethren. Will we be assimilated into the cultural milieu of the city, or will our biblical distinctiveness and evangelistic fervor survive, enabling us to reach multitudes in these exploding areas?

Ministries in the Media

In Media we have been active in a number of areas. We have attempted to test the Canadian television market with two half-hour "Louis Paul Lehman" programs. These attempts proved unsuccessful, largely because the programs are produced in the United States. We were not able to place the programs on a trial basis. The quota of U.S. produced programs allowed to Canadian TV stations is already filled, with a long waiting list.

The 15-minute radio programs being prepared for auditioning purposes are still in the planning stages. Further discussions and decisions will be pursued during the July Board meetings. More work will be done to determine more precisely the need for such a program. A Canada-wide German radio program has been suggested and the Board will be discussing a proposal in this regard.

A half-hour television youth program is also being considered. A preliminary script and a comprehensive analysis of that script are being studied. The children's television program prepared by Mennonite Brethren Communications of Manitoba, called "Third Story", is now scheduled for fall release in Saskatchewan and will be marketed across Canada. The series is now running for the second time in Manitoba.

Initial responses to the thirteen half-hour programs have been requests for 75 follow-up booklets, which were sent out.

Canada Inland Mission

In reviewing our work in Quebec and Nova Scotia, we observe that a powerful moving of God's Spirit continues to be evident. In the French churches conversions are being reported almost weekly. Several baptisms have been held. Believers are being added to the churches. Men, women, and young people are eager to study God's Word together, and to pray for unbelieving family members and friends.

We praise God that he is satisfying their spiritual hunger, and that he is answering their earnest prayers. May we learn to share that burden of prayer in a greater measure.

With interest and gratitude we have seen the Lord raise up the Bible Institute at Ste. Rose in the past year. The French believers join the Board in saying, "Thank you," to the Conference that the Ste. Rose church building is completely paid for.

The school, now officially named Institut Biblique Lavel, has successfully completed its first year of teaching. There were seven students enrolled for full time studies and between thirty and forty involved in evening courses. On staff were Ernest Dyck, president and main teacher; Herb Wiens, studying the French language this year and already involved in the music program and in Christian service; and Martha Wall, secretary-librarian. Several visiting lecturers also gave specific courses.

Four men who have grown up in our French churches are presently providing pastoral leadership in the churches: David Franco at St. Jerome; Jean Theoret at Ste. Therese; Pierre Wingender at St. Laurent; and Robert Dagenais at St. Eustache.

The St. Eustache church was organized in January of this year. Regular Bible studies are being conducted at several other places, including the Ste. Rose church building and at St. Donant, just north of Ste. Agathe. People have been converted at St. Donant and need basic Bible instruction. Twenty to thirty people meet with David Franco in St. Donant every week.

Due to a seeming lack of response in the Ste. Agathe region, our Board has discontinued involvement in the work there. The Danny Wolfes are, however, carrying on under the sponsorship of another group. May the Lord yet raise up a strong work there.

Gradual but definite progress is being made toward the French churches becoming self-governing and self-supporting. Representatives from the churches are beginning to discuss more of the issues and to make more decisions.

At Waterloo, in south-eastern Quebec, the English speaking congregation has seen positive growth under the dedicated leadership of the George Wiens family. Sunday school attendance for last year averaged fifty-nine. Up to eighty people have attended worship services. Giving has also increased. The Sunday services have been held in a local school with mid-week meetings in the Wiens' home.

In view of the fact that the Lord has greatly blessed the ministry of the Wiens family during the two years they ministered at Waterloo, we regret to announce their resignation from this work. The future leadership in this congregation needs to be carefully considered.

Further to the east in Quebec City, some initial contacts have been made with a group of French Canadian believers who are looking for assistance, not in finances but in a Bible teaching and pastoral ministry. Two students from this group came to our Bible Institute this year. Wisdom will be required to follow up these first contacts.

The work in Dartmouth, Nova Scotia has been blessed of the Lord. People have been added to the church and new visitors are coming to the church frequently. Hartley Smith's warm and enthusiastic leadership has helped to draw many people into the church. Financially, only a small portion of the budgeted subsidy from the conference has been required by the church. The work has not been without its difficulties, but the Lord has given victories, for which we praise him. We want to keep on praying for this work and the leadership there.

We praise God for the moving of his Spirit in Quebec and Nova Scotia. We thank you, our churches across Canada, for your keen interest and generous support. We ask you to continue to pray for the churches, pray for the workers, and pray for a continuing spirit of renewal across Canada.

Victory Fellowship in Waterloo, Quebec

The city of Waterloo, Quebec, offers great opportunities for missionary outreach. The Victory Fellowship Church of Waterloo, the only English Mennonite Brethren Church in this province, is located 60 miles south-east of Montreal. Although the population of Waterloo itself is between 5,000 and 6,000, Christians from towns within a twenty mile radius enjoy fellowship here. Waterloo is approximately 20 percent English while Knowlton, some 10 miles away is approximately 60 percent English. Cowansville, Foster and South Stukely and Bondville are also served by this church.

The church began as an outgrowth of a Canadian Sunday School Mission Sunday school. The group that gathered weekly took on organizational status as a church in December of 1975 under the leadership of George Wiens. It now has 14 members and 7 associate members, while Sunday School and worship service attendance on Sunday mornings ranges from 50 to 80.

This young church has been meeting in the elementary school and has found the facilities quite adequate. Meetings held during the week have been held in the Wiens' home. Many opportunities have presented themselves for visitation in the homes, hospitals and senior citizen homes.

Much wisdom is needed in leading this young congregation which is eager to grow in Christ and also in number. The church invites you to join them in prayer that God may use them to glorify his name and to draw many souls unto himself and to the church.

Br. Bartel expanded on the report by adding:

i. The St Eustache Church has been organized. A letter to that effect is with the conference secretary.

- ii. A Quebec provincial conference is being organized.
- iii. Two years ago the Dartmouth Church building was purchased. Since that time there has been considerable numerical and financial growth. (13-43 baptized members). Dartmouth is now almost financially self-supporting.
- iv. The Laval Bible Institute at Ste. Rose will be strengthened by the addition of Bro. Ben Klassn to the teaching staff.
- v. The Board of Christian Education and Evangelism have a constitutional mandate to enter TV ministries and have planned a ½ hour documentary film on Banff '77. Appropriate financial arrangements have been made in the budgets of both boards. Henry Brucks gave the reasons for this venture. The hope is that those who cannot come to Banff '77 may receive some inspiration from the film. It will be so prepared that it may be used for many other inspirational purposes.
- vi. A year ago there was considerable discussion about the formation of a Mass Media Board in the Canadian Conference. This was given further study. Because certain provinces have strong programs going it appeared somewhat superfluous to establish a Canadian Board at this time. In the meantime, our board, with a mandate in this area, has proceeded as referred to in item #5 and in the report in the Herald insert.
- vii. We continue to need the prayerful support of our brotherhood. Your counsel is also appreciated. We wish to continue to work together.

Rudy Bartel was assisted by Henry Brucks who enlarged on the topic of church growth and church planting. Churches are to be commended and encouraged in their efforts in evangelism. Ernie Dyck reported on Laval Bible Institute and the Quebec church work. II Tim. 2:2 was the basis of his remarks. Evangelism is increasing and active evangelism is being practiced. A two year Bible school course is being planned. Workers are Ernie Dyck, Herb Wiens, Ben Klassn, Ben Heppner, and other visiting teachers. The aim is a discipleship school. Martha Wall is secretary.

17. Special Music

Henry Peters sang "In the Image of God" accompanied by Frieda Wiebe.

16. Board of Evangelism (cont'd)

Hartley Smith reported about the work in Dartmouth. The work has brought men and women together to worship the Lord. An Easter drama was very successful. He introduced Mike Shreve and Ernest Hochhalter. Hochhalter spoke of the growth and work of the Dartmouth membership.

Words of encouragement were given to the board to continue developing an awareness in our churches of church growth. The board also has the mandate to stimulate church growth within the local churches. The university work and Christian service work is also an area in which this board can work. He encouraged us to make a real effort to evangelize personally those whom we live among.

Upon motion all reports were accepted.

b. Recommendations

Motion: "That the Conference ratify the Board's plans to film Banff '77 Youth Retreat for future use in our churches and for possible television release."

9. Fraternal Delegates and Guests (cont'd)

Daniel Wirsche serving in Uruguay conveyed greetings from the brethren with Psalm 125:1. He challenged the convention to continue to evangelize. He especially mentioned the work of the churches in Culloden and Vancouver for providing a series of Christian films.

18. M.B. Seminary Report

John Redekop, vice-chairman of the Seminary Board presented the report.

He reported on recent developments at the Seminary, especially concerning accreditation, constituency support and a general spirit of optimism. He then called on several brethren to bring reports.

After introducing the Board members: H. H. Voth, Len Siemens, Herb Neufeld and Henry Block, he called on several people to address the delegates:

a. Gary Ediger, a student reported on student life and reminded us that students need encouragement from the home congregations. He expressed gratitude for all the contributions made by the Canadian churches. He defined five reasons for his choice to attend the Mennonite Brethren Biblical Seminary.

- i. To study the Anabaptist position from the Mennonite viewpoint.
- ii. Small class sizes.
- iii. Emphasis on practical studies.
- iv. The strong tie with the churches.
- v. Biblical approach.

He appealed for prayer as the students battle with the many changes and challenges.

b. H. H. Dueck reported that his work will be to fill a position in administration.

- i. Administrative affairs.
- ii. Registrar and student services.
- iii. Constituency relations.

He appealed for prayer support.

c. J. B. Toews presented greetings from Elmer Martens, President elect of the Seminary, and George Konrad, acting President. He reported that the library at the seminary is urgently in need of upgrading. Then he discussed the need for prayer to win the spiritual struggles on the campus. He was deeply appreciative of the quality of students the Canadian constituency sends to the Seminary. The Seminary is becoming known to other denominations and these are giving it a very high recommendation. The faculty asks for earnest prayer for the carrying of the responsibility as they give direction to the prospective leaders of our churches.

John Redekop concluded the report by expressing the gratitude of the Board for the fact that a capable President has been found and that the student body is excellent.

19. Mennonite Central Committee

a. Report

The report was read by Hugo Jantz.

MCC (Canada) Report to Conferences Summer 1977

The following brings up to date the information found in the 1976 annual report of MCC (Canada).

1. Contributions. Constituency contributions forwarded to MCC (Canada) from December 1, 1976 to April 30, 1977 were \$770,339, compared with \$1,180,993 for the same period in 1976. Other income including government grants brings the total for the five-month period to \$1,431,036. Of this, \$852,431 was designated, and \$578,605 was general contributions. Total giving in the same period last year was \$1,666,196.

2. Personnel. Canadian applications are slightly up over last year, although the total for the North American constituency is down. Up to May 20, 374 applications were received, including 128 from Canadians. In 1976, the Akron, PA. office of MCC received 420 applications in the same period.

Program

1. Kanadier Mennonites. Arthur Driedger, formerly MCC (Manitoba) director, has been appointed to MCC (Canada) overseas services staff to give special attention to Kanadier Mennonite concerns, such as immigration. Die Mennonitische Post, a German-language paper sponsored initially by MCC (Canada), is off the press and is being

well received by the Mennonite communities in the seven countries where it is distributed, as indicated by the number of letters and subscriptions coming in. MCC (Ontario) has launched a service program to aid the Mennonites from Mexico who have settled in Ontario lately.

2. CIDA Bilateral Contracts. MCC (Canada) continues discussion with the Bilateral Division of the Canadian International Development Agency regarding a project proposal. Since such a project would be done by MCC under contract with CIDA Bilateral, and this represents a substantial departure from the relationship of MCC with the government agency, the board asked the executive committee in January to call a special meeting if necessary to decide on a specific contract. No date has been set on such a meeting because of uncertainties.

3. MCC-MCC (Canada) Relationships. A committee as called for at the January meeting has met twice to plan a consultation on MCC-MCC (Canada) relationships.

4. Northern Development Position. A statement on northern development is being prepared as outlined overleaf.

5. Voluntary Service. MCC (Canada) has set up a one-year program for youthful applicants, called SALT for Salt and Light Training. Emphasis is on training for Christian service although participants also perform a meaningful service in the community. High school graduates age 17-20 may apply.

6. Vietnam. A third delegation visited Vietnam in January. Harold Jantz, editor of the M.B. Herald, was the Canadian on the three-person delegation. \$200,000 has been budgeted for Vietnam this year to go toward construction of an irrigation project.

A Vital Issue

MCC (Canada)'s position and action relating to northern development and the Native people of the North is one of the most urgent decisions currently facing us. The staff and executive committee are preparing a paper outlining the MCC (Canada) position upon which our action will be based. We invite the participating churches to share our struggle by seeking earnestly the guidance of the Lord and by exchanging views in seminars and with their members on the board.

It is of particular urgency that MCC (Canada) formulate a position and take action as required, because events are moving quickly in the Northwest Territories with regard to development. The Canadian government is aiming to reach a decision by September 1, as to whether, or when, or by what route, the pipeline bringing gas and oil from the Arctic to southern markets will be built. A report from Mr. Justice Thomas Berger tabled in the House of Commons May 9, based on 19 months of hearings he conducted in the Mackenzie Valley and in southern Canadian centers, has recommended a 10-year moratorium on construction of a pipeline in the North. The final decision,

however, rests with the Canadian government.

In formulating its position, MCC (Canada) uses as its basis the scriptural imperatives to obey God by acting in love and doing justice (e.g. Hosea 12:6). MCC (Canada) also takes into consideration the command of God to humankind from the beginning of recorded history, to have dominion over the earth. Respect for the earth and its resources is a recurrent theme in scripture. As part of a society that uses and wastes energy excessively, the Mennonites of North America are responsible with the rest of the Canadians and Americans for the energy demand that makes a pipeline appear necessary.

The proposed pipeline in the Mackenzie Valley transverses land claimed by Native people. These claims have not yet been settled. If the pipeline is built without the consent of the Native people, it will force them into a way of life that would have disastrous effects on their lives. Wildlife and the environment would also be adversely affected.

The position paper is to reaffirm the position implicit in MCC (Canada)'s membership in Project North, an inter-church organization making a case for a moratorium on northern development until Native land claims are settled and implemented. The staff persons of Project North have recently presented briefs to various inquiries relating to northern development, published two books on land claims and northern development, and helped mobilize support for a moratorium.

In its support for such a position, MCC (Canada) is not forfeiting the non-resistance principles which are fundamental in its beliefs about how human relationships and interactions with the environment should be conducted. MCC (Canada) recognizes that, in admonishing the government to act righteously as required by God, the church must act in a loving spirit. To live in harmony with our environment rather than to exploit it ruthlessly is a needed reconciliatory approach.

Inherent in the MCC (Canada) position is the recognition that Christians may have to take a look at a life style dependent upon the use of vast supplies of nonrenewable energy, and themselves look for ways to change it, and to influence society to do the same.

We encourage constituent groups to become involved in this question, for it has significance for the church's witness. Seldom before have the Native people of Canada asked the church to stand by them as they search for ways to maintain the wholeness of their existence. Our credibility as a group having faith in a God of love and justice, and believing in the way of Jesus as the good news for all people, will be affected if we ignore the Native people and their claims and hopes for the future of their children.

Hugo Jantz introduced Art Driedger, associate director of overseas services, Len Siemens and Ron Mathies.

Art Driedger reported on his work. He greeted the con-

vention on behalf of the staff in the Winnipeg office. He shared a personal testimony of his relationship to the Lord and to the brotherhood. He stressed that MCC is giving more and more attention to ministering also to Mennonite people. The areas are:

- i. The "Kanadier Mennonites" of Mexico, Bolivia, Paraguay and Honduras.
- ii. Assistance to the Mennonites from Mexico who are returning to Canada.
- iii. The "Russlaender" or "Umsiedler" Mennonites are being assisted to establish themselves in Germany.
- iv. Hutterites want to assist MCC to contribute to world needs.

b. Questions and Responses to the Report

Encouragement to the editors of the "Mennonite Post".

Questions about proliferation of energies in the MCC. The interest of the congregations must be kept alive. Art Driedger explained that MCC has often initiated a work and then the Mission boards have followed up the work. "The Post" is designed to become self supporting in five years.

Request for MCC involvement in India was made by Rev. S. Raj of Vancouver:

- i. That the MCC should look into the possibility of associating the Gospel with the work of material aid and assistance in India, since it is a very long involvement.
- ii. That MCC Calcutta office has communication problems on different levels including government agencies.
- iii. That mission workers and hospital would get clothing, soap, bandages, etc. for their use and would not look somewhere else for these things.

The moderator, F. C. Peters stated that the question would be sent on to MCC head office.

Upon motion all reports were accepted.

21. Statistical Report

George Epp, the Conference statistician presented his report and commented on the information presented. (See details pages 81 to 88. A lively discussion followed. After some favourable comments, concerns were expressed at some of the statistics such as the figure for divorces and separations and the number of baptisms without joining the church, a practice which is contrary to the position held by the conference. The report was then accepted.

8. Board of Management (cont'd from previous discussions)

Budgets

a. Budget of the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns

The detailed budget for this board was reviewed and upon motion was accepted.

b. Budget of the Board of Evangelism

During the discussion, the over-all budget was reviewed and the total increase from \$650,000 (approx.) for the previous year to the figure of \$823,000 (approx.) for the coming year which means an increase of approximately \$173,000, was viewed with some alarm. In view of our inability last year, to meet the accepted budget, much concern was voiced about the possibility of meeting the goal for next year.

Motion: "That we refer the submitted budget figures to the Board of Management for a further review to be brought back to the Conference on Tuesday morning."

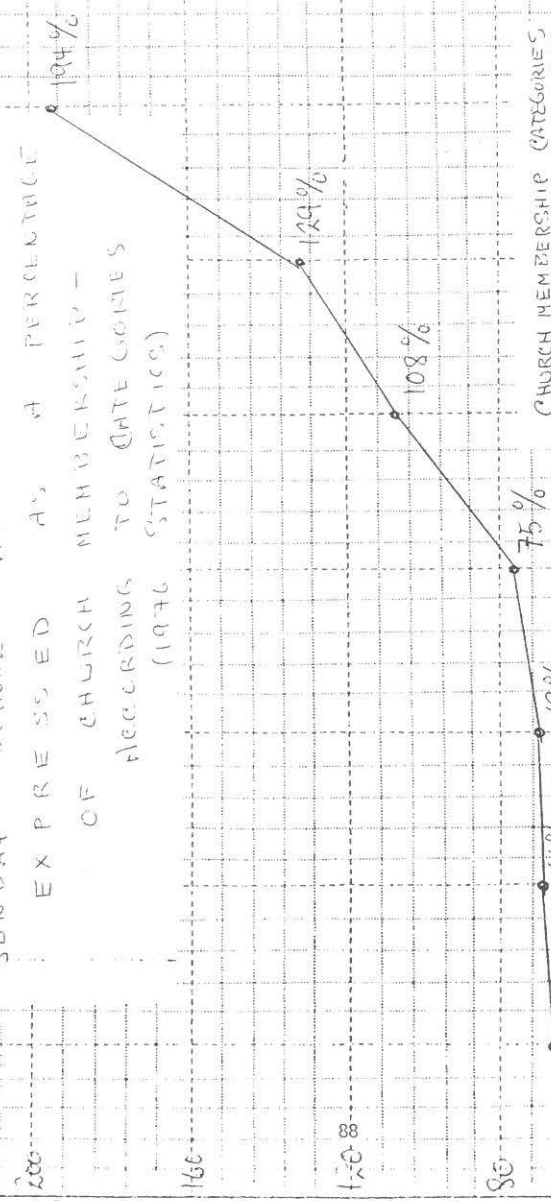

Song Service

Ed Boldt led the convention in singing "Majestic Sweetness Sits Enthroned Upon the Saviour's Brow" and "O Lord, My God".

Devotions

Rev. Lucius Rammala from Botswana, Africa read Phil. 4:1-5. He emphasized the word 'Rejoice'. Joy is one of the fruits of the Spirit. Many people seek happiness in the world but Christians rejoice in the Lord. The Lord took our punishment, a reason for us to rejoice. This joy we share with others. Rev. Rammala spoke of his work among the Bushmen of Botswana and of his gratitude that Mennonite congregations share both the Gospel and material possessions with the poor people overseas. He appealed for prayer especially for the political situation in South Africa. F. C. Peters responded that we are open to sharing with our brothers overseas.

Lucius Rammala then gave a description of the work in Botswana. Three churches of the Dutch Reformed Congregation are working among people of Botswana. The name of the church is The Dutch Reformed Church of Africa. In 1968, mission work was begun among the bushmen of the Kalahari desert. Rev. Rammala became the first missionary to accept the call to work among these people. Conditions of living were very primitive and the work was hard because the people were at first not willing to accept strangers. Eventually a school was set up which now has 62 children. 10 of these are being supported entirely by MCC. The people of the area practice no religion but Rev. Rammala hopes that some will become believers soon. He is heading an agricultural program especially designed for the area. MCC is funding this program. He expresses gratitude to the convention for the help.

Many Needs Have Been Supplied

With a deep sense of inward joy, we present this annual report of the Board's activities to the constituency. Although some matters appeared on the horizon last year which caused us some concern and anxiety, the Lord has undertaken to supply all of our needs in a marvellous way.

MB Bible College and College of Arts

Another eventful year has been brought to a successful close. We are grateful to the faculty and staff for their devoted service to the College. Details of the College functions will be covered in the institutional report of the President. As the brethren Vern Ratzlaff, who has served the College for 11 years, and Howard Loewen, who has served for five years, leave for other areas of Christian service, we wish them the Lord's continued blessing in their ministries. For 1977-78, Peter Klassen will be on a leave of absence and Esther Wiens will be on a sabbatical year for further studies. John Regehr will be returning after a year of studies in North Carolina, and Richard Epp has been given a one-year appointment to the faculty.

Dr. Henry Krahn has now completed his initial three-year term as President of the College. The Board is very grateful for the period of consolidation and growth under Dr. Krahn's leadership and has extended his appointment as President for an indefinite period. We covet the prayers of the constituency on his behalf.

The accounting procedures at the College have undergone some extensive studies and have been changed to meet current demands. As part of our on-going financial review, the room and board prices have been increased by an average of 10.6 percent for 1977-78. Even though annual increases have been made, the MBBC rates are still lower than other comparable institutions. The College is still legally locked into the tuition fee structure of the University of Winnipeg at \$425 annually. The Board has approved a \$15 surcharge per course up to a maximum of three courses taken at the College annually, pending a complete re-study of the entire agreement with the University of Winnipeg. Comparable tuition fees in Ontario universities are set at \$720 for the 1977-78 academic year. The Board is reviewing the tuition fee structure for 1978-79 with the view to increasing it substantially. Another option being considered is the introduction of a fee differential for Mennonite Brethren and non-Mennonite Brethren students because of the heavy demands on the annual Conference grant. On the basis of a projected enrollment of 200 full-time equivalent students for 1977-78, the budget is expected to increase by approximately 12 percent.

The special drives and donations from the churches have proceeded very well again this year. At the time of this report, approximately \$62,000 has been received which has helped to reduce the grant from the Conference by this amount, as approved in the 1976-77 budget.

The purchase details of the Mighton Apartments were all finalized by last July. It was also possible to sell the College property at 166 McIntosh Avenue, Winnipeg, with the following financial breakdown:

These mortgage payments are self-amortizing on the basis of student rental fees.

Long-Range Campus Development Plans

The Board of Higher Education has approved plans for long-range development of the MBBC campus. These plans are based on an analysis of current and future needs of the College, which have been studied by the Master Planning Commission, established by the Board two years ago.

At the 1976 Convention in Winnipeg, the Board reported the assignment given to the Master Planning Commission consisting of 15 brethren in the Winnipeg area. Various recommendations have been reviewed at the last two meetings of the Board and Executive Committee. At the meeting on April 23, it was agreed that we proceed with the release of information so that delegates could become well-informed and discuss the principle of such a future undertaking.

The following points summarize the basis of the Board's future projections:

- a) That any future development of the campus take place on the present site.
- b) That a long-range development of the campus take place in three stages:
 - Phase 1 - construction of a multi-purpose building. Projected approval in 1977.
 - Phase 2 - replacement of Ebenezer Hall with larger dining room and dormitory facilities.
 - Phase 3 - renovation of the Administration Building.
- c) That the two houses on Henderson Highway between the Library Building and the Mighton Apartments be purchased for approximately \$38,000, which represents a current market value of \$50,000 because some substantial donations have been made by several brethren. These homes have recently been acquired by several of our brethren and are available to the Conference. Currently they are rented by students which pays for the mortgages. By purchasing them, the College would achieve two objectives.
 - i. The Mighton Apartments would be tied in with the College campus, so that we would be eligible for an annual property tax reduction on the apartments of \$3,000. We are now classified on a commercial basis for tax purposes instead of an educational basis and pay \$6,300 per year.
 - ii. The additional lots provide a site for a future expansion of the Unruh Memorial Building as envisaged in Phase 1 above.
- d) That the construction of a multi-purpose building be presented to the 1977 Convention which is designed to meet immediate as well as future College needs:
 - d.1 additional library space
 - d.2 accommodation for Canadian Conference Archives and the MB Study Center
 - d.3 additional space for the music department
 - d.4 an auditorium for chapel, music and drama purposes

d.5 renovation of the current chapel for a student activities center.

One of the pressing needs of the library is for additional book stacks. The structural strength of the upper floor of the Unruh Memorial Building was built with a bearing strength of 65 pounds per square foot. The library stacks and archival center require a minimum strength of 150 pounds per square foot, so that the upper floor cannot be used for this purpose.

The Board has requested that some architectural drawings together with construction cost estimates as well as projected maintenance costs be prepared for the July Convention. In the meantime, we would covet your prayers and support for the consideration of this new venture of faith.

Composition of the Board

In addition to the eleven elected members and the President, we have been inviting the President of the College Alumni Association to attend meetings as an observer/participant. The contribution of the Alumni members is very much appreciated, and the Board would like to have the Alumni President as a regular member. Consequently, we have requested a change in the Constitution to reduce our "members-at-large" by one and include the Alumni President in this position. The Alumni Association has sponsored four major events this year and the Executive met every two months.

Annual Ministers' Course

The annual course conducted at the College was carried out under the new registration and fee structure initiated last year. This worked out very well and will be continued with the eventual goal to make it a self-paying project.

The one-week course conducted in Ontario together with Howard Loewen from the College and Waldo Hiebert from the Seminary was very well received.

Historical Committee

This committee has been active in promoting the collection of archival material in the Canadian constituency. An organizational meeting of the Canadian Mennonite Brethren Historical Society has taken place and activities are being projected. The MB Study Center Advisory Committee has also met several times in the study of several research projects.

Student Services Committee

During the year, James Pankratz, Director of Canadian Student Services program, has been involved with several of the provincial organizations. He reports that there is an increasing emphasis on work in this area at the local level. His function is more in the nature of being a resource person for assistance, co-ordination and encouragement. Last December he participated in the Urbana '76 Conference, and he has also been very much involved with the Director of Christian Education in planning for Banff '77.

Inter-school Relations Committee

This Committee has sponsored a two-day Consultation on the College campus last October consisting of the Presidents/Principals and Deans of the following Mennonite Brethren institutions: College, Seminary, Bible institutes and

Christian high schools of Canada. Dr. J. B. Toews presented a wide-ranging paper on "Influences that have effected Educational Processes in Mennonite Brethren Schools," which elicited much discussion. For October 1977, the third Consultation is being planned with the theme to focus on the objectives of each of the institutions.

As more information becomes available, it will be shared at the time of the Convention in July.

He then called on several people as follows:

i. Henry Krahn, President of MBBC reports (report is on file). He introduced Abe Dueck, Academic Dean to the Conference. Dr. Krahn emphasized the following ideas:

a) We build on foundations laid by others. He referred to the traditions of MBBC established by those gone before. Ideals and objectives once established remain intact.

b) Growth is not easy to measure. MBBC has had things happen. Internal growth has occurred but Krahn asks the convention to pray that God will cause dramatic changes in the lives of students. He is grateful for enthusiasm.

c) MBBC attracts many types of students from all walks of life. Students show a keen interest in involvement with church work and in becoming good students. The pastors internship program is active.

ii. A. Dueck spoke about faculty. Fourteen faculty members will be active this year.

iii. Henry Krahn continued to discuss curriculum. Biblical studies dept., music dept., Contemporary Ministries and Social Sciences.

Projections: Excited about new faculty appointments. Student enrollment almost complete. Starting an extension education program. This should be a great help to the churches as the faculty ministers with their unique abilities.

iv. H. H. Dueck read the supplementary report.

Proposal for Multi-Purpose Building

The Board of Higher Education, together with the Master Planning Commission, has studied the present and future requirements of grounds and buildings for MBBC and is agreed that the most pressing needs are for: additional library space; secure accommodation for Can-

nadian Conference archives and study center; additional space for the music department, student activities center, and a chapel-drama-music auditorium. It is envisaged that a multi-purpose building could be constructed adjacent to and directly north of the Unruh Memorial Building to meet these needs. Such a building would meet the needs for the present student body but would also provide adequate accommodations for library, classroom, music, recreation, archives and chapel for a student body of 400.

The original plan called for a presentation of one proposal for the entire multi-purpose building. The building costs of such a building however seemed to suggest that it would be better to proceed in two stages. Phase 1 (A) would provide additional space for archives, library, classrooms and faculty offices for the music department. The construction of the chapel-drama-music auditorium would constitute Phase 1(B). The plans presented focus on Phase 1(A). Specific proposals for Phase 1(B) would be presented to the Conference before any fund-raising for the building or construction would begin. The schedule for Phase 1(B) would be determined to a large extent by the progress made in Phase 1(A). The following plans and cost estimates relate specifically to Phase 1(A). Some drawings, however, refer to the overall view of Phases 1(A) and 1(B). (pages 97 to 103)

Phase 1(A) - The construction costs for Phase 1(A), according to recent professional studies, is \$500,000. This figure includes architect fees, construction, interest costs and furnishings. It is envisaged that the funds required for this project could be raised according to the following formula: 80% special donations; 20% conference grant.

Phase 1(B) - The addition of a future chapel-auditorium on the remaining property to the north is viewed as an integral part of the building proposed in Phase 1(A). This facility would accommodate up to 600 persons when the multi-purpose rooms on the upper level are used as a balcony. The plans also make provision for possible future expansion of academic, office or residence space vertically over the proposed addition, using the established stair and elevator cases.

Henry Krahn added to the report by explaining the use to be made of the new facilities according to the projected phases of the building program.

v. Helmut Huebert explained page 4 of the report. Phase 1, lower level. He referred to the present crowded conditions of the archives. In the new plan, enough room is projected for a normal development of the archives. Fireproofing is also an important feature.

Archives

The Archive Centre of the Canadian Conference is gradually collecting more and more material. As this occurs those wanting to file materials - or retrieve them - have to become ever thinner and taller as the shelves become ever closer together and higher.

Besides insufficient room, the present facilities are

not nearly sufficiently climate controlled and fireproof. Floor strength in the present facilities is 65 lb. per square foot, the recommended strength being 150 lb.

In the proposed multi-purpose building project, provision is made for sufficient room - 1300 square feet. This is sufficient for the foreseeable future. This will allow storage under more ideal and safer conditions. Basement floor strength will be sufficient to store any archives, even minutes of this weighty decision.

vi. Henry Redekop, spoke about his love of and support for the College. He reviewed the history of the numerous building programs contemplated, but not carried out. He stressed that denial of self must be taught and we should be willing to sacrifice our material wealth for the sake of the College.

25. Recognition to W.L.U. and Others

Herbert Brandt introduced Mr. Fred Fields, the coordinator of conferences at Wilfrid Laurier University. Brandt thanked Mr. Fields who also spoke briefly to the convention and mentioned a few members of his staff. He thanked the local arrangements committee for their cooperation.

The resolutions committee was asked to prepare a suitable resolution thanking F. C. Peters and Herbert Brandt for their many years of dedicated leadership of the Mennonite Brethren Conference.

26. Greetings from Zaire

Greeting from a Zairien student graduate from the Biblical Seminary in France were brought by Hartmut Schroeder.

22. Board of Higher Education (cont'd)

b. Overview of Financial Report by Henry Dick.

Collect 80% of the funds before construction of the new facilities begins.

40% cash - 40% pledges

At present, \$100,000 + has been collected.

Target for completing collection is January 1, 1978

c. Treasury Report

David Redekop reported. He summarized the report that is on file. He emphasized the specific cost for each student has been calculated this year. In future, following this pattern will result in more accurate accounting.

Upon motion all reports were accepted.

d. Recommendations

1. That the Conference purchase the two houses on Henderson Highway, number 85 and 95, for \$38,000.

2. That the Conference authorize the Board to collect funds for the construction of the multi-purpose building (Phase 1, Stage (A) costing \$500,000 (80% special donation and 20% Conference grant), including furnishing and financing, subject to the following conditions.

- 2.1 - That 80% or \$400,000 be collected on a voluntary basis; 40% or \$200,000 in cash and 40% or \$200,000 in pledges before construction begins. The pledges are to be realized over a 3 year period.
 - That the proposal be sent to the churches for a vote.
 - That the proposal be approved by a simple majority of the votes cast. The vote is to be taken by September 30, 1977.
- 2.2 - If the conditions of 2.1 are met, the Board of Higher Education be authorized to proceed with construction.
- 2.3 - That the 20% conference grant or \$100,000 be made available after the approval for construction to begin has been granted.
- 2.4 - If the conditions are not met, then the Proposal for a new building be presented to the Convention in 1978.

- i. Recommendation 1 - moved to adopt - carried.
- ii. Recommendation 2 - moved to adopt - This recommendation was discussed. The suggestion was made that we move more slowly; that we allow the recommendation to be considered by the churches before we begin collection of funds. F. C. Peters explains that the vote from the churches will come in first, then the collection will take place.

Motion: "That the debate be closed."

This motion was defeated.

Debate opened and discussion continued.

Concerns were expressed about the goals and objectives.

Motion to Amend: "That the vote be taken November 15, 1977 not September 30, 1977."

The amendment was defeated.

Request was made that more information be given to churches about the cost of operating the school. Emphasis was placed on the important role the MBBC has in the life of our constituency. Henry Krahn explained that the cost estimate has been arrived at by a reliable construction firm and that the costs are estimated as closely as possible. Many positive responses about the College were heard. Especially important to the convention was the spiritual influence the College has on the lives of the students.

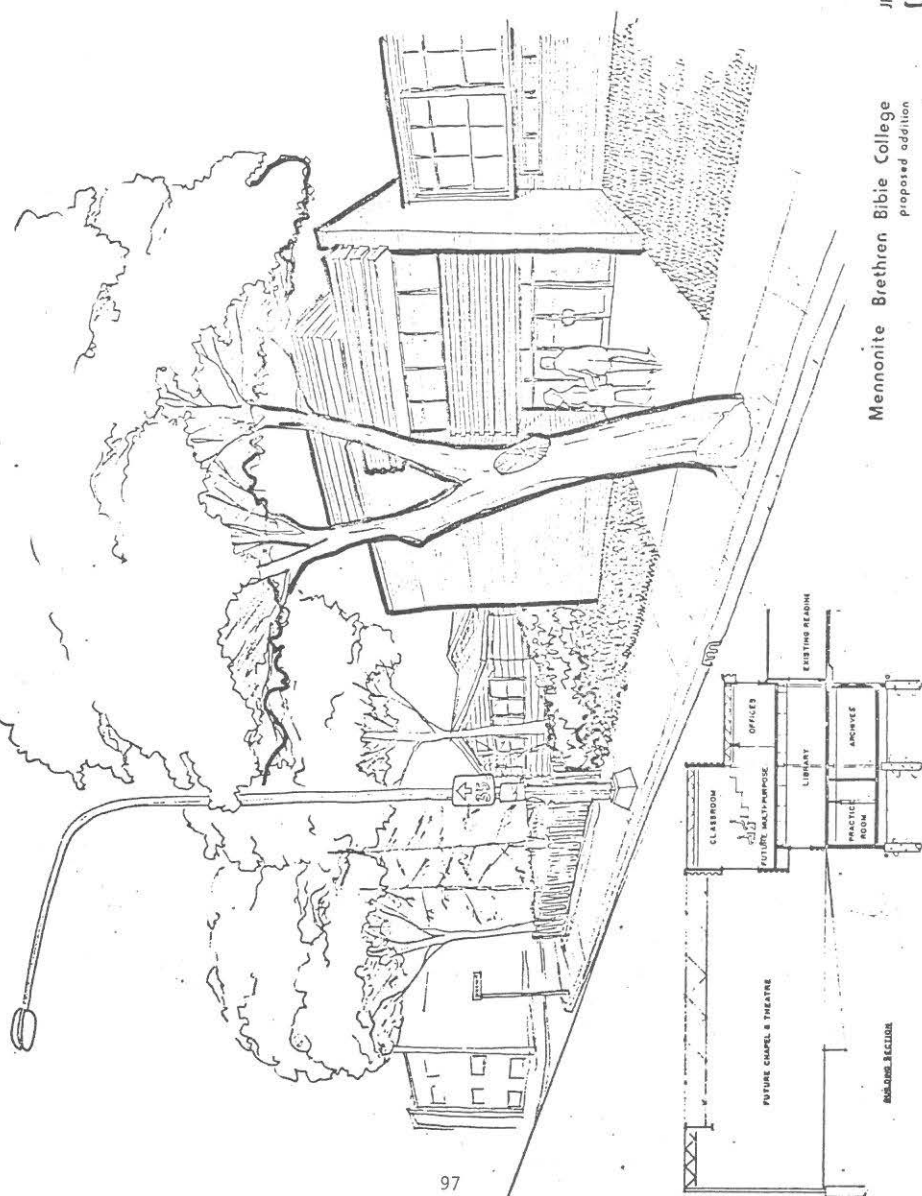

Special Music

Opening

F. C. Peters led in a special prayer for our nation and for our parliamentary leaders. He made special reference to the debate on Canadian unity which began in parliament today.

22. Board of Higher Education (cont'd)

Again brethren expressed their appreciation of the spiritual impact of the school. F. C. Peters reminded the delegates to speak to the motion on the building. The delegates were reminded that the Phase 1 plan is really a test case whether or not the M.B. Conference is in favour of expanding College facilities. The Convention asked to consider this vote as a principle procedure regarding the long-range development of facilities at MBBC.

Question is called for. The moderator reviewed the recommendation point by point and the vote was taken, by ballot. The motion carried by a vote of 305 yes to 27 no.

e. Operation Budget

D. Redekop reported (report is on file). Upon motion the report was accepted.

f. John Wiebe spoke about the effective work of H. H. Dueck especially in seeing the board and College through the recent difficult times. He expresses the convention's gratitude to H. H. Dueck for his dedicated service.

During the discussion which followed a student spoke of his personal appreciation for the spiritual impact on his life.

Wm. Wiebe of BOMAS spoke positively about the College and its effect on mission workers.

H. H. Dueck thanked the convention for supporting the MBBC Board in its plans to expand facilities of the College.

8. Board of Management (cont'd)

Bill Fast presented their report after again wrestling with the need for funds and the shortage of funds to meet such needs.

The Board of Management spent considerable time on Friday and again last night, considering the problem of reduced and inadequate giving by individuals, or churches or provinces to the Canadian Conference for its work.

In trying to understand why funds were not coming in as anticipated, it was felt that a number of factors were likely the cause. Permit me to list some, not necessarily in sequence of priority.

a. Reduced giving might be an indicator of spiritual death, lack of discipleship, lack of commitment or whatever. For this reason a motion was passed on Friday to ask the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns to consider the question and suggest some solution for the problem.

b. Inability to reach the desired expected funds might be due to lack of adequate material goods or cash from which to give OR might be due to the fact that our goals were set too high - i.e. beyond the growth of the general economy in the land and the income of our members.

c. Failure on the part of the members to give adequately might be due to an objection to the projects of the Canadian Conference, or at least lack of interest.

We see members give well to special projects like the Quebec Bible Institute for example.

d. The method of giving to the Canadian Conference could influence the amount of money coming to the Conference, e.g. whether we give as churches or as provincial conference.

In response to your request of last night, we attempted first of all to arrive at a more realistic final budget figure.

The actual expenditures of \$655,515 last year is a fact of history. The actual receipt of \$648,470 is also a fact of history.

We made two assumptions:

a. That we as individuals in our brotherhood do have resources still available because the Lord has richly blessed us and we are capable of giving more - i.e. we haven't reached our limit.

b. That we as a brotherhood are interested in the work of the Canadian Conference.

I might say that these assumptions required on our part some faith in our brotherhood to be faithful and in the Lord to proceed.

We therefore aimed for a budget increase of 10.57% over last year's actual receipt. i.e. A final figure of \$741,000. This is \$92,260 more than last year's actual receipts. \$4.73 more per member.

How have we done this? First we have tried not to interfere with general operation of the various boards but rather took specific items. But we are looking to the various boards to use good stewardship in their budget administration.

\$2,000 more than last year's budget.

19,500 members at \$30.00 per member equals \$741,000

The Convention accepts the project with its corresponding budget. If we accept this budget we accept \$741,000 and \$38.00 per member. We should remember this is a trimmed budget, therefore we will not be able to go into our reserves continually. We look forward as a new Board of Management to have all churches and provinces come with 100% of the share of the budget.

The final revised budget as presented showed a figure of \$741,000, which is a reduction of \$81,800 from the budget proposed earlier. The per capita expense will remain as last year.

Upon motion, the budget was accepted.

The Board of Management asked whether they have the responsibility and authority of trimming the budget, if they deem it advisable.

Motion: "That at the beginning of each Convention each board will bring its budget at the very outset of the Convention but that no action be taken on any budget until the final figure can be studied and then acted upon toward the end of the Convention."

CARRIED

16. Board of Evangelism (cont'd)

A motion regarding the production of the proposed film was proposed as follows:

Motion: "That the Boards of Evangelism and Christian Education proceed with the production of the film documentary, Banff '77, the funds for which will come out of special appeals."

The result was, yes - 101, no - 138. The motion was lost.

27. Attendance Figures

28. Resolutions Committee Report

We acknowledge our obligation and express our sincerest thanks.

i. To the Conference Executive, the brethren F. C. Peters, Herbert Brandt, C. J. Rempel and the assistant John Wittenberg, for the considerate and brotherly way in which they carried out their responsibilities. Their untiring efforts contributed much to the orderly and efficient conduct of all sessions.

ii. To the Ontario Conference, and also particularly the three Kitchener-Waterloo area Mennonite Brethren Churches for the friendly and courteous care with which they arranged for our transportation, our ac-

commodation and all the facilities needed for our comfort and our work. We also sincerely appreciated the effort put forth to beautify and enrich the worship service and convention session with beautiful instrumental and vocal music.

- iii. To Wilfrid Laurier University for making their campus, together with auditoriums, student residences, and athletic facilities available to us. They provided for us an environment in which we could conduct all our business and worship sessions without disturbance, and also through informal fellowship, grow in unity and appreciation of one another. The delegates of the 66th Convention of the Mennonite Brethren Churches of Canada congratulate the paper on the occasion of its one hundredth birthday. We wish the editor and the staff of the Christian Press much joy as they continue to serve the needs of the Conference. CONFERENCE MESSAGE - F.C. Peters, Saturday afternoon

"For Such A Time As This" - Esther 4:14

Introduction

1. There are always those who lament the times we live in -

They claim that things have never been more precarious and the horizon has never appeared more gloomy -

Perhaps we need to rethink the New Testament usage of the term "the latter days" which began at Pentecost -- The Church has always been in the last days.

2. Among the many theories of change there is one called "Encounters at the Crossroads."

The proponents claim that serious change comes when sufficient numbers of variables are in motion at the same time.

Perhaps this is also true of Mennonite Brethren -- In the last decade a sufficient number of variables have been in motion to make us a people in change.

3. Whenever we are at the crossroads we need a number of things to guide us.

I am assuming that we as Mennonite Brethren are not debating the authority of God's Word -- I believe that this is firmly settled in our brotherhood -

I am also assuming that we are agreed on what it means to be a believers' church.

Clear proclamation of God's Truth

Personal appropriation of proclaimed truth.

4. I wish to point to three issues which we as Mennonite Brethren face today -

I suppose it would be simpler for me just to take a text and exegete it and forget about the issues which confront us.

There is always a temptation for us to take recourse to the obvious.

But that is not leadership.

I. THE QUESTION OF DENOMINATIONAL IDENTITY

Erik Erikson says that the major quest of man is his search for identity --

Who am I?

Perhaps it is superfluous to say that nothing is ever known until it is known historically -

But we must come to realize that our identity is not merely an exercise in historical research. With the present upsurge of Mennonite Brethren studies we need to ask ourselves whether history is becoming our norm for truth.

As the people of God, we must not forget that our identity has been defined for us by God himself.

Our major approach should be theological not historical.

God has told us who we are -- Do we first seek to be a New Testament people or do we seek first to find our identity as a church in our historical development.

I believe that this was precisely the burden of 1860 which separated us from a people whose identity was more cultural and historical than biblical.

What do we need for our denominational identity?

A. We Need A First Century Faith -

Perhaps this was the genius of our anabaptist forefathers who reminded the reformers that something happened with the coming of Christ which was normative for the entire life of the church on earth.

The great events of the first century were "hapax" events -- once for all events --

Jude admonishes us that we should earnestly contend for the faith which was once for all delivered unto the saints.

It is interesting to note that we are not admonished in the New Testament to advance but to abide.

B. We Have A Twentieth Century Mission -

Lest we fall into the error of a dated Christianity let me remind myself and you that our first century faith must be proclaimed and lived in the twentieth century.

We must relate to our world or we lose our identity as people of God.

Israel lost its mission to the nations and they ceased to be the people of God.

It may be said of us that we are not of this world but it could also be equally true that we are not in our world either

C. We Underscore Our Historical Roots -

Most of us have seen Alex Haley's TV series Roots. I was deeply moved by the search of the American black man to establish his identity by discovering his roots.

We are also a people with historical and cultural roots. How important are they?

Are we seeking to maintain an ethnic fellowship? Ethnicity has its supports -- Language - Tradition - Lifestyle - Family Names, etc.

At this point we must decide whether we are attempting to maintain our roots as a Mennonite people with a peculiar culture which we have preserved from the past or whether our roots are firmly established in our first century faith and the history of the people of God.

What we seek to preserve is the faith once for all delivered unto the saints. Our peace position is not an ethnic peculiarity, a Mennonite distinctive. It is part of the identity of the people of God clarified by Jesus Christ when he said: "But I say unto you."

If it is not that, it has not more status in the arena of truth than Vereneke or Plumamoos.

I see a phenomena occurring among us. Many of our younger churches are no longer identified as Mennonite Brethren Church -- many are Christian Fellowship Church, Neighbourhood Bible Chapel, etc.

In other words, we no longer carry the same name in our denominational fellowship.

Obviously the name "Mennonite" is considered by many of our so-called mission churches a liability and not an asset.

I feel there is nothing sacred about the name Mennonite. What it does is identify us with a stream of thought which I trust is first century and biblical and which was clarified in the reformation.

Can we retain these truths without retaining the label? I think it is possible. Whether it is necessary is another question.

But we must -- we must -- discuss this issue.

D. A Final Word About Our Identity -

We confess our evangelical fellowship.

I suppose all labels are in part libels. They become fuzzy and imprecise.

III. My background (Peters
(Hildebrandt)

Are we so concerned about our historical roots that we willingly associate on a basis of a common cultural heritage rather than a deep sense of common commitment to an evangelical faith.

II. THE SEARCH FOR A FUNCTIONAL POLITY

A polity is an operational procedure -- a way of doing things. --

I personally doubt very much whether a polity is ever biblical -- The goals to which the polity leads are biblical but the methods we employ are those of our generation.

The early church knew nothing of radio, TV, nor did they have a Publications Committee. The fellowship was not divided into area and provincial conferences.

A. We Define Our Brotherhood As Extending Beyond The Limits of a Local Church -

The autonomy of the local church is really not a Mennonite Brethren concept. We are congregational but we also define the church as a fellowship of local churches.

One of future study conferences must focus on the relationship of the local congregation to the provincial conference and the area conference.

There is really no magic in this. The guiding principle is that we belong together and things ought to be done at the level where they can be done best.

This will take a good deal of wisdom to sort out those issues in which we seek provincial and area uniformity while respecting diversity in many other issues.

Perhaps one of the questions which surfaces at this time is whether we really must have a uniform eschatology in the Mennonite Brethren Church or is there room for one conviction on the blessed hope with diversity in how this conviction is expressed in a system of eschatology.

B. We Must Decide Whether The General Conference Is The Basic Conference Structure Or Whether It Is A Federation Of Two Area Conferences -

If the General Conference is the basic structure then many of our Mennonite Brethren activities will slowly be moved into General Conference jurisdiction.

I personally feel that this would be a mistake. We must keep two semi-autonomous area conferences which meet the needs of two national fellowships.

There are national differences in education, in evangelistic concerns, in the groups to which we relate.

The General Conference should derive its authority from the mutual consent of the area conferences. It should also pave the way for a World Conference of Mennonite Brethren Areas.

There are a number of things we must do as joint project between two areas:

(Missions
(Seminary

A number of things should be done by commissions:

(Confession of Faith
(Hymnal

I believe we must stop the drift to move more and more functions into the General Conference. History has shown that the support tends to wane as the project is removed farther away from the local church.

III. THE MAINTENANCE OF A SENSE OF DIRECTION

We can become so depressed about isolated problems that we fail to see that we are maintaining a direction -

Perhaps this is the important aspect -

A. Our Theologians Must Give Us A Mennonite Brethren Version Of Anabaptism -

We hear about an evangelical anabaptism but most of our definitions are borrowed from other groups.

I am deeply convinced that we must continue to explore our reformation moorings but I cannot always accept some of the twentieth century interpretations which seem to be influencing us today.

I look to our brethren and our schools to help us in the task of maintaining our sense of direction.

B. In Our Ministries We Must Maintain A Balance Between Proclamation and Service In The Name of Christ -

Let us beware of an emphasis which neglects the physical and emotional needs of the world around us.

The mandate of the church is not evangelism or social service. It is discipleship which means following the word and example of our Lord in the twentieth century.

C. In Our World Fellowship We Wish To Maintain Our Sense Of Identity As Mennonite Brethren While Cooperating With Others -

Mennonite Central Committee was organized as a vehicle by which groups could maintain their identity as they cooperate in a task that they could not do individually.

However, we hope that such vehicles will not become the platform for blatant ecumenical manoeuvres.

D. To Maintain A Sense Of Direction We Need A Renewed Sense Of Leadership -

We need to hear common voices once more -

A. H. Unruh - H. H. Janzen - B. B. Janz - Bible College Teachers

Has the time come when we should ask our Conference leadership to devote the time in office to an all-Conference ministry -

Conclusion:

- v. Develop a program of church planting.
- vi. Accept God's gift of trans-cultural church.
- vii. Discover methods the Spirit can use and is using.

By Myron Augsburg - "Heralds of the Kingdom".

He reviewed the original sermon topic "The Presence of the Kingdom" according to Rom. 14:17 and Col. 1:13 and mentioned:

a. The believer is in the world but not of the world. A Christian cannot live a dual life. He may know about Christianity but he must also involve himself as a Christian in the affairs of the world. The believer must live his new life and his new purpose.

b. "The Kingdom is among you" must be understood more fully. Jesus brought to this world the kingdom of love and spiritual power, John 3. The Christian church must be clear about its commitment to the Kingdom of Christ. The Kingdom becomes visible through Christians demonstrating love and Christ-likeness in everyday living. The community of Christians is a gift of God's grace. Believers relate to each other basically through Christ, not through personality. Believers are a people at peace as well as of peace.

Then Myron Augsburger developed his message "Herald of the Kingdom" according to Marck 1:14-15 and Acts 20:24.

i. Conviction Without Dogmatism

The believer needs to talk about evidences for faith rather than make arguments for faith. The unbeliever must be met where he is; he must be led, not coerced. The contact with the unbeliever must be made always with respect for his personal dignity.

ii. Compassion Without Condescension

The believer needs to develop the ability to relate to others in love. There must be empathy in identification. There is the necessity to relate to others by totally abandoning prejudices.

iii. Communication Without Manipulation

Communication means a vicarious dialogue. The believer needs to relate to others in such a way that both open up to each other to discuss freely the options which Christ offers.

Conclusion

Making faith in Christ an option. The Christian needs to express his discipleship to Christ in the vocational role he fulfills.

Augsburger closed the message with a prayer for commitment.

10. Special Music

The choir, joined by trumpeters sang "Crown Him With Many Crowns". The congregation joined the choir in singing.
