OF THE CANADIAN CONFERENCE OF MENNONITE BRETHREN CHURCHES
Held at Prairie Bible Institute, Three Hills, Alberta
July 9-13, 1982

4. Moderator's Message: D.E. Redekop brought the Conference Message as follows:

The theme of this convention is "Lengthen your cords and strengthen your stakes", Isaiah 52:2.

This is an expansionist theme. It talks of growth, of multiplication. It is interesting that our convention, with a theme like this, should take place in a province that has had the greatest expansion of any province in the last few years. Alberta has been the envy of many of the other provinces. Indeed, they have called you many names such as, "the blue-eyed Arabs", and it has been said that there are only two kinds of people in Canada, those who are in Alberta and those who wish they were. When most of the other parts of the country were in recession, Alberta was still booming, mostly because of the energy crisis.

What is of interest to me is how quickly things can and do change. Who would have dreamt two years ago that we would have an oil glut on the market in July of 1982? As a matter of fact, some countries such as Mexico, Nigeria and some middle east countries, are in great financial difficulty because they had anticipated their oil revenue would continue to flow and increase and, therefore, their expenditures could increase accordingly. However, their revenue started to decline, whereas their expenditures continued to increase and so the difficulty. The irony of it all is that now, quite often, both the producer and the consumer are in trouble. The producer because he cannot sell for the price he had hoped to, and the consumer because he cannot buy due to a shortage of money and high interest rates. Furthermore, the recession is now not only restricted to Canada, but is really worldwide.

Today we are living in a world of business slow-down, failures and bankruptcies; and while businesses collapse, hundreds and thousands of employees are thrown out of work. Not only does this mean a change of life-style, but for some it means a battle for survival. It also means that many institutions and organizations that are dependent upon those who donate liberally are caught short and are also facing failures.

There are still those in our society who are not affected, but let me assure you that your time is coming too.

In the light of this gloomy economic picture, why then have an expansionist theme like "lengthen your cords and strengthen your stakes"?

Well, for one reason, we did not realize last year that the economy would be that bad this year. Secondly, I think there are some good things we can learn from a time such as this. It is in a time of

great economic trial that businesses are forced to trim all the fat, they are compelled to search for new ways to keep their heads above water. They have to review their past operations and improve them if they can. This would never have come about had times remained good.

On the spiritual level it is much the same. We are told that the blood of the martyrs is the seed of evangelism. My concern would be that we might take a lesson from the economic picture and apply it to our spiritual picture. What we need today is to take a very practical look at our conference and maybe it is no coincidence that I, as lay person, should be the moderator of the conference at this particular time. At the General Conference in St. Catharines last year we were told that the Mennonite Brethren membership in the U.S. and Canada combined had not grown more than 2%. As a matter of fact, I suppose we could pat ourselves on the back and say that in Canada we grew, but across the border they didn't. However, this is little consolation. It is simply not good enough, and that is why we chose the theme, "lengthen your cords and strengthen your stakes".

I find another distressing thing in our Conference and that is that seemingly a number of Mennonite Brethren people really don't know who they are. A story is told of a couple of men walking down the street of one of your cities in Alberta. One asked the other, "Who are the Gideons?" The other answered, "I am not quite sure, but I think they are a tribe of Indians." I'm afraid that if you asked a man on the street who the Mennonite Brethren are, you would get many different answers, depending on what city you were in. If you would consult the Winnipeg Sun newspaper they would tell you that there are two groups of Mennonites, those who have swung over to fundamentalism and those who want to be liberal. I know we cannot go by the public press, nor by the man on the street. But do we, as Mennonite Brethren really know who we are? Is it time for us to take a closer look at what we really believe, for unless we are united, I am afraid that our chances of growth are very slim.

This prompted me to do four things: To list the strengths and weaknesses of our Conference as I see them, and then to look at the stakes that we as Mennonite Brethren have, and to see how we could lengthen the cords.

What then are the strengths of the Mennonite Brethren as I see them?

- 1) We have more young people in our churches than any other denomination of its size. These young people are our future church. I have tried to observe churches that have unfortunately fallen by the wayside and, invariably, they are churches who lack young people. I believe at this time we should say a special thank you to the Christian Ed. Board for what they, under God, have been able to accomplish. I will never forget the first gathering at Banff when people were rather dubious as to whether this could ever be a success, questioning our motive and our ability to make such a gathering a spiritual one. The end result of it was not only the rededication of scores of young people at Banff, but also the tremendous impact they made on the churches as they returned home.
- Another strength that we as Mennonite Brethren have is our singing and choirs. As one who has visited many different churches

through my association with the Christian Businessmen I have come to really appreciate the music in our Mennonite Brethren churches. Well do I remember the large Saengerfests that have done so much to upgrade music. I have a son and daughter-in-law living in an area where there is no M.B. Church. They just recently remarked on how the music and singing was no comparison to that which they were used to in the Mennonite Brethren church.

- 5) Our Sunday Schools is another strength we have. Whereas there is much room for improvement, nevertheless the teaching of the Word of God is still stronger in our churches than in many others. Our Christian Ed committees of both provincial and Canadian conferences have helped greatly through Sunday School conventions and have done much to help the Sunday Schools in the churches. Our Bible Schools have given many of our Sunday School teachers their first teaching and training lessons.
- 4) The preaching in our churches is also a definite strength. Again we would have to admit that here too is room for improvement. However, again we would say that it is much better than in many other places. And in this area we would have to give credit to our seminary, our college, and our Bible schools who have helped tremendously in this respect. This area we want to strengthen through the appointment of the Conference Minister. Also the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns, as well as the college, have been involved in special ministers courses. Other courses are being planned.
- 5) The fifth strength that I would like to mention is that in spite of ever increasing failure in family life, we can be thankful to God that at this time the Christian home is still a strength with the Mennonite Brethren. Here our children have learned about the Bible, God and salvation. They have also learned on a very practical basis how to choose their priorities. And last, but not least, they have learned a work ethic. If there has been success in these other areas that I have mentioned, it has come largely because of the upbringing that we have received in our homes. May we therefore never underestimate the importance of the home.

There are of course other strengths that we have which time does not permit me to list. Let us, however, be truly thankful to God and to those people who have helped us in our Christian lives.

At this convention we want to institute something new. It is common practice for us to honor those who have gone to be with the Lord and to give them recognition at the communion service which will take place on Sunday evening. At this convention, just prior to the communion service, we want to remember those who have spent many years in the Lord's work, be it in the church or in the conference, and who are now retired. We are admonished in God's Word to honor our teachers and those who have labored and we believe we should recognize these people while they are still living. I have learned in life that you never go wrong by saying thank you. In this case we humbly want to thank God for workers that He has given us and we want to say a thank you to the workers for letting God use them.

What are some of the weaknesses of the Mennonite Brethren? It is never pleasant to mention these, however, if we want to grow it is important that we also learn to know what our weaknesses are. I am sure that not everyone will agree with me as I list them, and that is your prerogative. However, may the weaknesses not discourage us but may we rather in a humble way pray to God for strength to overcome them. What then are our weaknesses?

- Very slow or no growth. There are other denominations that have grown faster than we have (Pentecostals).
- 2) The inability to relate effectively to non-Mennonites in order to win them to Christ. We have learned to deal with those outside of our circle in the business and professional world and even in the social world. However, it seems to be difficult for us to relate to them on the spiritual level.
- 3) Under-utilization of our resources and abilities. It is said that the average person uses less than 5% of his mental capacity. I believe our record might be better than the average in this area, however, that is not what I am talking about. I believe what the world is looking for is someone who can go out in faith and utilize a far greater amount of his time, ability and money than we have done. I am sure if we did that BOMAS would not have any shortage of personnel or money.
- 4) We still have very few actual soul-winners in our ranks. In comparison to other churches I do not think our record is all that bad. However, as an evangelical conference it might well behoove us to take a hard look in this area and see what we could do to strengthen it

In the light of these strengths and weaknesses, what then is the state of our Conference? Well, we ought to think God for the many good things. However, this is no time to pause for an encore but rather to forge ahead.

This is a year of change and therefore a good time to make a new start. Among the changes we have:

- 1) A new President for our college, David Ewert
- 2) A new Conference Minister, Henry Brucks
- 3) A new Executive Director of Evangelism, James Nikkel
- 4) A new Executive Director for Christian Ed, Ron Penner. (I understand that Christian Ed is looking for a replacement for Ron, since he will be studying in a year's time.)

This then is an excellent time to take a hard look at our existing programs so as to improve them where necessary or even institute new programs to meet the needs of this day and age. If we want to expand in the future we must start now, and there is no better way to start than to look at what we have at present. And this brings me to our main theme, "Lengthen your cords and strengthen your stakes". In order to lengthen our cords we must first of all strengthen our stakes. What are our stakes and how can we strengthen them? I believe that we have at least four stakes that have become very precious to me and which are basic to us as Mennonite Brethren.

1) A clear-cut conversion. There is no building of a spiritual life unless there is life in the first place. As I read about the beginning of the Mennonite Brethren in 1860, one thing was very clear and that was that here was a group of people who were very much aware of their salvation in Jesus Christ. They had a new life and nobody could mistake it. They had also been brought up in a Mennonite home

and there were those who automatically, seemingly, had grown into the church. Here, however, was a group of people who made the distinction that in order to take communion and belong to the church you must have new life in Jesus Christ. I believe that this is a stake that must be strengthened and that it must be known to everyone that whereas we are people who are concernced about the third world and want to help others, we are people who have accepted Jesus Christ as our own personal Saviour and therefore we help and give in the name of Christ. John 14:6, Jesus said, "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life."

2) The second stake that has become precious to me is God's Word, the Bible, as central authority. Here I want to be understood correctly. I sincerely believe that if Menno Simmons should come back today he would point us right back to the Bible because that was his authority. Our authority is, then, not the anabaptist theology, not Menno Simmons, but indeed the Bible. This too is a stake that must be strengthened and, although we may disagree on the interpretation of certain passages, there can be no disagreement on the important areas such as salvation through Jesus Christ alone, and the fact that God is the Creator of heaven and earth.

There is, however, another area that I would like to stress under this stake. That is the fact that I believe we must not only preach the Word from the pulpit and teach in Sunday School, but we must encourage individual members to read the Bible on a daily basis and to become so familiar with it that he or she automatically goes back to God's Word for direction in daily life. Joshua 1:8.

5) Stake #3 would be, in my opinion, the Christian family. Again, this is a stake that is coming under great pressure these days. Because of the importance of it, Satan has his designs to destroy it and, unfortunately, in many cases he has been successful. In order for us as Mennonite Brethren to lengthen our cords I can assure you that they will not hold unless we can strengthen the stake of the family.

To me it was interesting as I visited my cousin in Germany, who had just come from Russia, when she related to me her experiences of growing up under Communism and how difficult it had been not only to receive Christian education (and that only at her mother's knee) but also to live a Christian life. I thank God that he took her through this very difficult time. It showed me that in the last analysis it was only the home that held when everything else gave way and even the churches were closed. Somehow we need to re-emphasize not only the family altar, but good communication within the family at a time such as this.

4) My fourth stake is the Church. Those of you who are acquainted with Toffler's two books, "Future Shock" and "The Third Wave", will know that in "The Third Wave" he projects that in the future the the large gatherings, including religious gatherings, may be a thing of the past due to the energy crisis as well as the computer. As I read his first book "Future Shock", shortly after I suffered the accident in which my wife was killed, I said to myself that Toffler understood many things about human nature, however, the one thing that he did not take into consideration was the power of God in the life of the born-again believer. I believe the same consideration is omitted in "The Third Wave". I believe that, as Christians, we are going to come together no matter how bad the economy gets or what persecution

we may experience. We will get together though it may be in the catacombs as the early Christians did. What I am saying is that the fellowship of Christians is of immense importance. We must raise our children in such a way that going to church on Sunday is never a question, it is automatic. As adults we must be careful to practice this on a very regular basis. This, too, is a stake that needs to be strengthened, especially in today's world where Sunday is more and more becoming a day like all the rest.

How can we strengthen these stakes?

Well, the first stake of conversion can best be strengthened by getting new converts into the church. There is nothing that excites a church more than the addition of young Christians, newly born again, who are excited about their new life in Christ. An example is the Quebec churches and the northern Manitoba and B.C. churches. The matter of winning souls to Christ should receive a much higher priority in our churches. Let us not be afraid to enlist the help of other agencies that have been more successful in soul-winning than we have. I believe that we, in the Conference, must have evangelistic services from time to time, but we must also train the people in evangelism.

How can we strengthen the second stake? Well, if we are successful in strengthening the first stake I can assure you that we will be successful in strengthening the second. For it is the young converts that are very keen on Bible study. I speak from my experience with the Christian businessmen. I believe that churches should start home Bible studies as these have been proven to be very successful. Again using an illustration from the largest church in the world in Seoul, Korea, who in 1977 had over 2,000 home Bible study groups.

Here I am looking forward to the work of the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns as well as our Seminary, our College and Bible schools in the training of pastors and church workers. May they bring in a new emphasis and vision of the Scriptures and the importance thereof.

Number three. How can we strengthen the home? Here I believe we are looking at two boards in particular - the Board of Christian Education and the Board of Evangelism. May you come up with very practical ways to aid not only in family devotions, but also with daily concerns that the family is facing, such as what to do about T.V.. How do you control it? What about the cinema? What about other problems such as social drinking, dating, etc.? Some of these areas will have to be dealt with by the Conferenct at large.

Number four. How can we strengthen the church? As already indicated, we now have a conference minister and I trust that in the coming year the churches will avail themselves of his services. I hope they will call on him for advice and consultation. I hope that churches in a brotherly way will try to help each other. I might also say that I believe that each church should be open to outreach and have an outreach committee, and should encourage its members to go and start a new church. Incidentally, Portage Avenue M.B. Church, our Church, has started two new churches since we built on Portage Avenue, and we are now bigger than ever. This does work.

Having strengthened our stakes, how then can we lengthen our cords? It is, of course, of no use to lengthen our cords unless our stakes are strong. The very fact that we have strong stakes will attract many people who are looking for a church or fellowship with a conviction based on the Word of God and members who are willing to live by it.

I shall never forget the founder of this Institution. Some years ago, when he told us of his interview with CBC TV, at which time they questioned him about the rigid discipline of Prairie Bible Institute he told them the story of a coupld who had just returned from the mission field. This couple had been former students of his and so were very happy to meet Brother Maxwell and share some of their experiences with him. One of the first things they wanted to do, however, was to thank him for the strict rules that he had always insisted on at Prairie Bible Institute. You see, after the first year at Prairie Bible Institute, they had fallen in love with each other and when they came back for the second year they thought they would get special privileges. However that was not the case. So in desperation they both went to the President, Brother Maxwell, and begged him to be a little more lenient. However, he made no exceptions and they were forced to choose whether they wanted to finish school or leave. They decided to finish school and now thanked him for it. They said, "If you had not been strict with us we are sure that we would never have gone to the mission field."

The world is looking to see Christianity in action. They are watching the Christians more closely than you and I sometimes think. There are also many Christians who are observing each other and would like to get involved in a church that still takes discipline and discipleship seriously.

Another way, of course, to lengthen our cords will be to simply be bold and go out, winning others to Christ and getting them involved in the church. In this respect some of our Conference boards, such as the Board of Evangelism and the Board of Christian Education, can be of great help to us. They do have outreach suggestions and programs. Why don't you invite them to your church? The Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns is very interested in outreach, and, of course, we have our Conference minister who is trained in outreach and would be happy to come to your church to assist in any way he can.

There are also many para-church organizations that specialize in outreach and are willing to help. Let us not be too afraid to use their services. If we are going to grow we will have to enlist the rank and file members of our churches.

I am convinced that some people have a particular gift in winning people to Christ. I am also convinced that we have lay-people in our churches who possibly have this gift and do not know it. They should be enlisted. I am glad that in some churches these people are being approached. I believe that this area chould be strengthend and improved.

There are two important areas that are very basic and essential to lengthening the cords. These two areas are: 1) dedication in love, and 2) prayer.

On June 27 of this year, I was privileged to take in two very meaningful services. The first was the honoring of Mother Theresa of Calcutta. I had visited one of her orphanages in Calcutta. This Sunday she was being honored gy the St. Boniface Heart Foundation, who makes it a practice to honor some outstanding personality each year. Twenty thousand (20,000) people had come to witness the ceremony. Here was a small 71 year old Yugoslavian nun who had spent

some time as a teacher and then decided to devote the rest of her life to the poorest of the poor, the orphans and the dying of Calcutta, India. Practicing and showing love, she translated that love into practical help. While in India I entered business offices in which her picture hung next to that of the Prime Minister. This is a demonstration of what one person can do through love.

During the afternoon of that same day I was privileged to attend the centennial service of the Salvation Army Congress where over 6,000 Salvation Army people from all parts of the world had gathered. It was again a demonstration of what phenominal outreach is possible when someone dedicates himself to Jesus Christ and translates that love into practical work.

When it comes to prayer I can never forget Korea. It was my privilege to speak at a Christian school to 5,000 high school girls. This was only one school. The man who started it all had over 13,000 students in three different schools. One night he told me his life story. He had promised God while on the Death March to Manchuria, where most of his fellow prisoners died, that if He would bring him back alive he would devote his life to the cause of teaching his people and bringing them the Gospel. God granted him his wish and I sensed that I was speaking to a great man of prayer, with a tremendous dedication to Jesus Christ.

At this convention we have instituted the Early Morning Watch. There will be five places where we can gather every morning at 7:00 for a very short devotion and prayer. May I suggest that you all take part in these early morning prayer meetings. You see, you may think 7:00 is early, but in Korea they get up at 4:30 a.m. to go to prayer meetings.

The Lord Jesus said, "The fields are ripe unto harvest. Pray ye therefore for workers." The fields in our churches and in our communities are very ripe unto harvest and we will also have to pray for workers. We should pray for unity and wisdom. We are living in perilous world conditions. Who knows whether we, the Mennonite Brethren Conference, have not been called for such a time as this. We must not fail. We will not fail if we will go out in dedication to Jesus Christ and in love to Him and our fellowmen. We will not fail if we make it a matter of real prayer and dependence on His power.

5. Executive Committee Report: The moderator, D.E. Redekop reviewed the official report.

PREPARING FOR NEW GROWTH

The 1981-82 conference year could be entitled the year of change. Many things have transpired in the last 12 months. The conference has a new minister, Brother Henry Brucks; a new college president, Brother David Ewert; a new executive director of Evangelism, Brother James Nikkel. Another position that will be changing is the position of executive director of Christian Education, since Brother John Unger has resigned. To those who have stepped down or taken another position, such as Brother P.R. Toews, Brother Henry Krahn, Brother Henry Brucks, and Brother John Unger, we say a hearty thank you for a job well done. We wish them God's continuous presence and blessing for

the future and trust that they will be in the service of the Lord for many more years.

Our theme this year is very fitting for the year of change. "Lengthen your cords and strengthen your stakes" represent the preparation for new growth. It was evident at the General Conference convention in St. Catharines last fall that the percentage of growth of the Mennonite Brethren was less than satisfactory. In an article by Leslie Tarr entitled "The Canadian Church Caught in Decline," he points out that in 1956, 61 percent of Canadians said they had attended church during the previous week. In 1978, that percentage was reduced to 35 percent. In searching for the reason, he concludes that if the church opts for the secular humanist emphasis it may well engage in self-liquidation. We trust that this convention will stimulate, inspire and enthuse us to dedicate ourselves more completely to Jesus Christ and, thereby, see a mighty outpouring of His Holy Spirit upon our conference which, in turn, will result in growth.

The past year has also brought a change in representation to Mennonite Central Committee. Our representation was changed from 4 to 5 persons. Our method of choosing these representatives was also changed. At the last convention we decided that from now on the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns was to appoint these members to MCC. I believe this has been a good move for, under this set-up, the MCC representatives will always be familiar with what is happening in the conference and the conference will also be kept up to date with what is happening in MCC. As one of the five representatives I have enjoyed my fellowship with the other Mennonites and believe that by and large MCC is doing a good job. I am confident that our Mennonite Brethren concerns that we, as conference, may have can now be better represented.

As moderator I have received a number of letters and invitations from individuals and organizations that are not affiliated with us but who may have some spiritual and social concerns which are of interest to us. May I just list some of them.

Evangelical Fellowship of Canada held their annual meeting in Toronto last winter. Our secretary, Cornie Rempel, who lives in Kitchener, was able to attend that meeting and brought us a favorable report.

The $\underline{\text{Pro-Life}}$ representative in Winnipeg has met with me and, as a result, the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns has dealt favorably with their concerns.

The <u>Umsiedler Organization of Germany</u> has asked us to send a speaker to their <u>Umsiedlertreffen</u> on <u>July</u> 17th. The expenses in Europe are taken care of by them and the trip is parially funded by MCC. Brother Victor D. Toews has been asked and will be representing us at that occasion. It was my privilege to visit a number of the <u>Umsiedler churches while</u> in <u>Germany last November-December</u>. I believe that we have an obligation to our brothers and sisters there and am happy that Brother Toews will be going.

It will also be our privilege to hear one of their speakers, Brother Bernard Dyck, who is expected to be at our convention this year and who will be addressing us sometime during the convention.

Being a year of change, we have brought in several new things this year:

1) We will be having an early Morning Watch, which will take place Saturday, Monday and Tuesday from 7:00 - 7:30 a.m. There will

be five different meeting places each morning, each with its own leader. May we urge you all to participate in this early Morning Watch.

Growth without prayer is inconceivable.

2) We will be submitting the names of some who have served God and us during their many years in our conference, just prior to the communion service on Sunday evening. We want to humbly thank God for them, but also say a thank you to them at that particular time. We are fully aware that this will only be a small list and that there are many hundreds who are not mentioned. Nevertheless, let these few represent the many and let us learn to say thank you to God and to these persons while they are still living.

3) We will again be showing films, but this time not during the workshop periods. Rather, they will be conveniently spaced at times

when you may not have anything else to do.

May I, at this time, say thank you to all who have supported me and the executive through prayer and encouragement. We really appreciate that. We are merely human servants who want to serve God first of all, and then the conference and the churches. Our greatest reward would be to see our brotherhood go all out in dedication to Jesus Christ so that, truly, we would have to "lengthen our cords and strengthen our stakes" because of the great influx of born again believers into our congregations.

Upon motion the report was accepted.

Supplementary: A supplementary report was given by the secretary about the vote on the constitution changes as follows:

On March 9, 1982, a letter was sent to all pastors or moderators of our Canadian Conference advising them of the proposed Constitution changes as presented to our 1981 Convention. (See pages 145-146 of our 1981 Canadian Conference Yearbook). The members of the Council of Boards, at their session in Winnipeg, Manitoba, on January 30, 1982, approved these changes which were then submitted to the congregations for an official vote, with the results to be sent in by June 18, 1982.

As of July 8, 1982, 49 congregations had responded, which represents approximately 1/3 of the churches, with the following results:

- 1. Regarding MCC (Canada) Representation Yes No Accepted
 - a) That the official Canadian Mennonite
 Brethren representatives on MCC (Can.)
 Board shall constitute a committee of
 the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns.

 2249 46 98%
 - b) That all MCC (Canada) representatives shall be appointed by the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns and that at least two of the appointees be members of the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns.

 2071 144 93%
 - c) That no official MCC (Canada) repre-

sentative may serve in that
position for more than two consecutive four-year terms; however a person may subsequently
be re-appointed. 2272 52 98%

d) That one of the MCC (Canada)
representatives shall be designated as chairman of the Board
of Spiritual and Social Concerns'
MCC(Canada) committee and that
this chairman must always be a
member of the Board of Spiritual
and Social Concerns. 2219 59 97%

2. Regarding Delegate Status for Council of Boards Members

2177 30 97%

Several congregations raised some concerns, and in fairness to these four churches we are listing their comments for your information.

Concerns to Point #1

- a) The changes seem too mandatory.
- b) These changes could give too much power and authority to one Board, and the Conference could lose valuable input and feedback from MCC representatives themselves.
- c) These changes could lead to a reduced constituency interest in MCC. In future elections it should be borne in mind that some nominations which will be made to this Board are made for possible MCC appointments by this Board.
- d) A recommendation came to us that the MCC (Canada) representatives become a full-fledged Board of the Canadian Conference. We suggested that this recommendation be submitted directly to the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns.

Concern to Point #2

This could possibly mean that a larger representation could represent individual congregations who have several members on the Council of Boards.

RECOMMENDATION of the Executive Committee:

In view of the large affirmative vote to the proposed Constitution changes, we move:

"That the proposed Constitution changes be adopted and that the Constitution be changed accordingly."

Upon motion, the report and the recommendation were accepted.

6. Mennonites in Canada, Volume 2:

Frank Epp, author, was present and spoke briefly about this volume which is available to delegates at a considerable saving. He shared his feelings regarding the research and the writing of this story.

Closing: After a few announcements, the meeting closed with prayer by Abe Block.

BUSINESS SESSION #2 - Saturday Morning, July 10, 1982

Chairman: D.E. Redekop

Song Service: Abe Block led in the singing of "Praise the Lord" and the Conference theme song, "Lengthen Thy Gords and Strengthen Thy Stakes."

Special Music: An octet from Community Christian Fellowship of Fort McMurray, Alberta, sang: "Let Hymns of Joy to Grief Succeed" and "Perfect is Your Love".

Testimony: Nick Dyck of Clearbrook, B.C. led in prayer and then introduced Dan Balinsky, a deputy sheriff of Vancouver, member of the Eagle Ridge Bible Fellowship, who has recently become a believing Christian. He shared the experiences leading up to his conversion experience and his subsequent spiritual growth.

Special Music: The octet from Fort McMurray sang "He's Always with Me".

Congregational Singing: Abe Block led in the singing of "Open our Eyes, Lord".

7. Board of Management: Art Block summarized the official report as it appears in the special conference publication. He called on various individuals to highlight some aspects of the total report.

On behalf of the Board of Management we greet the Conference with Lamentations 3:22-23, "It is of the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed, because his compassions fail not. They are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness."

The Board of Management has been charged with a number of responsibilities by the Canadian Conference of Mennonite Brethren

Churches. These include:

- 1) The administration and supervision of all physical assets of the Conference.
- 2) Preparation and presentation of the Conference budget, as well as exercising budget control.

3) The maintenance of Conference offices.

- Providing salary increase schedules for Conference personnel.
- 5) Appointing a treasurer who shall receive full custody and disperse all funds under the supervision of the Board.

In the exercise of these duties the Board has experienced the full cooperation of other boards and Conference personnel. We are thankful that the churches of the Canadian Conference have responded most generously to the 1981-82 budget. Our treasurer reports, all things being equal, that the income will cover expenditures even though income will not reach budget expectations. Prudent control by the various boards has also kept expenditures below the proposed budget.

At the January Council of Boards meeting, after some careful consideration about the state of the economy, the Board felt it timely to suggest to all other boards that they exercise restraint in planning their 1982-83 budget and recommended a 10% increase over last year's budget. The board further recommends that wage increases for Conference personnel be held to the rate of inflation. The four-year history of salary increases for Conference workers is as follows:

Year	Salary Increases	Inflation Rate
1978-79	6%	9%
1979-80	8%	9.1%
1980-81	10%	11%
1981-82	10% + \$1,000	11.9 %
1982-83 (Proposed)	12%	12.1%

These figures indicate that increases have not exceeded inflation in the past.

The Board is, however, concerned about the increased financial burden being placed on the constituency. Church membership is receiving increased pressure for giving from various levels of church programs. Our numerous education programs through day schools, high schools, Bible schools, colleges and seminary are and will place a heavy financial load on our churches if we are to maintain a standard of excellence which will attract students. In addition, the churches are moving toward more local programs requiring increased staff and facilities. Church building programs and the development of camp facilities are adding further burdens of capital and interest payments. The generosity of our brotherhood is further challenged by worthy programs outside of our brotherhood through TV, radio and other programs.

We, therefore, caution delegates to carefully weigh and approve programs which the constituency is willing and able to support.

Bethesda Home for the Mentally Handicapped

At Bethesda we are constantly aware of our greatest dependance on God's goodness and in particular His guidance and help. I'm sure this was true when the Canadian Conference became involved in this service some 35 years ago, and it's good to know that God continues to show us the way we need to go and the decisions we need to make even today. May we be found faithful to Him in our service to others!

The emphasis for service is found in our Christian experience - extending Christ's love to others. Now there is a new dimension to our Christian emphasis in training the mentally handicapped entrusted to our care.

1. The schedule II facilities of our region working with mentally retarded people have decided to share common experiences and be of assistance to each other. This will be accomplished through

regularly scheduled meetings attended by administrators, senior personnel and board members of these facilities. The first of such meetings was held in March at which time Mr. Peter Barnes, assistant to the deputy Minister, was the guest speaker. It became quite apparent that there is a greater emphasis at Ministry level of accountability, especially in the areas of services and the costs thereof. This emphasis is directed not only to the schedule II facilities, but also to the schedule I's, other service agencies, and the Ministry itself. Mr. Barnes was quite emphatic about the financial constraints and the need for the facilities to work out their budgets accordingly.

2. In the Niagara Region a number of agencies extend specialized services to the local mentally handicapped. Representation from each of these agencies, the local COMOSOC, and an appointed chairperson make up what is called the "Niagara Region Working Group." Much planning for services to the mentally handicapped of this region is done by this group, which has considerable respect from the officials at the Ministry itself. As of April 1 of this year Bethesda is formally represented on this Working Group and so will hopefully also extend a helpful service influence into the community at large, and benefit from the advantage of greater community planning services to the mentally handicapped. This greater involvement in community services will require that Bethesda have a broader spectrum of professionals on staff. We now have a Christian psychologist on staff, but there are others we will require for continued improvement of our services as well as those extending into the community.

Through my associations with Ministry and Working Group people it has become very evident that the service performance of Bethesda is held in very high regard. This reputation cannot be taken for granted but has been earned over the years under the continued effort of administration and dedicated staff to combine excellence with Christian love for the benefit of those whom we serve.

There seem to be many more possibilities of service to the mentally handicapped of the community than those already in place at Bethesda. Unfortunately, it seems very difficult to find the appropriate professionals (speech therapists, physiotherapists, etc.) with Christian persuasions - particularly of our own Mennonite Brethren denomination. May we encourage our young people to also consider such professions when planning their educational program.

May we continue to become aware of opportunity for serviceand be willing and able to take up the challenge of Christian ser-

vice - to the glory of God and benefit for others.

Upon motion, all reports were accepted.

The budget was then distributed to the delegates for information only.

Recommendations: The following recommendations were presented:

- a) Re: Personnel "We recommend that the numbers of personnel employed by the Canadian Conference of M.B. Churches be reduced (and/or held to a minimum) wherever possible."
- b) Re: Terminology for budget support "We recommend that the terms conference dues, norms, or levies (Steuer) be replace with the more positive term of 'conference ministries support'."
- c) Re: Church participation in 'conference ministries support'

 "We recommend that a statement on conference ministries support be forwarded to each church directly or through the provincial treasurer. This shall take place on a monthly basis."
- d) Re: Implementation of salary changes "We recommend that any salary change for each fiscal year should be implemented after the Conference acceptance of its budget not before. All changes then to be adjusted retroactively."

Upon motion, these recommendations were accepted.

Notice of Amendment of Constitution

"That the Constitution of the Canadian Conference be amended to exclude the assets and liabilities administered by the Board of Stewards of the General Conference from the responsibilities of the Board of Management of the Canadian Conference."

Upon motion this notice of amendment was approved for distribution and will be sent to the churches for an official vote with an adequate preamble as to the reason for such a change."

Arthur Block gave the following explanation and reason for such a notice of amendment:

Rationale for Notice of Motion

Following the passing of the Canadian Charities Act by the Government of Canada, the General Conference of M.B. Churches requested the Canadian Conference of M.B. Churches to incorporate under its constitution the functions of the Board of Missions and the Board of Trustees. This action was necessary to legalize the charitable donations to Missions and Services and to the Endowment Fund, as well as the functions of the Board of Trustees.

Constitutional amendments were effected at both conference levels. The General Conference by consitutional amendment reimburses by indemnity agreement the Canadian Conference for all financial liabilities created by these actions.

However, the constitutional changes that would provide for parallel changes within the Canadian Conference structure were not made. Presently the Canadian Conference Board of Management is responsible for all assets, liabilities and operational funds of the Conference. This has resulted in an overlapping of responsibilities between the Board of Stewardship (General Conference

Board of Trustees) and the Canadian Conference Board of Management.

The purpose of this motion is to clarify the responsibilities of the Canadian Conference Board of Management and the Board of Stewardship (General Conference Board of Trustees). The consequence will be to eliminate the responsibilitiy for the assets and liabilities of the Board of Stewardship (General Conference Board of Trustees) from the responsibilities of the Canadian Conference Board of Management. The assets and liabilities of the Board of Stewardship (General Conference Board of Trustees) will continue to be supervised and managed by the General Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches Board of Trustees.

Song Service: Abe Block led in the singing of "Who is on the Lord's Side?"

- Fraternal Delegate: John Toews, representing the Evangelical Mennonite Conference brought greetings on behalf of his conference. He read 1 Thess. 1:2-3.
- 8. Devotions: David Ewert, newly appointed president of MBBC, read

 Mark 3:13-15, and made some comments. He called this the charter of christian education. Jesus called those whom He wanted as His disciples His apostles. These followers He wanted to be with Him to equip them for further service. The apostles were to be leaders of the new people of God. He concluded his remarks by speaking of his goals for MBBC. He solicited the support of the constituency in gifts and prayer.
- 9. Board of Higher Education: Abe Konrad, chairman, summarized his report as printed in the Conference issue. He called on others to supplement this official report.

Together with the psalmist, we raise a voice of thanksgiving: "His love endures forever" (Ps. 118:1). Our work in higher education during the past year was blessed by the enduring love of God, manifested both at Mennonite Brethren Bible College and in our larger conference ministries.

We invite you to examine our work as reflected in the report on MBBC by president Krahn and on other matters contained in this presentation.

President's Report:

The question which occupies my mind as I review the experiences of the past year is: how can we, the representatives of MBBC, express our gratitude to God and to His people in an appropriate manner? It is all too easy to take for granted such blessings as a healthy enrollment, a spirited and competent faculty, and a supporting constituency. As we report on the developments of MBBC, we desire to do this in the context of Paul's statement: "In everything give thanks."

Thankfulness to God is always appropriate, but no matter how profusely expressed it remains no more than an expression of religious politeness unless it is an expression of active and willing response to God's leading. This applies not only to the life of a Christian, but also to a Christian community and a Christian college. The gratitude expressed in this report is based on an awareness that the ministry at the College has been

the result of an openness to God's leading and guidance, and an active and willing response to it.

PROGRAM OF STUDIES AND FACULTY MATTERS

The 1981-82 year was one of consolidation and implementation at MBBC. During the recent years there has been extensive review of the College program. As a result of this review certain changes in the program were implemented and other aspects of it were strengthened.

For the past ten years the College has required all students to participate in a core program of courses in Bible, Theology, Church History, and Contemporary Ministries. There were a wide variety of courses which met the requirements of the program. The new core program, implemented in 1981-82, limited the choice of courses within this core to insure that all students were being exposed to a common body of material basic to understanding the Christian faith within our church tradition. During the year the faculty have also spent time in reviewing this new core porgram in order to assure that it meets the objectives which have been set for it.

One of the strengths of the College is its faculty. During the past two years several faculty members have left the College for other ministries, and others have joined the faculty. The continuity provided by the faculty who have remained at the College, and the new stimulation of those who have joined recently have contributed to a faculty with a strong sense of mutual commitment and shared purpose. Two faculty members will be on leave in 1982-83. A former faculty member, David Ewert, will become preseident of MBBC on July 1, 1982, and a present faculty member, Abe Dueck, will become academic dean on the same date. These appointments will provide a strong sense of continuity and collegial identity among faculty as we look towards the new school year in the autumm of 1982.

STUDENT LIFE

We are also grateful for a gifted, enthusiastic student body. Led by a competent and dedicated student organization, MBBC students were able to provide a variety of school activities ranging from the academic to the athletic, and from the social to the spiritual.

The recently-renovated "Whitehouse" was used as a student centre this year which provided not only space for student council offices but opportunity for casual interaction in the lounge and TV room as well.

A primary component in the development of community on campus was the dedicated leadership provided by dormitory counsellors. An atmosphere of warmth and mutual support prevailed in the residences. The Bible study groups (some 15-20) contributed to the spiritual vitality of dorm life.

To a gratifying degree we have experienced the spirit of Ephesians 4:11 on our campus. Gifted leadership from faculty and students alike provided the necessary motivation and preparation for the body to build itself up in the faith and to exercise Christian ministry in a variety of settings.

ENROLLMENT STATISTICS

Total student enrollment this past year was 205, marking

the seventh straight year with an enrollment over 200 (see accompanying seven year resume). Total course enrollment was proportionately higher this year than it was in the preceding six years. Full-time students continue to outnumber part-timers 107 to 98, and returning students this year outnumbered newcomers 112 to 93.

About 65 percent of this year's students were of Mennonite Brethren affiliation; 33 percent of the students have Bible institute background, male students modestly outnumber females 115 to 90, and the mean age remains at 21.

There were ten non-Canadian students this past year. The Canadians came from the following areas: Alberta-14, British Columbia-33, Manitoba-109 (most of them part-time), Nova Scotia-1, Ontario-29, Saskatchewan-8, and the Yukon-1.

All of these numbers indicate an institutional strength and health for which we express gratefulness to God and the Conference.

CHRISTIAN SERVICE

MBBC believes that the call of Christ is to discipleship. This discipleship involves both learning and service. The College offers all students a supervised Christian Service program. An attempt is made to integrate this service with the students' academic program. career goals, and perception of their gifts.

All students are required to participate in the Christian Service program during the school year. During the summer months a good number of students become involved in church ministries. This year some 16 students left College with plans to spend a major part of the summer in a variety of service settings. In addition to these, nine students are involved in a summer program of field education. Their services range from pastoral internships to camp counselling. One student is spending this summer in Japan with the Language Institute for Evangelism.

A student, commenting on his Christian Service experience, wrote, "I learned that spiritual leadership is not easy, and that it takes a special kind of person to do a real good job. I learned that almost everyone (if not everyone) is dealing with some kind of problem. It takes a lot of perseverance to help others when you yourself need help."

We thank God for the expressed desire of faculty and students to be Christ's servants. We are also grateful for the leadership provided by Isaac Block in this important aspect of College life.

BUILDINGS AND FINANCES

We have also experienced the goodness of God and the faithfulness of His people in financial matters. While individuals, churches, businesses and institutions experienced severe financial hardship, we are pleased to report that the financial position of the College at the end of this school year is in line with budgetary expectations.

MBBC students continue to carry a major share of their educational costs. Tuition fees at the College are considerably higher than at the Manitoba universities. Students at MBBC who face financial difficulties may obtain assistance from a variety of sources. These are: Canada Student Loans, government bursaries, MBBC bursaries, loans and scholarships, and support from

the home church. We are especially pleased that a growing number of churches are assisting their students financially.

The College administration has been given the responsibility to raise funds for the College. During this past year funds in the budgetary category of "Churches and Individuals" were received from three major sources: congregations, support suppers, and individuals. We are encouraged by the number of churches who continue to designate two annual church offerings for MBBC. There are other churches which designate a budgeted amount. In addition, we are grateful for the generous response to the six support suppers that were held in various parts of Canada. These not only benefited the College financially, but gave us opportunity to fellowship with church communities. We are also pleased to report that a major source of revenue for the College is a growing list of MBBC friends who make regular contributions to our operational budget.

As we look ahead to the 1982-83 year, we are aware of the predictions that economic conditions will remain much as they were during the past year. The proposed budget is one that maintains the status quo. Expenditures are being held to the inflation rate- tuition fees and conference support has been raised by approximately 12 percent. Although it seems prudent to exercise restraint for the present, it is important to remind the Conference that some of the facilities on campus are in need of repair, and that others are in need of replacement. We do have the confidence that these needs will be met in the near future.

Henry G. Krahn, MBBC President

During the past eight years, Henry Krahn provided presidential leadership at MBBC. We acknowledge with gratitude the faithful service of our brother. The college achieved a measure of stability during these years - in faculty, students, program, and finances. It was also during brother Krahn's presidency that the multipurpose building was added to the campus, along with other facility improvements. The search for a new president and the changeover in institutional leadership was greatly enhanced by brother Krahn's gracious spirit of cooperation. We invite you to join us in expressing our gratitude to Henry for his devoted ministry at MBBC. After a one-year sabbatical, we anticipate brother Krahn's return to a teaching position at the college.

With a deep sense of reliance upon God and our brotherhood, the presidential search culminated at the January meeting of the Council of Boards with a recommendation to call David Ewert to this ministry. Brother Ewert returns to MBBC, and we commend him to your prayers. Not only will brother Ewert continue to teach in the area of Biblical studies during his presidency, he also will be available to serve in a wider preaching ministry within the congregations of our Conference.

A year ago the Conference approved the implementation of a comprehensive evaluation policy at MBBC. An institutional self-study was conducted during the past year, and a descriptive report of its findings will be presented to the board at our July meetings. The report provides an historical overview of college

developments, with emphasis upon the vision of MBBC, governance program, faculty, students, finances and constituency relations. Major issues identified through the self-study will be examined both internally and with constituency involvement during the next year and provide the basis for future planning activities.

A review of campus facilities clearly indicates the pressing need to replace Ebenezer Hall, a residence/dining facility constructed during the first years of the college, During the coming year, a feasibility study will be undertaken to examine alternatives that might be considered by the Conference for campus development.

Several activities were undertaken during the past year to strengthen the sense of togetherness among postsecondary institutions. In August, faculty members from the Bible Institutes joined MBBC faculty members to examine issues related to theological education. In October, administrators and some board chairmen of the high schools, Bible Institutes, MBBC, and the seminary participated in the Manitoba Ministers and Deacons' sessions with Myron Augsburger for a study of "Evangelism and the Home, Church and School." A student services consultation was held in Calgary in March.

Cooperation among the schools within the brotherhood was also seen in the publication of a pamphlet on "Growth" depicting the opportunities for personal growth through education within the Conference.

In examining educational needs and alternative organizational arrangements, the Board has again affirmed a willingness to strengthen the program at MBBC through interinstitutional cooperation. Some teaching areas can be augmented through cooperative sharing of faculty members with institutions like Canadian Mennonite Bible College; other joint ventures may also have the potential of improving our services within the brotherhood. We need the prayerful support of the brotherhood in examining such alternatives.

Alumni interests in MBBC have been nurtured through banquets and other fellowship meetings in various provinces. Major activity this year was focused on the publication of the Alumni Bulletin. Much time and energy went into the "new-look" product that entered alumni homes three times in 1981-82. This "new-look" Bulletin is the first step in a long-term plan to increase alumni involvement in college activities.

The Center for Mennonite Brethren Studies is pleased with the cooperation it is receiving from churches and individuals who are donating historical materials. The preservation of these materials is crucial for documenting the growth of the Mennonite Brethren Conference in Canada. Major acquisitions over the past year were received from the Alberta Conference and several Conference boards. The preservation of this legacy will provide future inspiration and wisdom as the conference expands its mission in the years to come.

The microfilming of the Mennonitische Rundschau has been completed and is available for purchase from University Microfilms of Ann Arbor, Michigan. For more information about this project or other matters of historical interest contact the Conference Archivist, Ken Reddig.

Let us continue to acknowledge the love of God among us,

and let us commit ourselves to the continued support of training opportunities for men and women to enter into effective ministries within our brotherhood.

Summary of Message

Introduction:

God is concerned about the character of His people. Effective evangelism arises out of a church that is marked by godliness. A question from the writings of the late Samuel Shoemaker focus the message: CAN OUR KIND OF CHURCH CHANGE OUR KIND OF WORLD? The question and our texts reveal several assumptions: 1) The aim of God's concern is the world, not only the church 2) The church is

not an end in itself 3) The primary task of the church is mission. Our kind of church can change our kind of world provided we "strengthen our stakes" in four areas to reflect godly character:

I. THE PURSUIT OF GODLINESS

Secularism and humanism are eroding our God-consciousness in culture. The values of success, immediate results and accommodation have also effected our concept of God in the church. Our prayers, worship, evangelism and commitment in western christianity reflects a pragmatic view of God - He is one who gives benefits - He is a God that I use rather than a God whom I worship and serve. The church must renew its view of God, its concept of worship and its pursuit of godliness.

II. A CLEAR UNDERSTANDING OF MAN

A high view of God also gives us a proper perspective of man. The loss of the sacred has two serious implications: 1) It places man at the centre of the stage so he becomes his own God and all kinds of self-help religions emerge. 2) It dehumanizes people so that we lose respect not only for God but for each other. While our culture today is conscious of sin it does tend to define sin primarily as a sociological term - as alienation in human relationships rather than as alienation and separation from God. The church needs to help clarify this distortion in society as well as in its own ranks. Furthermore, the church needs to honestly ask whether we still believe in the lostness of mankind, and that man is lost until he is found.

III. A CLEAR PRESENTATION OF THE MESSAGE OF JESUS

The good news of the gospel centers in Jesus Christ. It is easy for the church to forget that Jesus is the head and foundation of the church. The church belongs to Him, not us. The attraction of the church is not buildings, programs, leaders, but Jesus Christ. The other problem we face is that in our culture the key words are pluralism, tolerance and diversity. The offense of the gospel of Jesus is always twofold: 1) Man can't make it on his own, he is converted through the merits of another - namely the blood of Jesus Christ, and 2) Jesus Christ is the only way to God. In that sense Christianity is very exclusive, but our call is to proclaim a clear message that centres in Jesus.

IV. A CONSISTENT LIFESTYLE

We are called in the church to live responsibly as disciples. This call is reflected in changed lives, lifestyle, mind-set and direction. Today popular religion has little relationship to morality. Discipleship moves us beyond personal privatistic concerns. It must deal with affluence, conspicuous consumption in a world of shrinking resources. The church cannot speak only to issues of private morality but must address the larger issues of world hunger, injustice, military armament, racism. The church is called to live as a new community which means integrity, significant interpersonal relationships and a standing together as a people who build his kingdom.

Special Music: The mass choir sang "Sing Praise to Christ".

Closing: After several announcements J.B. Toews closed the meeting with prayer.

Rev. & Mrs. John G. Baerg

Rev. John G. Baerg was born in 1908. He came to Canada in 1925 and, together with his brothers, settled on a farm in Dominion City, Manitoba.

He attended the Winkler Bible Institute and early revealed a gift for preaching. The Steinbach Bible School asked him to be its principal and for several years he taught there. During this time he was ordained as minister of the Gospel by the Arnaud M.B. Church.

cutive of Saskatchewan for 19 years and the National Board of Colonization for 3 years.

Rev. David Dick was born October 30, 1900 in Apanlee, Russia. he came to Canada in 1924 and began to farm in the Herschel area of Saskatchewan.

In 1929 he was married to Mrs. Katharina Martens. The Dicks celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary a few years ago.

Brother Dick began his preaching ministry in Saskatchewan in 1933 and was ordained as a minister in the Mennonite Brethren Church in 1937. In 1946 the Dick family moved to Niverville, Manitoba, where they continued to farm and where Brother Dick served as minister until retirement a few years ago. For eight years Brother Dick was also the leader of the church. The Dicks now reside in Donwood Manor, Winnipeg.

After the passing of his first wife in 1932, he married Johanna Dick on November 29, 1933.

Rev. Peter Loewen was born in Russia on October 22, 1902. He immigrated to Alberta in 1923. Mrs. Anna (Redekop) Loewen was born on July 22, 1907 in Kronstahl, Russia and also immigrated to Canada in 1923. They were married on May 22, 1932 in British Columbia and are the parents of nine children.

Peter Loewen studied two winters at Herbert Bible School and then went on to Winkler Bible School where he graduated in 1928.

In 1930 they moved to Yarrow where he started the first Bible School in B.C. Here he was ordained to the ministry in 1939 and also served as Sunday School superintendent for 26 years. For 20 years he was the chairman of the B.C. Sunday School committee and served as a member of the Canadian M.B. Sunday School Committee. He served as assistant pastor for many years and is still preaching and an active participant in Conference activities.

Rev. Henry H. Nikkel

Rev. Henry Nikkel was born in Manitoba in 1896. Mrs. Marie (Peters) Nikkel was born in Manitoba in 1899 and went to be with her Lord in 1968. The Nikkels were blessed with five children.

Henry Nikkel began his teaching career in Saskatchewan in 1916 and taught for 26 years until 1944. During these years he also attended the Los Angeles Bible Institute (1921-23) graduating with a diploma in Bible.

In 1944 the Nikkels moved to the Fraser Valley in British Columbia where they began farming. He was invited to teach at the M.E.I. where he taught for three years (1944-47). In 1947 he joined the faculty of the Mennonite Brethren Bible Institute, now known as Columbia Bible Institute. Brother Nikkel served the school for 27 years as teacher and librarian (1947-74).

Brother Nikkel has served on various boards at the provincial, national and General Conference levels. He is known for his pastoral ministry in the Laird and Hepburn communities in Saskatchewan. He served as pastor of the South Abbotsford M.B. Church for four years (1945-49). When the Central Heights M.B. Church was organized in 1950, he became the pastor, serving for eleven years (1950-60).

Brother Nikkel is now a member of the Clearbrook Mennonite Brethren Church.

Rev. & Mrs. George Pries

Rev. Pries was born in Pretoria, Russia in 1908. He received his elementary education there, as well as part of his high school training.

He enrolled at the Winkler Bible Institute in 1927, the year after immigrating to Canada. There he met Lena Kroeker who became his wife in 1934. Rev. & Mrs. Pries have five children.

After completing his education, Rev. Pries taught at the Coaldale Bible School until 1936, when he joined the faculty of Winkler Bible Institute.

In 1941 Rev. Pries was ordained to the ministry and was pastor of the Winkler Mennonite Brethren Church from 1950-1955.

He taught in public high schools for twelve years and in Christian private schools for a total of 27 years, including some part-time teaching of Bibse at Tabox College. He served on various Canadian Conference boards and the Board of Missions and Services.

Rev. & Mrs. Erich L. Ratzlaff

Rev. Erich Ratslaff was born in Poland in 1911. His wife, Lydia Ratzlaff, was also born in Poland in 1912. Their marriage was blessed with six children.

Brother Ratzlaff received his education in Poland where he became a certified teacher. He migrated to Canada in 1948.

After arriving in Canada, Brother Ratzlaff lived on a firm in Arnold, B.C. for several years. He began his teaching career at the Menmonite Educational Institute, Clearbrook, where he served for 13 years (1954-67).

In 1967 he became the editor of the Mennonitische Rundschau where he served for 12 years (1967-79). Brother Ratzlaff is the author of three books.

Though retired, he continued for two and a half years, working on a part-time basis, as speaker for "Familien Andacht", a German radio ministry of Mennonite Brethren Communications; as well as serving as commentator and producer of "Licht des Evangeliums".

Brother Ratzlaff has served as minister of the Word for many years and was ordained to the ministry at the Central M. B. Church in Winnipeg. During the past 30 years Brother Ratzlaff has served on various boards of the provincial and Canadian M.B. Conference.

The Ratzlaffs will be celebrating their 48th wedding anniversary in 1982. They are members of the Clearbrook M.B. Church.

Rev. & Mrs. Henry Regehr

Rev. Henry Regehr was born in South Russia in 1898. His wife, Katharina (Siemens) Regehr, was born in South Russia in 1902. Brother Regehr received his education in Russia and served as elementary school teacher there until the family migrated to Canada, via Mexico, in 1926. The Regehrs have seven children.

Brother Regehr began his extensive teaching career at the Herbert Bible Institute and taught there from 1927-42. Then he taught at the Mennonite Brethren Collegiate Institute in Gretna (1944-47) and at the Mennonite Brethren Collegiate Institute in Winnipeg from 1947-60, except for a period of three years when he served as instructor at the Mennonite Brethren Bible College.

Brother Regehr also served as radio speaker for the German department of the Gospel Light Hour from 1960-72. In addition he has pastored churches in Herbert, Saskatchewan; Vancouver, B.C.; and Niverville, Manitoba.

For many years Brother Regehr served as secretary for the provincial and Canadian Conferences.

Presently, at the age of 84, he still preaches and teaches as opportunities present themselves.

On August 6-8, 1982, the Regehrs, now resident in Clearbrook, B.C., plan to celebrate their 60th wedding anniversary.

Rev. & Mrs. Peter Reimer

Rev. Peter Reimer was born in Russia in 1903 and immigrated to Canada in 1924.

Mrs. Anna(Schellenberg) Reimer was born in Rheinfled, Russia on October 17, 1902, and immigrated to Canada in 1923. Peter and Anna were married in Port Rowan, Ontario on April 10, 1932. God has blessed them with six children.

Peter Reimer graduated from Winkler Bible School and, upon his return to Port Rowan, served as a lay-minister, was ordained and became the pastor and leader of the Port Rowan Church.

His service in the church also included choir director for

many years, as well as singing in mixed and male choirs.

On his retirement from the leadership of the church he preached for several years at the Mennonite Mission Church in Aylmer and Houghton Centre. This was generally in the Low-German language.

This past spring the Reimers celebrated their Golden Wed-

ding anniversary.

Rev. & Mrs. Henry G. Thielman

Rev. Henry Thielman was born on October 15, 1904 in Neukirch, Molotschna. Converted at an early age he was baptized, together with his father, and joined the Allianz Church in Lichtfelde.

He immigrated to Leamington, Ontario in 1926. Here he served in the Sunday School and was elected to the ministry.

He married Lydia Reimer in 1929 and they both graduated

from the Winkler Bible School in 1943.

The Kitchener Church ordained him in 1944. He served as pastor in Kitchener for four years. The Mission Board then called the Thielmans to a three-year ministry in Japan. After returning in 1952 Brother Thielman served the Alberta Conference as city missionary in Calgary for seven years.

His final seven years of pastoring before retirement included four years in Clearbrook and three years in Yarrow. In addition to accepting many preaching engagements in many churches, Brother Thielman also served as a member of the Board of M.B.

Missions.

Rev. & Mrs. Isaac Tiessen

Rev. Tiessen was born in Russia in 1904. Mrs. Anna (Huebert) Tiessen was bron in Russia in 1908.

Brother Tiessen received his high school and business administration education in Russia. In 1925 he moved to Kingsville Ontario. He was ordained to the ministry in 1935 at the Leamington Mennonite Brethren Church.

Brother Tiessen served as pastor in the Leamington Church for 33 years (1925-58). During this time he also served as the Ontario Conference Moderator for ten years. Later he served as pastor of the Broadway Mennonite Brethren Church in Chilliwack for five years (1958-63). He was interim pastor of the Kitchener Mennonite Brethren Church for one year (1964-65) and the Toronto Christian Fellowship Chapel for six and a half years (1965-71). Brother Tiessen also served as the first pastor of the Komoka Community Church for a year and a half while simultaneously serving as chaplain of the Senior Citizen's Homes in the London community from 1971 to the present time.

Most recently Brother Tiessen has been involved in a large

print edition of a hymnal for senior citizens. Over 13,000 copies of the hymnal "Sing Your Way Home" have been sold. It is now being translated into German.

The Tiessens, who now reside in Strathroy, Ontario, are members of the Komoka Community Church. They have been married 57 years and are the parents of four children.

Rev. & Mrs. Abraham A. Unruh

Rev. Abraham A. Unruh was born on November 2, 1903 in South Russia. In 1924 he immigrated to Canada.

He was married to Annie Enns from the Winkler area in 1927. God blessed them with five children.

Rev. Unruh taught Bible school in Dalmeny for five years. However, the Unruh's are best known for their more than 30 years of service in India as missionaries, where God richly blessed them.

In 1972 Mrs. Unruh went to be with the Lord. In 1975 he married Agatha Friesen.

Together the Unruhs have made their home in Waldheim, Saskatchewan, where Brother Unruh is still serving as his health permits. His holy life and unselfish service mark him as a man of God. "Well done, thou good and faithful servant."

Rev. & Mrs. John J. Unger

Rev. John Unger was born in Waldheim, Russia in 1895. After completing his education in the Molotschna he taught school for ten years.

Mrs. Aganetha (Thiessen) Unger was born in Klippenfeld on July 19, 1899. John and Aganetha were married at Waldheim, Russia on May 19, 1920.

In 1925 they immigrated to Manitoba and the following year moved to Alberta. Brother Unger was called to the ministry in the Coaldale M.B. Church in 1933 and was ordained in 1936. After his ordination he taught Bible school for six years and was then called to join an itinerary team of M.B. and G.C. pastors visiting almost every Mennonite church for Bible studies.

He pastored the Kelowna Church for six years and then moved to Clearbrook in 1959. In Clearbrook he continued in the preaching ministry and Sunday School teaching. For six years he served as assistant pastor.

He is now officially retired, but is still active in numerous church related services.

Mr. & Mrs. Joe Wiebe

Brother Joe Wiebe was born in Steinbach, Manitoba in 1909 and Sister Wiebe in 1912, also in Steinbach. They received their education in Steinbach and both attended the Winnipeg Bible College.

They felt the call to serve the Lord in northern Manitoba in pioneer missionary work. Their first mission station was at Stuartburn, after which they moved to Ashern to start a work there, Then they received a call to pastor the church at Lindal, Manitoba.

Brother Wiebe also served as administrator of the Tabor Home in Morden for a short time. From Morden they left to go to Winnipegosis to take over the mission work there.

The M.B. Mission Board requested them to go to Mexico for six months as y sit various Mennonite families. On their return

they again served in Winnipegosis.

Because of poor health, they moved to Winnipeg and joined the Portage Avenue M.B. Church. In Winnipeg he worked with the Manitoba Missions Board for the Aged and the Opportunity Centre ministering to senior citizens in hospitals and care homes. They joined the Westwood Community Church in order to assist the newly formed church.

Rev. and Mrs. Jacob P. Dueck

Rev. Jacob F. Dueck was born May 9, 1899 in Orenburg, Russia; Helena (Buller) Dueck was born February 10,1900 in Charkov, Russia. He immigrated to Canada in 1926; she came in 1925. They were married November 23, 1940 in Coaldale, Alberta, and raised ten children together. He first served at the Coaldale Mennonite Brethren congregation in 1927, was ordained by them in 1936 and completed his lengthy ministry there in 1964, at which time they moved to B.C., where he was a minister at the Clearbrook Mennonite Brethren Church until 1966. He next served at the King Road Mennonite Brethren Church in Abbotsford, B.C. from 1966 until 1981, and was pastor of that congregation from 1966 to 1971.

Rev. and Mrs. Peter C. Penner

Rev. Peter C. Penner was born June 11, 1908 in Lustigstal, Russia; Aganeta (Rogalsky) Penner was born February 14, 1903 in Steintal, Russia. They were married October 13, 1928 and immigrated to Canada on March, 1930. He served first at the Arnold B.C. Mennonite Brethren Church from 1951 to 1962, and was ordained by that congregation on April 12, 1959. He next served as pastor of the Oliver Gospel Chapel until 1967 before returning to the Mennonite Brethren congregation, where he served until 1973. From 1974 until 1977 the Penners served with the Board of Missions/Services in Austria and Germany. Upon his return he resumed ministry, this time in the King Road Mennonite Brethren Church in Abbotsford, B.C., where he was pastor from 1978 until 1981, and where he is presently still serving.

Rev. and Mrs. Frank J. Peters

Frank J. and Nettie Peters of Swift Current, Sask. have given many years to ministry in southern Saskatchewan. Frank was born in Russia on January 19, 1906 and Nettie on June 23, 1914. They came to Canada in the twenties. They were married on November 15, 1934; Frank was a widower at the time. Ordained in Swift Current in 1938 Frank was the first leader of the Swift Current Mennonite Brethren Church, and continued to be the unsalaried pastor for some 18 years. He also served on the Committee of Reference and Council of Southern Saskatchewan for many years, served on the Board of the Herbert Senior Citizens' Home, kept the German minutes for the Canadian Conference three years, and served on numerous other committees and boards. The Peters have three daughters and five sons living and still make their home in Swift Current.

Rev. and Mrs. J.B. Toews

Though they now live in Fresno, California, J.B. and Nettie Toews have a long association with the Canadian Mennonite Brethren churches. Both have their origin in Russia, he was born there in 1906 and she in 1903, and came to Canada in the twen-

ties. "J.B." came in 1928 and settled in Coaldale, Alta. His ordination to a public ministry occurred in Hepburn, Sask., where he was one of Bethany Bible Institute's early principals. He became president of the newly-founded Mennonite Brethren Bible College in 1945 and stayed on for three years. For some 15 or 16 years he served on the Committee of Reference and Council of the General Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches and for about the same number of years was a member of the Board of Foreign Missions (later the Board of Missions/Services). His major contributions came as general secretary for 10 years of the Board of Missions and after moving to the Biblical Seminary, the eight years he gave as president of that important teaching institution. Besides his theological and historical writing and teaching, he has pastored two churches (Buhler, Ks. and Reedley, Calif.) and served widely as a Bible expositor and evangelist. He continues as professor emeritus at the Biblical Seminary and as director of the Center of Mennonite Brethren Studies in Fresno.

As the children of Israel were without the binding element of straw, so we today need the binding elements of prayer, the Word of God, the Holy Spirit and fellowship with one another. He then gave some information about the Russian broadcasts which are now being aired. He led in the opening prayer.
- Greetings: Vernon Wiebe, moderator of the U.S.A. Conference, brought greetings on behalf of the United States churches. He related some of the latest developments in the U.S.A. Conference structure.
- <u>Congregational Singing</u>: The congregation sang "They That Wait Upon the Lord".

Special Music: Jake and Mary Geddert sang "Worthy the Lamb".

 Board of Higher Education (continued): The presentation of the report continued under the leadership of the Board Chairman, Abe Konrad.

The financial report was presented by John Penner. He reported a reduction in the total budget by \$16,000.00, but the details as to which amounts will be reduced to make this reduction possible will be made later.

Considerable discussion took place with many questions being asked and answered.
Upon motion the reports were accepted.

re Henry Krahn:

re Appointment of David Ewert:

"That we affirm the appointment of David Ewert to the presidency of M.B.B.C."

"That the proposed 1982-83 budget be approved."

Upon motion all recommendations were accepted.

- 11. Peter Penner: Peter Penner, professor at Mt. Allison University
 of Sackville, New Brunswick, reported on his research and writing in the field of home missions and church extension of the
 Mennonite Brethren.
- 12. The Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns: John F. Froese, Chairman of the Board, reviewed the prepared report. He called on several others to highlight certain aspects of the report as follows:

CHURCH LEADERSHIP A CURRENT ISSUE

In his report to the 1981 convention, the chairman Herb Brandt stated, "This year has been a somewhat difficult one for the Board in respect to membership." He then pointed out that the Board had

lost both its chairman and secretary. In addition, accidents kept several other brethren from attending most or all of the Board and Conference sessions in 1981. As a result we were unable to do much of what should have been done last July. In light of this we called an extra meeting of the Board on November 8 and 9. The following is a report of some of the issues, discussions and actions taken during this past year.

An oft-recurring issue is our peace position and an adequate teaching of this doctrine. In addition to the two workshops on this subject last year, we asked brother Herb Brandt to prepare the material for the annual prayer week around this theme. All the churches have received this. In addition brother Herb Giesbrecht has also prepared a bibliography of current material relating to our peace position. This has been available to all the churches as well as the various schools within our brotherhood.

We have also considered it our responsibility to address various issues in our Conference periodical. Brethren have been asked to submit articles on such subjects as, "Affluence and Life Style" (carried in this issue of the Herald), "Baptism and Church Membership", "Biblical Inerrancy".

In regard to the question of Scriptural inerrancy. the Chicago statement of the International Council on Biblical Inerrancy was received. Copies have been sent to the churches, and a recommenda-

tion is forthcoming.

The matter of leadership styles is a very current issue in our churches today. Brother P.R. Toews is presenting a workshop on this topic at this convention. In order to deal more adequately with this subject we have also appointed a committee to work on an all-Canadian study conference. We envision such a conference for May 1983 on the theme "Leadership under Lordship". More details will be released at the convention.

At our January Board meeting Aaron Schmidt, the chairman of our pulpit committee reported that, "almost every one of our churches presently has a pastor." We are grateful for the Lord's provision. No doubt the usual changes will take place this summer. We remind the Brotherhood that the pulpit committee stands prepared to assist both pastors and churches if and when changes are anticipated.

With increasing frequency churches are looking beyond our own Brotherhood for pastoral staff. In this regard we have a twofold concern: first, that those who come to us from different church backgrounds be aware of and in accord with our confession of faith, and second, that we seek to facilitate their orientation to our Conference. In response to the first concern we will be recommending to this convention that all such brethren be asked to complete the "Ordination Questionnaire" accepted by the General Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches in 1981, before they are called as pastors. To facilitate orientation our pulpit committee is in conversation with Mennonite Brethren Bible College, exploring the possibility of adding a one-week orientation session to their annual Institute for Ministers and Laymen.

Our Conference is guided in its operations by several individual documents. A long-range project of this Board has been to bring these together, update where necessary, and publish them as one booklet. Brother John Redekop has prepared a document containing the Confession of Faith, Charter, By-Laws, Operating Guidelines and Parliamentary Procedure. We are continuing work on this, planning to come to the 1983 convention with a specific recommendation.

The report of our Conference Minister appears separately.

It is with regret that we learned that brother Toews would not continue this work beyond his initial two-year commitment. We thank brother Toews for the pioneer work he has done in this area, and wish him the Lord's blessing in his return to the pastorate. It is the conviction of this Board that we need the services of a Conference Minister. Our search for a replacement led us to one of our own Board members, brother Henry Brucks. We're grateful to the Elmwood (Winnipeg) Church for releasing brother Brucks from his commitment to them in order that he might enter this wider ministry. Brother Brucks will give full time to his new assignment after September 1, 1982.

"Finally, brothers pray for us that the message of the Lord may spread rapidly and be honored, just as it is with you" (2 Thessalonians 3:1)

CONFERENCE MINISTER'S REPORT

WE NEED TO DEEPEN OUR COMMON VISION

The Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns have asked me to write a report for this conference even though my work terminated at the end of December, 1981.

1. First of all I wish to thank the members of the Board for the assistance and encouragement they have given me in my work. Then too I want to thank the members of the Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches for the confidence they had in me. I had hoped to finish the work as Conference Minister and complete the twoyear term for which I was engaged. The reasons for my leaving were announced earlier in our publication and need not be repeated at this time.

I had scheduled my time for a whole year in advance. My early termination meant that I had to cancel some of the commitments I had made. I have tried to make my apologies to the churches for the inconveniences which I had caused them in their scheduling of church activities and I hope they have been forgiving.

I have however served a number of churches until Christmas of 1981 and even into the New Year, as late as February. It was a joy and pleasure for me to serve in deeper life services, which I did in English and German, as well as in other kinds of services. Then too it was refreshing for me to meet with pastors of individual churches as well as in more formal meetings of Ministers and Christian Workers Conferences. I will refrain from giving further details of these services, but let it suffice to say that I am pleased with what I have seen and sensed in the churches across Canada, and for the way I was received by our brotherhood.

I had told the Board at the beginning of my work as Conference Minister that after a ministry of two years I would be able to tell them whether there was a need for a Conference Minister in our Conference, and also advise them in what areas the ministry would be. At this time I believe I would be in a position to inform you as a delegation of my impressions. I am sure these impressions are very subjective and tainted by my personal experiences, and yet to me they are rather real.

I believe that there is a great ministry in teaching and preaching the Word in Bible Conference and deeper life services. I had no difficulty arranging a schedule for my entire time. The Word was graciously received and I was blessed through this ministry. Then too a Conference Minister creates a presence or visibility of the Conference in the churches. Such a visibility is

wholesome to the unity and the entire work of our Conference. My suggestion is that this work should be continued.

b) A ministry to the pastors of our churches should also be continued. I was only able to meet and fellowship with a few of the pastors in our Conference. One could hardly expect that a Conference Minister would touch every person in the ministry of our Conference, and yet even though this may be true it should still be continued. Since he is also a member of the pulpit committee he can have wholesome ministry in helping pastors find new assignments and ministries, and also help them in difficult situations or in their problems.

c) The ministry of "Pastor-Church" relations is also part of the assignment. I have been involved in this as well. To assist churches with problems or better said their difficulties in administration or other areas, has also been part of my work during the past two years. I have found that in all cases I have done my part in trying to solve differences, but in all of these I have eventually sought the assistance of Provincial Conference Committees.

It is not possible, nor is it wise for one person to come to a church, spend a few days in consultation or in committees and private meetings, give advice and leave again. Such a ministry to churches generally needs closer attention and follow-up work. Therefore I believe that this area of work should be left to the care and trust of Provincial Conference leadership, and the Conference Minister could be asked to give assistance in some way or another if desired.

d) Summary: Permit me to repeat that there is a ministry for a Conference Minister in our Conference, but we must also realize that certain areas of work should be left to Provincial Conference Executives. These committees or people appointed within the Provincial Conference are better able to minister to the affairs within the respective conferences.

3. Another area which I would like to touch upon is a personal concern that has developed during the time in which I have travelled and worked in the Conference. I have already mentioned this on a number of occasions as well as to my Board. I sense a lack of unity, and the lack of common concern for each other in our Conference. This is evident in how we support our common projects, how we relate to each other as pastors and churches, and also in our provincialism. It is not my intention to criticize people, churches, or conferences. It must also be admitted that it is difficult to place the blame on anyone in particular. It appears that we fall prey to the spirit of our times which has been evident in all of Canada.

Any suggestion for a solution could not easily be found. There is no simple solution. However, I would like to make a few suggestions which could give us some direction or at least food for thought. I believe that the first solution will have to be found in the leadership of our Conference. I do not mean any one committee or board could make a difference, but I am referring to our leaders, the pastors and ministers of our churches, conference executives, and members of conference committees. John E. Toews of the Mennonite Brethren Biblical Seminary in Fresno, California recently spoke to the B.C. Reference and Council on this subject. This was very enlightening and helpful. Unless we as leaders of our churches will see the value of the greater brotherhood we will not find a bond of unity in our brotherhood.

Furthermore I believe that we should expect that our Conference schools, our Bible Institutes, our College and Seminary have a great ministry to perform in this regard. The schools and the

Conference and churches will have to move closer together to do a common task. It is difficult to say who should take the initiative. In all probability one will wait for the other and in the meantime we will move further apart. I have noticed that when our schools have special ministers' courses, or graduations, or school openings we as pastors are not there in full force to lend our support. It is true also that often schools do not listen to the concerns of pastors. In other words we belong together, we stand and work together or we fall - together.

A deepening of our common vision for the task we have as a brotherhood would also unite us. As we meet to discuss our common vision and make plans to carry it out we will find the bond of fel-

lowship and brotherhood will be strengthened.

4. Now I come to another area which has given me some concern. I have been aware of our search for identity, or simply stating it, "Who are we as the Mennonite Brethren Church". We have spoken about a name change, and so far we have not resolved this. We are, however, changing it by default. We have numerous churches who go under the label of Community Churches. We may well call it, "The M.B. Community Church", or whatever other label we may have, and we suit it to fit our community or kind of work we intend to do. Personally I believe we do not have to change our name. We have established our identity as Mennonite Brethren. All we need to do is to affirm our position.

Furthermore, we have always been a church with a congregational church polity. We have been and are a brotherhood. At present however I find a search for church organization and for a polity which will give us freedom to carry out our task as each church envisions it. To me it is just another attempt to find our identi-

ty in the flow of our commitment to our task.

What about a projection for the future? I see a lot of good things happening in our churches and I am encouraged. We need occasion to affirm each other in our ministry. I see churches reaching beyond the immediate confines of church families and ministering to a larger community; souls are being saved, Christians are baptized and joining the church. This is indeed the good news and we should rejoice and be encouraged. I hope that you will accept the appointed Conference Minister, and that he will be able to assist the pastors and churches in this great task.

Thank you once again for permitting me to minister to you as

a brotherhood.

P.R. Toews Former Conference Minister P.R. Toews, former Conference Minister (now having been replaced by Henry Brucks), gave a separate report in which he made the following observations:

- a) The glue that keeps us together seems to be eroding somewhat.
- b) The M.B.B.C. and our M.B. Seminary have made tremendous strides and our common experiences with these institutions could be the binding force we need.
- c) Our identification will need to be strengthened and encouraged.
- d) We need a united voice in interpretation of Scripture for our daily lives.

Hugo Jantz, member of the MCC Board, directed the reporting of the work of Mennonite Central Committee. He called on several MCC workers and staff members to join him in the presentation of the following report:

REPORT 6



Mennonite Central Committee (Canada) Matthew 5:16 — Let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven."

In 1981 we have again been witness to hunger, violence, disease, and oppression. Nations are beating plowshares into swords. Political and social unrest seems to be increasing. In the midst of this, however, we, the church, are called to continue the work that Jesus began.

Mennonite Central Committee (Canada) brings together twelve Mennonite and Brethren in Christ groups in Canada in a united expression of our common faith. This report is an attempt to give an accounting of our stewardship.

The Overseas Services Office serves Canadian Mennonites and Brethren in Christ by extending international MCC programs. These activities include SELFHELP Crafts, the Visitor Exchange Program, the Child Sponsorship Program, and Material Aid activities. Some of these programs require government clearance, visas, freight assistance, and similar contacts. An important function of the Overseas Office is to submit projects of development programs to agencies

such as CIDA (Canadian International Development Agency). MCC (Canada) makes itself responsible for large sums of money. More important than the money is the considerable amount of trust that is placed in MCC (Canada), not only by CIDA, but also by provincial governments, a number of church agencies, and by many individuals.

We have benefited through cooperating with other church groups.
The Canadian Baptist Federation
selected MCC as its service arm in
Somalia, endorsing this with a \$50,000
contribution. Other church agencies
assisting from time to time have been
Canadian Lutheran World Relief, the
Anglican Church, the United Church,
and the Presbyterian Church. The work
of the Overseas Office of MCC
(Canada) spans the globe through its
various committees and interests.

The Voluntary Service program in Canada has once again grown substantially, with a total of 133 people in voluntary service at the end of the year. Approximately 100 people serve in native communities, with Youth

Ministries, as secretaries, in daycare centres, as community workers, and other areas, in various projects, across Canada. There are sixteen young people, ages 17-20, in the SALT (Serve And Learn Togethen) program; six in Manitoba and ten in Ontario.

The Handicap Awareness Project will be extended for one year, to the end of April 1983. 1981 was the International Year of Disabled Persons. Some agencies may drop their efforts on behalf of the disabled at the end of the year, and it is important that MCC (Canada) not be one of these.

The Ottawa Office contributes to the purpose of MCC (Canada) by assisting with the government aspects of the program. The director, William Janzen, and his assistant, Freda Enns, list a varied number of activities accomplished in 1981. These include assisting with immigration matters, working with the Kanadier program, Ilaison work with members of parliament for the purpose of sharing information and expressing concerns, preparing statements to the government on healt of

the MCC (Canada) board and Executive Committee, maintaining embassy contacts on behalf of the Overseas Office, and helping to obtain visas and other documents for outgoing MCC workers, incoming Vsers and Exchange Visitors.

The MCC (Canada) Food Bank was involved in four shipments of wheat, valued at three and a half million dollars, during 1981. A special "Corn for the Horn" drive sent food to the Horn of Africa, including Ethiopia and Somalia. The shipment included 10,000 metric tonnes of wheat, corn, lentils and peas. Total value of this shipment exceeded two million dollars.

The Peace and Social Concerns Office of MCC (Canada) considered a number of issues during 1981. Among them were the receipt and use of government funds by church related agencies, and the Task Force on Women in Church and Society. A Canadian Tax Task Force was formally organized in September of 1981. In April of 1981 a workshop on Dispute Mediation was held in Saskatoon, cosponsored by the Peace and Social

Concerns Office and the Solicitor General's Department of Canada.

A re-assessment of the role of the Victim-Offender Ministries Office of MCC (Canada) has begun since the resignation, in July 1981, of Edgar Epp. Consultant to the office. Dave Worth of Ontario has been appointed to a quarter-time position, working out of the Kitchener (Ontario) office.

The agenda of MCC (Canada) is not lessening on the Canadian Native scene. Increased trust has been accorded the Native Concerns Office by native organizations, groups and individuals in the area of resource development, justice advocacy, and in requests for Voluntary Service personnel. We request the prayers of the MCC (Canada) constituency.

Resource Development through the work of Eric Rempel has taken place by serving sixteen native communities with the Gardening Program, involving twenty-three summer gardeners. Contacts have been established with native communities and organizations regarding wild rice development possibil-

ities. With the addition of Eric on staff, additional resource development work is being initiated and bridges are being built in a practical way.

1981 was also the year of increased church involvement on the MCC (Canada) board, with the addition of a board member from the Sommerfelder Mennonite Church. Several other groups are giving consideration to joining MCC (Canada).

In 1981 MCC (Canada) had an income of 10.2 million dollars, of which 3.2 million came in contributions from the constituency. Government grants accounted for another 4.5 million, VS and SELFHELP earnings one million, and another million from various other sources such as subscriptions, interest, forwardings, etc. Expenditure for 1981 amounted to 9 million, of which 6.8 million went towards the overseas projects; 1.7 million was used in Canadian programs and under .5 million for administration.

The budget for 1982 is approximately 12.3 million.

J.J. Riediger presented the financial report.

12. Board of Spiritual & Social Concerns (continued):

The discussion of the reports continued with numerous comments and questions.

Upon motion all reports were accepted.

Recommendations presented were:

Recommendation #1 - regarding the questionnaire for ministers.

At the General Conference of M.B. Churches on August 7-11, 1981, in St. Catharines, Ontario, the Board of Reference and Counsel brought a resolution on ordination to the attention of the delegates which included a questionnaire for ordination.

Since our Canadian Conference has a number of pastors who come from various backgrounds and training, we need to put forth a concerted effort to maintain the unity of the brotherhood.

Recommendation: "That the questionnaire for ordination to the ministry in the General Conference of M.B. Churches" as recorded in the 1981 Yearbook, pages 9-11, be used by provincial ordination review committees or other bodies charged with this responsibility to examine pastoral candidates who are new to the M.B. Conference."

Motion to amend: To delete the words "who are new to the M.B. Conference". Upon advice of the Parliamentarian, the amendment was dropped on the ground that it removed the essential content of the motion.

Second Motion to amendment: To change the last part of the recommendation to "new pastoral candidates in the Mennonite Brethren Conference."

Motion to Refer; "That we refer this matter back to the Board for rewording and later presentation."

This motion carried.

Recommendation #2 - regarding a Ministers' and Laymen's Institute for March 7-11, 1983.

Representatives from the Mennonite Brethren College and the Board

of Spiritual & Social Concerns have negotiated an orientation for new pastors coming into leadership in the Canadian M.B. Conference of Churches. Since many of these new leaders are from non-Mennonite Brethren background and training, we suggest orientation and training under the following topics:

1) Heritage of Faith

- 2) Mennonite Brethren Institutions
- 3) Missions and Evangelism
- 4) Leadership
- 5) Issues

Recommendation: "That such orientation be implemented at the Ministers' and Laymen's Institute, March 7-11, 1983, at MBBC and that we encourage churches to send their pastors, especially those who are new to our Conference."

Upon motion this was accepted.

Recommendation #3 - regarding a Leadership Congress for May 20-22, 1983. The need for a Canadian Study Conference has surfaced at various times in our brotherhood interaction.

The Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns appointed a commission to research and explore issues which ought to be spoken to.

Recommendation: "That we convene a Leadership Congress on May 20-22, 1983, Friday evening to Sunday noon."

Upon motion this was accepted.

Theme: "Leadership under Lordship"

Key Note Speaker: 4 messages on various aspects of leadership renewal.

Workshop Themes:

- 1) Modelling Leadership
- 2) Styles of Leadership
- 3) Authority under Leadership

Recommendation #4 - regarding Henry Brucks as the new Conference Minister.

Due to various reasons as indicated in the $\underline{\text{M.B. Herald}}$ last winter, our Conference Minister, Brother P.R. Toews, resigned from his position last January and began his work as pastor of the Fraserview M.B. Church.

The ministry and the testimony of Brother Toews and the contact with our churches convinced our Board of the need to appoint another conference minister as soon as possible. The executive of our Board negotiated with Brother Henry Brucks and with the Elmwood Church, which he is serving, and we are grateful for the way in which the Lord made Brother Brucks willing to serve and

the Church willing to release him for this important ministry.

The appointment was duly announced through our paper and to the Council of Boards in January.

Recommendation: "That this Convention ratify the appointment of Brother Henry Brucks as Conference Minister."

Upon motion this was accepted.

We as a Board solicit your prayerful support of our brother as he undertakes this important ministry in our Conference.

Recommendation #5 - regarding membership in the Evangelical Fellow-ship of Canada.

Recommendation: "That our treasurer of the Conference be asked to pay the annual dues for membership in the Evangelical Fellowship of Canada."

Upon motion this was accepted.

Recommendation #6 - regarding the budget. See page 37
"That the budget for the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns be accepted."

Upon motion this was accepted.

Election: Henry Brucks needs to be replaced for the balance of his term to 1985. Candidates presented were:

Elected was Isaac Block.

13. Greetings to Believers in Russia:

J.M. Klassen, Executive Secretary of MCC (Canada) is scheduled to travel to Russia. The delegates voted that he take our greetings to our brethren in Russia.

15. Board of Christian Education: Ed Boldt, Chairman of the Board, introduced the members and directed the review of the prepared report. He called on others to assist in highlighting some aspects of this report.

REPORT:

At the 1964 Canadian convention in Winkler, Manitoba, H.R. Baerg, chairman of the joint Sunday School and youth Committee, announced the opening of the first "Christian Education office" for Canada. The first "executive secretary" was George Konrad. He opened his office, on a part-time basis, on April 16, 1964. Since that time many changes have taken place in our field, and we have been encouraged, especially in this past year, to take stock, evaluate, and consider our task for the future. We are of the opinion that God has a great task for us to accomplish, and we want to be faithful in responding to His will.

In 1967 Wilmer Kornelson was appointed full-time executive secretary with his office located in Clearbrook. Upon his resignation in 1974, John Unger was appointed executive secretary and set up his office at the Canadian Mennonite Brethren Conference offices in Winnipeg. When our Canadian Conference was reorganized the new Constitution of 1969 gave the "Board of Education" the mandate to "initiate, promote and strengthen the program of Christian Education in the local churches..." in the areas of "Sunday school, youth, vacation Bible school, mid-week program, worker training, music, camps, clubs, and library." This enlarged mandate proved to be a task too great for one person to handle effectively. On August 1, 1978, Ron Penner was appointed "associate executive secretary". In order to carry out its mandate more effectively, the board divided itself into commissions: personnel, education, youth, music and family.

However, we must announce that this past Conference year both executive secretaries have chosen to assume other tasks. John Unger has resigned as executive secretary effective August 31. Ron Penner has informed us that he plans to leave in 1983. We are extremely sorry to see these men leave; they have done us a service that has left the Conference and each one of us as individuals richer for having been in contact with them. May God reward their effort, guide them in their future walk, and bless their ministries as they continue to serve Him. We have appointed Ron Penner to the position vacated by John Unger as of September 1, 1982. He will

serve us in that capacity until he leaves a year later.

The above developments, as you can understand, have had a tremendous effect upon the planning of our Board. As a result, at our January Board meeting in Winnipeg the larger Board instructed the Personnel Commission to evaluate the functioning of the Board and Christian Education office as we have seen it carried out over the last several years. Accordingly, on March 26, 1982, the Personnel Commission met in a special session to consider the past, present,

and future function of our Board and its personnel. As to some of the other activities within our jurisdiction, we want the Conference and the churches to know that we listened very carefully to concerns raised last year on the Conference floor, particularly over the whole issue of "Music in the Church". We are well aware that there are differences here that need to be reconciled. Whether this can be done through our Board publication "The Music Maker" or a "Music Conference" is debatable, but we must make an effort. One way I would like to propose is to raise the issue in the form of a paper at a special "Study Conference", and from there to discussion in all the churches. It must become a grass roots awareness theme before we can deal with it effectively. One added comment: It is regrettable that too many of our pastors and church leaders refuse to speak out on the issue.

Finally, a word on the decisions reached at last year's General Conference convention in regard to the publication of the Lektionsheft and the Adult Quarterly. The strong mandate to continue with these two publications means that we must aggressively spread the good word and use them. A decision at the conference can only become reality as we bend our efforts to support the decision in fact. Curriculum will continue to be an area where no "perfect solution" will perhaps ever be found, including questions such as "Foundation Series" vs. "Scripture Press" and many others.

May God help us to use the promptings of His Holy Spirit, the exercise of sound judgment based upon thorough research to arrive at proper solutions as we attempt to serve Him in every area of

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT

On August 1, 1982 I will be entering the ninth year of ministry in this office. This month also concludes my services in this capacity. The years slipped by so quickly. The experiences were very enriching. I thank the Lord and the Conference for service opportunities. I pray that services given may continue to build His church. Mary and I look forward to the coming year at Fuller Theological Seminary as a time of refreshment for further service.

OFFI CE

During the month of June 1981, our secretary, Edith Stobbe, assumed an assignment with "Youth for Christ". Gloria Braun became our replacement secretary and has offered commendable services in performing the duties of the office. Ron Penner has served extensively in the areas of youth, family and camping ministries. My services related to leadership training, editorial services, Sunday School, clubs, library, vacation Bible school, and music ministries.

Our commitment has been to support the educational ministries of the local church with resources, information, services and encouragement. A visit to a church generally resulted in five or more letters or calls for further information. Sometimes we were asked to suggest personnel available for a certain assignment, at other times we received requests for cassettes, filmstrips or sample materials from our office. We are constantly adding to our supply in areas of youth, family and educational ministry. Most often we were asked to provide further information regarding areas of need. We try to be available and offer the information we can regarding the above areas of ministry.

PUBLICATION FIRMS

We try to be informed of coming changes in curriculum, whether in Sunday school, clubs, youth or other agencies. Our office relates to more than a dozen such organizations. This provides us with data we can share with churches. Any suggestions from you, the users, is shared with the respective publisher. By doing so, we are able to enrich local church ministry.

EDITORIAL SERVICES

During the past eight years I have served as editor of The Adult Quarterly and Lektionsheft. Most of the books of the Bible have been studied during this time. The Mennonite Brethren Publishing House has served as printer and distributor. Orlando Harms and Wally Kroeker respectively served as contact persons at the publishing house. There were 20 different persons who served as writers for The Adult Quarterly during the past 8 years. A number of these wrote for several quarters. Loyal Martin wrote five of the 32 quarters during the eight year period. Translators for the Lektionsheft were two: G. D. Huebert, who retired from this service in May, 1978, when the assignment was assumed by Peter J. Dick, the present translator. Beginning with the September 1982 issue, Dennis Becker serves as editor of the above.

THE FOUNDATION SERIES

During the recent years I served as a member of the Editorial Council for the Foundation Series Youth and Adult curriculum. We have now completed the manuscript reading for two of the four years of the Youth Series. The first year of the curriculum is already in use. We are now reading the manuscripts of year 3 while the writers are currently writing the year 4 curriculum. The Adult Series manuscripts are now complete. Year 1 is already in circulation while year 2 of the two-year core curriculum is with the publishers.

THE MUSIC MAKER

During the past two years we have published The Music Maker, a publication designed to support the music ministry of the local church. We believe it is helpful, judging by the positive feedback. Your continued suggestions, articles and announcements will help us fulfill the purpose for which it was designed.

EDUCATIONAL IDEABANK

This is our newest product. Volume 1, Number 4, July 1982 has just reached the educators of the churches. The first number was introductory, the second dealt with leadership, followed by electives in Number 3, and media in Number 4. Future publications will feature club ministries, organizational patterns, methodology, philosophy of learning, current trends, values, self-esteem and other concerns as they arise from time to time.

CONVENTIONS

Gospel Light Publications offers leadership training in many Canadian cities known as "International Center for Learning". This is one avenue we believe our teachers may utilize to be revitalized, informed and inspired in their educational ministries. We have supported these programs. Scripture Press offers a similar service known as "Teacher Development Services". We have also encouraged participation in their seminars. In addition, our Christian Education Boards have planned events at the provincial level. I served at both the Manitoba and Ontario Conferences on such occasions. Regional Conferences also became a part of my service this year. A Winnipeg church sponsored a Mid-Canada Convention where I participated with four workshops, since many teachers from our congregations were in attendance.

I was also invited to serve at some of our Canadian educational institutions. During the past year I served at the Mennonite Educational Institute, Clearbrook; Bethany Bible Institute, Hepburn; Winnipeg Theological Seminary, Otterburne; and Briercrest Bible Institute, Caronport.

CHURCHES

Churches are our primary focus. During the past year I ministered in 12 churches with one or more messages and workshops, serving from one to three days. A number of additional church visits involved sessions with the Christian Education staff or pastors.

PROSPECTS

Currently I am preparing for a seven day camping experience at Columbia Bible Camp where 120 campers, Grades 8-10, will be experiencing life with their counselors between August 1 and 7. This will be followed by a three-week vacation, and finalization of our

ASSOCIATE'S REPORT

"The majority of Canadian so not draw upon religion in addressing the questions of life and death. Life is increasingly not meaningful in terms of religion but rather in terms of tangibles such as money and career, family and friends, recreation and entertainment, social and personal causes. These have become what sociologist Thomas Luckman has called 'invisible religions' - non-supernatural factors around which people organize their lives."

"Over the past twenty-five years - 1946-1981 - weekly church attendance has declined from approximately 67 percent to the current 28 percent. Relatedly, while 2 in 3 adults say they attended religious services regularly as children, only 1 in 3 do so now. Significantly, only 1 in 3 people with school-age children are exposing them to religious instruction in the churches. Allowing for child-adult attrition, it is conceivable that by the end of the century, only about 1 in 6 Canadians will be attending churches on a regular weekly basis."

(Excerpts from a study by Reginald Bibby, <u>Religionless Christanity: A Profile of Religion in the Canadian 80's</u>. University

These observations challenge us in our congregations to ask: Are these drifts happening in our family? in our church? Are our ministries and congregational life meeting the needs of our adults and children? How do we reach out to a drifting generation?

Our hope is to ask and answer questions such as these together with our churches so that the dynamic power of Christ will be vividly present and attractive in our families and congregations.

These next paragraphs sketch out some of the ministry highlights in the areas of youth, family, and camping during 1981/82.

YOUTH MINISTRY

These years continue to be the time when persons make important decisions about values, vocation, friends, and faith. Especially for those growing up in Christian families, the mid-teen years are times of personalizing their faith - shifting from believing because the important people in my life believe, to believing because I have personally reconsidered the options and now make it my own. Providing a strong positive reference group through this time is one of the great contributions of a church to its youth and our churches have worked hard at that goal.

As a ministry committed to supporting youth ministry in the

local churches, we work at:

1. Encouraging the training and support of local church youth workers via:

- * Supporting and attending the annual provincial Youth Worker retreats (last year we saw our best ever turnout of adult workers and young people);
- * Providing written resources such as the Resource Binder and Youth Ministry Incites;
- * Offering materials on loan from our resource library;
- * Personal visits for dialogue and encouragement;
- * Leading seminars in retreats or churches;
- * Assisting in the planning of larger interdenominational events to which our workers can go as well;

2. Fostering ministry to our young people by:

* Proclaiming National Youth Week each year to highlight this group and ministry in our churches (this year our theme was,"Making

every effort to live at peace with all men").

- * Planning and organizing our triennial National Youth Conference at Banff. The next one is slated for December 29, 1983 to January 1, 1984. Registration will open in the spring, 1983.
 - 3. Serving as a link with:

* Provincial youth committees;

* Other denominations and youth organizations;

* Publishers of youth materials.

4. Responding to emerging needs in your ministry. This year

we worked on several new areas.

* Summer Service Workcamp. We were hoping to foster a service mindset among our high school youth and offered a two-week camp. We had to cancel the event because of low registration. At this point we believe such programs might work better if developed on a provincial or local basis, so will be leaving that initiative with the local groups.

* Young Adult Ministries Seminar. Together with Student Services, we hosted a seminar for churches working with the college and career and young adult population. Response was very favorable and we are looking at ways to foster ongoing helps for this mini-

stry.

* Youth Workers Wilderness Trip. To provide for orientation and training in the use of wilderness tripping we will be offering a 5-day training trip July 14-18 in the Rockies. We still have

* Workshop to develop youth work seminar leaders. A number of our youth workers are called upon to lead workshops and seminars in our churches. We want to affirm this direction and plan to host a two-day event in late August to assist in deepening and broadening our content and workshop design skills.

FAMILY MINISTRY

What do you see as the major issues concerning Christian families in our time? Observers today point to trends like the following:

* Nearly 50 percent of all mothers with children under 18 are

working;

* 45 percent of all children born in 1978 will spend part of their lives before age 18 with only one parent;

* The traditional nuclear family (Dad, Mom and the kids) is

already a minority among family types;

* The spiritual disciplines of Bible reading and prayer are

practiced in only a minority of Christian families.

Because the family has such a key role in the shaping of persons and functions as a "shock absorber" of life stresses, it is important for us to work against forces that tear down the family and work for those that will strengthen it.

What can churches do to strengthen their ministry to families?

Here are some of the ways we suggest and are working toward:

To offer biblical instruction regarding life in a family;
 To help persons and families prepare for key transitional

 To help persons and families prepare for key transitional times in life like marriage, the birth of a first child, mid-life evaluation, and retirement;

3. To invite couples and families to devote special times to

build up and enrich their relationships - maybe start a family night, attend a marriage enrichment retreat, or attend a family camp;

4. To be there when crisis or tragedy comes, offering practi-

cal helps, prayer, support and counsel.

This year we have focussed on the following ways to help churches in their ministry to families:

* Offering resources to church leaders and families;

* Providing Family Ministry Fireplace, a quarterly publication of ideas and resources (the two most recent issues focussed on Preparing for Marriage, and The Senior Years);

* Making Family Night at Home, a Mennonite Brethren ideabook for family activities, available for purchase (we will have them

at the convention);

* Proclaiming May as National Family Month and offering programming suggestions to pastors and families (our theme this year is "Building the Family of God");

* Making special books available to church leaders at a dis-

count;

* Loaning materials from our resource library;

* Introducing church leaders to materials and ministry ideas through regional shop-talk sessions. This year included Saskatchewan, Alberta and Ontario.

CAMPING MINISTRY

If one year of Sunday School provides about 60 hours of contact between a teacher and student, how many hours would a week at camp offer? Counting 10 hours a day over 7 days, that's 70 hours. Add to that the extra impact of modeling by the cabin leader in many aspects of life and camping is one powerful avenue of shaping lives. Our Mennonite Brethren related camps offer somewhere around 45,000 camper days of ministry each summer and that too is a lot of impact. Add to that the outreach and leadership training of young staff and we have an agency that makes a strong contribution to our local church ministries.

One of the messages which camps would dearly love to pass along to our churches is that they want to be servants to the local church, to be seen as team members of our local church Christian education and outreach ministries. So, here's a pitch to our Christian education coordinators, Sunday school superintendents and youth leaders - invite your area camp director for one of your committee meetings to talk about ways of working together more closely.

Some of the ways we support the ministry of camping in our

constituency are:

* Serving as a communications link between Mennonite Brethren related camps. This fall we will be meeting as part of the Christian Camping International Convention in Edmonton. Our last meeting was in the spring of 1979;

* Representing Mennonite Brethren Church camping interest on several boards - the Mennonite Camping Association and Christian

Camping International;

* Working with the Mennonite Brethren Herald staff in the

development of a camping issue;

* Developing new program/training approaches for some aspects of camping. This spring we are working on a new counselor training program.

Another season of ministry has gone by so quickly. I've appreciated the opportunity to dialogue and work with so many fine people and look forward to meeting a number of you at the confe-

rence where I hope you will share your concerns and suggestions.

The Chairman thanked John and Mary Unger for their services during the last eight years and invited delegates to respond, which they did by way of applause.

John Unger read his special report as follows: Dear Conference Delegates:

Paul instructed Timothy to "set an example for believers in speech, in life, in love, in faith and in purity". 1 Tim. 4:12. The ministry of Christian Education calls for performance in each of these five areas of witness.

It is both humbling and gratifying to know that God uses persons to perform such spiritual ministries. I wish to say

Thank You to the Canadian Conference for enabling me to serve you in the varied areas of Christian Education during the past eight years. These years have brought great enrichment to my life. They have provided me with a broad perspective of the spiritual life in our Canadian churches. I've seen depth of dedication on the part of many ministers in our churches. I've seen the aggressiveness with which many Christian educators are working in the churches. Our churches have many wonderfully dedicated Christians participating in fellowship and worship. Many good things are happening among us.

I've also seen many people wrestling with problems, seeking wisdom and direction for church growth. I'm always thankful when churches in their fellowship have persons who are peacemakers. They continue to be a needed factor in the building of

His church.

Educationally we are gradually becoming more sophisticated - more critical, sometimes less redemptive. However, there is also a counterforce at work, where persons are seeking true fellowship in the Word and with one another. Some of our struggles stem from our sociological status as a nation. We face economic pressures, we're enjoying affluence, we sense a threat to our freedom, and we're enjoying a rather lofty standard of living. In the midst of these things we find ourselves wanting to depend on the Lord, sense His moving in our lives, and experiencing His blessings.

Amid such a climate we want our children to develop, learning to understand faith, discipleship and Christian ministries. Many agencies are seeking to help us. The reality of Christ must be experienced and find expression in the local church. Last year we had 2,645 teachers working with over 17,000 people every Sunday. We also had 1,596 staffers working with over 9,000 children and youth who benefitted from their ministry. Other ministries such as Children's Church, Vacation Bible School, Camping, became a part of our denominational enrichment during the past year. The year before us faces similar challenges.

As I bid farewell to this office, I do so with the prayer and confidence that you will continue giving the teaching mandate your full support. Teaching is a significant service in the building of the kingdom Christ has come to establish.

16. Board of Publications: John Eckert reviewed the prepared report with the assistance of others on whom he called to elaborate on certain aspects of the report. The financial report was also discussed. (See report on page 37)

REPORT

The publishing ventures of our Conference appear to be in a healthy state. The presses operated at a fairly normal rate despite the adverse economic conditions within our country. Our operating cost has been kept under control even though our expenditures were slightly over the budget; this was due to advance purchases of materials in order to gain an advantage over frequent price increases.

We have an excellent staff at the Christian Press. There is good working relationship between management and staff. We are grateful to our manager, Mr. Vic Schmidt, and the plant superintendent, Mr. Jim Friesen. Tragedy has had its impact on the shop within the last twelve months. One of our employees, Mr. Werner Behringer, suddenly died of a heart attack. This spring, another employee, Mr. Alex Wijdekop, lost his wife and two children in a tragic car accident.

Our most significant action during the year was the hiring of a Literature Coordinator, Mr. Gilbert Brandt. Mr. Brandt, a former instructor at Bethany Bible Institute, is well qualified for his new task. Gilbert has been involved with book publishing and marketing before. We, of course, recognize that it will not be possible to market all our published books at once, nor will it be possible to offer five new titles this year. Yet, we are sure that Gilbert will do his utmost to give this part of our board's responsibility his very best attention.

For some time we have discussed the use of a special name for our book publishing department. The U.S. Mennonite Brethren Conference did decide upon a name some three years ago. We have requested that they share their name "Kindred Press" with us. They have agreed to discuss name sharing with us as well as cooperating together with the publishing and marketing of books. Negotiations re-

garding these matters will begin, subject to board approval during this convention. Success in these areas would certainly enhance the work of our Literature Coordinator. Any one interested in publishing a book is encouraged to contact Gilbert Brandt at the Christian Press office. Gilbert is most eager to assist with advice re-

garding book publishing and marketing.

Our two publications, Mennonitische Rundschau and Mennonite Brethren Herald are doing well. Conference decision provides for one free subscription to be sent to each church family. The choice of free subscription is left up to each individual family. This appears to have an adverse effect on Die Rundschau. In order to keep the younger family member informed and interested in church matters, families tend to subscribe to the Herald rather that Die Rundschau. As a result, our senior members have to pay for the Rundschau subscription. The board has given the editor permission to make Die Rundschau available free of charge to all Mennonite Brethren 65 years of age or older if requested. The board feels it can do no less for those of our constituency who have helped in the building of our conference and churches.

The <u>Herald</u> has operated well under acting editor, Gordon Nickel, and assistant editor, John Longhurst. Some criticisms have been received through the year with regard to film and book reviews. On the advice of the Board of Spiritual and Social Concerns, we have asked the editor to be more discreet in this regard. An editor's freedom, relating to an almost totally church subsidized publication, is difficult to define. Although all of us want to do the right thing at any given moment, we tend to judge any given situation from our own developed value scale, this even within a Christain context. Thus, much wisdom and grace is required in developing an understanding that will be helpful in the building process

of our churches.

MENNONITISCHE RUNDSCHAU

The Mennonitische Rundschau would like to extend greetings to the assembly of delegates to the seventy-first convention of the Mennonite Brethren Churches of Canada in the name of its subscribers, many of whom a decade or two ago took an active part in the planning and discussing and the carrying out of the business of the Conference. Today many of these are confined to their homes or to institutions for senior citizens or even to hospitals. But even under these circumstances they are still thinking of the work of the Conference and upholding with prayer and supplication the efforts of the brotherhood.

We in the office of the Mennonitische Rundschau have in the past conference year prepared and published twenty-five issues of the paper. The entire issue of the Rundschau is still in German. In our search for materials for the paper we have discovered many fine writings from the pen of those who before this time were active in our churches. We also were amazed to learn of the many wise things which were written and spoken even before our present time.

The Mennonitische Rundschau has an appreciative reading audience. The mission efforts of our Conference would not be the same if it were not for the prayers of these people. They pray and then give of their saving with a sincerity and devotion which only a life

of trial and faith and victory can muster.

As to content we rely much on reports about that which is happening in our churches or else in the conference-sponsored projects and institutions. The mission reports are number one, with news from churches, the educational institutions and MCC following. Many of those who are reading our paper have at one time or another been active in the areas they now read about and this enhances interest. We also provide devotional reading material written by members of our brotherhood. Since for many of our readers our paper is about the only channel of contact with the work in the Kingdom of God in general, we try to provide information here too.

We take good care to remain within the budget set by the Board of Publications. The Board however is sensitive to our needs and always ready to help. At this time we are trying to establish a true subscribers list. We would like to have as many subscribers as we can possibly get. We suggest that those of our Conference who do not really know our paper give it a try. Here is some information regarding subscription to the Mennonitische Rundschau:

- 1. Subscription rates are \$12.00 for one year; \$22.00 for two, and \$30.00 for three.
- 2. Members of the Canadian Conference of Mennonite Brethren Churches have the right to receive, Conference-paid, either the Mennonite Brethren Herald or the Mennonitische Rundschau, one to an address.
- 3. Missionaries have their subscriptions paid for by their home churches.
- 4. Pastors of Canadian Mennonite Brethren churches may receive both papers free for the time they hold a pastorate. The Rundschau is sent on request.
- 5. Lay ministers of our churches receive either the Mennonite Brethren Herald or the Mennonitische Rundschau free, but not both.

We at the office of the Mennonitische Rundschau consider our work on this paper not first of all as a "job" but rather as an assignment of privilege given to us by a brotherhood which has as much interest and concern for those who are going towards the setting of the sun, with long shadows falling to the east, as it has for those who are marching upward to a noonday bright with sun at the zenith.

MENNONITE BRETHREN HERALD

This has been an interim year at the Herald. Editor Harold Jantz began a one-year sabbatical at the beginning of September 1981. During the past nine months he has worked at several writing projects, including a major study of Mennonite institutions which receive government funding. Recently he made a one-month trip to Central and South America, where he interviewed a number of Mennonite Brethren missionaries. Jantz has also taken the time to think through and write a six-part series titled "War and the Christian conscience", which has been carried this spring in the Herald.

Jantz left behind three staff members who are all under 30: John Longhurst, associate editor, Joan Klassen, secretary, and Gordon Nickel, acting editor. Our youth has presented us with challenges in several areas of writing and news coverage. In other areas our youth proved to be an advantage, especially in the "youth sections" which we produced quarterly throughout the year. John Longhurst took charge of the youth materials on such themes as "friends, family and peer pressure", "peacemaking" and "vocations

and the future."

In line with our special interests, we especially enjoyed putting together the student issue of October 23, 1981, the corrections issue of February 12, the professions issue of April 23, and the stories of changed lives of May 21.

Many things caused us to thank God during this year. One is the growing number of Canadian Mennonite Brethren who can use words well and are willing to speak to a variety of issues from a Christian perspective. Our column "A Christian Mind" shared this past year by James Pankratz and Elmer Thiessen, has certainly gone a long way to encourage a Christian perspective in the minds of our readers. The column carries a crucial message - that there is a Christian response to the things which pass for wisdom in our society, even if the answers do not come easily.

Another cause for thankfulness is the work of local church reporters who supply us with family items, baptism photos, personalia items and local church stories. We couldn't do without this network of volunteer helpers. We used our travel budget this year to send John Longhurst to B.C. and Alberta for local church features. We've been carrying these features throughout the winter and spring.

We're thankful for the visual communicators - such as photographers and artists - in our churches who have helped us illustrate our articles. These communicators need to be encouraged to make use of their gifts for God and his people. Visual images are much more important to people in today's society than is print, and Christians with visual gifts can greatly help the witness of the Church.

My opportunity to fill in for Harold during this interim year has been a great chance to learn many things about publishing. It has caused me to take a good look at what a denominational magazine does and can mean in the life of a group of Christians deeply involved in every area of Canadian life. I'm extremely grateful for this opportunity.

ALBERTA GOVERNMENT GREETINGS
TO THE CANADIAN CONFERENCE OF MENNONITE BRETHREN CHURCHES
MEETING IN THREE HILLS, ALBERTA, JULY 9-13, 1982

I have been asked to transmit greetings and best wishes to you on behalf of the Government of the Province of Alberta.

We regret that the political representatives asked to be with you had to withdraw. Mrs. Connie Osterman, the local Member of the Legislative Assembly, had agreed, but family responsibility has kept her away. She asked that I offer her regrets to you. Another MLA had tentatively agreed to fill in, but on Friday we were notified by Mrs. Verlie Woods of the Premier's office that he was unable to come.

Both the local MLA and the Premier's office asked me to make brief comments on behalf of Alberta.

For many years Alberta was not in the news. In the past decade a great deal of attention has been given to oil, natural gas and the financial reserves put aside for later generations. A government, of necessity, must be pluralistic. However, governments are very conscious of the contributions made by various agencies. The very positive influence of churches, such as the Mennonite Brethren churches, in our communities is known and appreciated. Joint efforts such as MCC (Alberta) and MCC (Canada) are highly regarded. Our government provides matching funds with these agencies through our Alberta Council for International Cooperation.

We hope that as you visit Alberta, you will take the time to see more of our province and to gain a greater understanding of us. Alberta is not only the source of low-priced oil and gas, but it is also a major producer of food. Only Ontario produces more farm products than Alberta. We produce grain, oilseeds, beef, dairy products, honey and other foods and fibres in great abundance. As a visitor we hope you will discover the diversity of our province. We range from semi-desert in the southeast to fruitful prairie, parkland, foothills, and spectacular mountains. In the north we have forests and large rivers that flow to the Arctic. There is much to be seen and enjoyed. Relax with us in the beautiful nature of God's creation.

Politically, Canada has had a very difficult decade. There have been wide differences between politicians and the citizens of various regions of Canada. We feel that our voices have not always been well heard in consultations, federal-provincial meetings or in other gatherings. At the same time our premier has stated repeatedly that we are committed to Canada as a nation, undivided. We hope that in the future, political divisiveness within Canada can be reduced and that there will be greater equity in the treatment of various regions of our country.

Your supper tonight was designated as sponsored by the Alberta government. In fact, we supplied a hospitality grant to your conference as a token of support and encouragement to you.

On behalf of the local member of the Legislative Assembly and of the Provincial Government, we welcome you to Alberta. We wish for you God's blessing as you meet in session.

- Thanks to the Host Committee: All members of the committee who worked so hard to make this convention a success were called to the platform and officially thanked by our assistant moderator, John Redekop.
- Honour Roll: J.B. Toews was added to the honour roll presented on Sunday evening. The audience paid tribute to his contribution to our brotherhood.
- Special Music: After the congregation sang "Walk in the Light" the musical group from Calgary brought a special number in song, "The Lord is my Shepherd".

Message: Henry J. Schmidt, our guest speaker, brought his second message under the heading, "Lengthen Your Cords".

Texts: Isaiah 54:2; John 12:24-28

The call of the church is to lay down its life for people in service, loving, witnessing and giving in the same way as Jesus exemplified. CAN OUR KIND OF CHURCH CHANGE OUR KIND OF WORLD? Yes, provided we lengthen our cords in commitment to reach people. David Womack, in his book Breaking the Stain Glass Barrier, says that the church has always been at its best when it was evangelistic. However, few churches seem to be able to maintain that priority for more than a decade. What factors affect the "lengthening of our cords"?

I. NEGATIVELY

- A. INDIVIDUALISM Our tendency is to be self-centred so that our schedules, lives, plans and priorities are not affected by the needs of other people.
- B. INSTITUTIONALISM The tendency to become routinized in the church. The typical life cycle of a congregation over a 30-year period is one of vision, growth, expansion, plateau, stagnation and death. Over time the vision shifts from people to program, from mission to maintenance and from vision to routine.
- C. INTROSPECTION The tendency of the church is to become overly introspective in self-analysis and to become paralyzed in the process. Church growth relates not only to outward growth, but to growth in relationship to God and to one another in the body. In raising children we do not take their temperature, check their pulse, measure their height, and weigh them every morning. We seek to provide a balanced diet, exercise and rest along with an environment of nurture and warmth. When symptoms of sickness arise we consult physicians. The focus of the church cannot only be statistical. We must be concerned about producing healthy churches which in turn will reproduce.

II. POSITIVELY

A. EXPANDED VISION - Motivation

1) We need to see the larger print of what God is doing in the world in calling people for His name. God uses available people and the choice we have to make is whether we will be in the mainstream or on the sidelines.

- 2) We need a greater awareness of our world and the opportunities God gives to us. $2\frac{1}{2}$ billion people have never heard the gospel. Our cities represent one of our greatest needs today. Our hearts need to beat with compassion for unreached peoples everywhere.
- 3) We need a greater vision of the resources which God has given to His church. Mennonite Brethren have been unusually gifted by God with people in all professions, with a service mindset, and a commitment to people. We need to set people free for ministry and enlist their gifts instead of "boxing" each other up.

B. COMMITTED LEADERSHIP - Direction

Leadership needs to keep the church's focus on evangelism in three areas:

- 1) Church structures Our church structures need drastic revision since most of our leadership meetings do not grapple with vision and direction for the church in outreach as much as they deal with administrative and maintenance issues.
- 2) Modelling evangelism. Leadership needs to set an example in modelling relational evangelism, hospitality and near neighbor evangelism. We may not all be gifted in evangelism but we all have a responsibility for evangelism.
- 3) Philosophy of ministry. Leaders are called to be disciplers. Discipling deals not only with the dimension of teaching (transmission of truth and concepts) but with the dimension of training (transmission of learned skills). Discipling happens in one to one relationships or in small groups. Discipling and apprenticing people involves a four step process: 1. Do it 2. Do it with someone watching you 3. Let someone else do it while you are watching and 4. Leave them doing it while you monitor the project.

III. MOBILIZED CONGREGATIONS - Involvement

- A. Get rid of the church club atmosphere. We need to learn how to assimilate people. Many new people to the church are accepted into membership circle of the church long before they get into the friendship and fellowship circle of the body. The "glue" of Mennonite Brethren cannot be ethnicity, denominational identity, kinfolk ties or heritage, but must centre in the commitment of all people to Christ and to one another.
- B. Understand the dynamics of size in a church. Mennonite Brethren are plagued with what Lyle Schaller calls a "single-cell mindset". Lengthening our cords means that we must move to a multi-cell view of the church. In a single-cell church everybody knows everybody, or about everybody. In a multi-cell church we work with sub-groups in the church so that all the people in the church may not know each other but they all have sufficient significant personal relationships to feel that they belong and are cared for.
- C. Help members articulate their faith. We need to help the rank and file share their faith. The Gospel spread in the first century church primarily through the method of "tell-a-person".

Each one told someone else. In helping people articulate their faith we need three emphases:

1) Information - basic gospel ingredients

- 2) Interpretation how to relate the gospel to 20th century issues in a natural way
- 3) Invitation how to open your life to Jesus Christ.

Chairman's Report

Greetings with Matthew 16:18, where Jesus says, "I will build my church." Although God uses people to build His church we should always bear in mind it is still His church and He is doing the building. The theme for this year's conference is so appropriate because this building of God is not yet complete nor at a standstill-but rather ongoing. Therefore the issue of growth becomes very important for every committee and organization in the conference.

In the Board of Evangelism we have been in a time of transition in leadership. Particularly, we refer to the resigning of Brother Henry Brucks and the hiring of Brother James Nikkel. We are deeply grateful to God for giving us a brother who has a commitment to the local church and the conference, to the whole matter of church growth and especially to God and His Word. We are appreciative of the pastors and churches who have already availed themselves of his services and are confident that many more will do so in the coming year. His considerable experience in church planting as well as his thorough educational preparation, qualify him and recommend him as a brother who can help us to grow. As a board we are confident that God will use him in our conference.

The challenges before us are numerous. Some of these we would like to become involved in as time and resources are available. The first one involves helping all of our churches across Canada catch a vision of this year's conference theme. We believe that if we take seriously the total issue of church growth we will experience more than a 2 percent increase in membership. Our executive director will give us capable leadership in this area.

Secondly, we wish to develop a Christian Service program to involve our young people who wish to serve the Lord full-time. Twice as many youth go into non-Mennonite Brethren missions organizations as into denominational work. The work in Eastern Canada, and in particular Laval Bible Institute, will continue to be a harvest field requiring considerable investment and guidance.

We believe there is an urgency about these challenges that require our best efforts as a conference. We ask for your prayer support for our Brother Nikkel as well as for the entire work of evangelism. May God create in us a zeal and fervor for the work of His Kingdom. The doors are open although the workers are few.

Executive Director's Report:

Canada is a great country for evangelism and church growth. The Lord has blessed us as a Conference with many resources and vast opportunities. The challenge lies in recognizing our potential and in harnessing our resources for the work of evangelism, church growth and church planting.

We need to be very thankful for the many Canadian churches that are actively involved in reaching new people with the gospel. Evangelism and growth through the existing local churches must have a strong priority in our church constituency. We, as churches, conferences, and schools must stand together in helping one another in this task of developing healthy, growing, witnessing churches.

Our further priority must lie in the planting of new churches. The vision of Christ was for geographic advancement of the Word into new territories. Church planting and evangelism go hand in hand in the book of Acts. New churches mean new pulpits, new leaders, new audiences, new commitments, and new challenges.

A new church is like a new marriage. It is full of hope and enthusiasm. Just as parents look forward to the eventual establishment of new homes through their children, so churches should look forward to and plan for the establishment of one or more daughter churches.

The urgency of these priorities of church growth evangelism is in our concern for fellow Canadians to have eternal life. While we cannot minimize or overlook man's social needs and injustices, we must, however, recognize that man's greatest problem and disadvantage is his alienation from God outside of a personal redemptive relationship with Jesus Christ.

The Board of Evangelism is committed to help Canadian churches with these evangelism priorities. We are available to serve the Canadian churches in the areas of evangelism workshops, church growth seminars, mission conferences and church planting consultations. With the help of God and the faithfulness of His people the vision of Christ for Canada can be realized. Let us work together toward this end.

CANADIAN CHRISTIAN SERVICE

Presently this entire program is under review. The program was transferred to the Canadian Conference in 1979 from Mennonite Brethren Missions/Services. Since then the Board of Evangelism has administered the program on a limited basis. The concern of the Board is not to unnecessarily duplicate the voluntary service program already in existence in Canada. At the same time there appears to be a need for short term summer youth teams and resource couples to work within remote or new church settings. We have many resourceful people of all ages who could be used in the service of the Lord.

CAMP PENIEL

The Peniel Camp is operated by the Quebec Association and conducts a full slate of summer programs. This summer several major repairs and renovations need to be made in order to satisfy the provincial government inspectors. The cost is expected to be near \$20,000. The Quebec Association has asked us to assist them in carrying this expense.

HOME MISSIONS RESEARCH

The Board of Evangelism is cooperating with Peter Penner in researching the developments of the Canadian Mission and Church Extension programs in the various areas of Canada. Professor Penner is doing this alongside his academic work at Mount Allison University, Sackville, New Brunswick.

INSTITUT BIBLIQUE LAVAL

Since the inception of the Bible school in 1976 the school has grown to the extent that 14 percent of the Quebec church members have taken classes, either as full-time or part-time students. This past year some 66 students were involved in taking classes. Five of the more recent graduates of the Laval Bible School are full time pastors. The full-time faculty of the school are Ben Klassen, Jean Theoret and Gerald Janzen. Serving part-time were Jean Isch, Albert Hodder, Robert Dagenais and Henry Derksen. Martha Wall and Jeannine Lambert share the office responsibilities.

The greatest need at present is for a longer term francophone school president. Donations to the Board of Evangelism help support this worthwhile project.

ENGLISH EASTERN CANADA

Waterloo, Quebec: Rod and Julia Zook are in charge of two worship groups, one in Waterloo and the other in Cowansville. Their work is much appreciated. Presently we are looking for a Christian Service couple to help in this ministry of outreach.

Dartmouth, Nova Scotia: George and Ruth Wiens are entering their second year of ministry in Dartmouth. The church is making good progress in its witness to the community. We appreciate their ministry in the Maritimes.

GENEROUS DONATIONS

The Board of Evangelism graciously acknowledges the many generous donations received for the work of evangelism across Canada. These funds have been used in assisting churches in evangelism ministry and in extending the ministries of evangelism in Quebec and Eastern Canada. Again we encourage you to invest in the work of evangelizing the unreached.

QUEBEC CONFERENCE

The present seven Mennonite Brethren churches of Quebec have been taking active steps in the direction of becoming a provincial conference. These churches have already related as an association for some years. In fall they meet together with all the member churches in a Conference Thanksgiving celebration, and in spring they meet as delegates in a business session. Each church elects its delegates to the Association Quebecoise, which takes charge of the provincial Mennonite Brethren concerns and programs.

The Association is sub-divided into five committees: The Coordination Committee, Finance Committee, Evangelism Committee, Camp Committee and the Bible School Committee. The Association also appoints observer delegates to the various Canadian Conference boards. Financial support to the Quebec work by the Canadian Conference is made through the Quebec Association Finance Committee.

QUEBEC EVANGELISM PROJECTIONS

The Quebec Association, through their Evangelism Committee,

has drafted a five-year church planting proposal that calls for each present church to develop a daughter church through evangelism out-reach efforts.

Beyond this the Association expects to plant four more churches through the efforts of the Association Evangelism Committee. Robert Dagenais, the Chairman of the Evangelism Committee, expects the church number to grow to sixteen in the next five years. Their ambitious ten-year plan envisions a Quebec Conference of forty Mennonite Brethren churches.

SPECIFIC PROJECTS

- 1. The St. Donat Chapel: This new church with 41 members, under severe public opposition from local Catholics, has undertaken to purchase a strategically located restaurant which is being renovated. We have committed ourselves to help them. We need help to raise \$60,000.
- 2. Camp Peniel Renovations: The expected cost of upgrading the camp's health standards will be near \$20,000. We, as a Conference, would like to provide \$12,000 through church donations.
- 3. Institut Biblique Laval: The Board of Evangelism provides some \$100,000 for training in evangelism and church planting.
- 4. Quebec New Church Planting: Together with the Evangelism Committee in Quebec, some \$40,000 are needed to start new churches. Our first church in Quebec City will be launched this summer by David Franco.

PART I Report by Provincial Conferences

Some Observations:

I. Membership

1. All provincial conferences increased their membership by a total of 761 or 3.3%. (444/2.0% in 1980)

IV. Church Leadership

1. There is a decrease of 23 BC4AS missionaries from 114 to 91 whereas missionaries with non-4B missions (223) and ACC (65) are holding steady from 1980 levels at 228 and 69 respectively.

Christian Educational Institutions

This information was obtained by writing directly to the institution concerned.

1. 107 MB ffiliated students attended Briarcrest Bible Institute last year - 32.8% of the total number (326) of MB students who attend MB Bible Institutes.

2. $58~\rm{B}$ affiliated students attended Forchbearer (Capernwray) schools in 1981 (117 in 1980).

V. Finances

- 1. The average Canadian donation receipts per member were \$820 (\$7'3 1980), possibly reflecting the economic "crunch", although it is a 10% increase over 1980.
- 2. Expenditures on local operation of church program have increased from 56% (§9,283,110) to 64% (§11,§56,563) as a percentage of the church budget.
- 3. Donations have increased to BO 4A3 from \$1,742,100 to \$1,913.363 by \$171,263 or 9.8% and to 400 from \$498,505 to \$536,865 by \$38,360 or 7.6%.
- 4. The question is often raised when discussing donations, "Yes, but how much of it goes elsewhere?". In response to this, with the assistance of sixteen helpful brothers scattered in the provincial conferences (except Quebec where there didn't appear to be any motivation for this survey), 160 persons from 16 churches were asked the question, "what persentage of your donations are not channelled through your local church treasury?". The average worked out to 18.76. A broad range of congregational sizes was represented in the survey, representing an aggregate of 3798 church members. A similar survey done in 1975, based on 8 Canadian AB churches resulted in a figure of 18.0%.

Report by Church Categories

Some Observations:

- 1. The median (average) sized Canadian AB congregation in 1981 was Gem (Alta) with 89. That is, one half of the Canadian MB congregations are larger than Gem and one half of them are smaller than Gem.
- 2. Church category #3 (400-499) experienced a net loss of 11 members, or .4%.
- 3. As observed in past years, the smaller congregations tend to "out perform" the larger congregations.
 - a. Categories #6 (100-199), #7 (50-99), #8 (2-49), or 36.7% of the total denominational membership accounted for 48% of the total membership gains. These same churches accounted for 73% of new members converted through the ministry of the congregation (neither parent an MB church member).

However, these smaller churches are also hurting. All categories had members added through baptism except 4 churches in category #5 (200-299), 12 in category #7 (50-99) and 20 in #8 (2-49). It would seem that our conference activities have a bias toward larger congregations. Aight the college and seminary make it a special area of focus to assist these smaller congregations who are struggling and assist them in capitalizing on the strengths of small groups. The gifts of the pastors of the 'successful' small congregations ought not to be forgotten in any such conference effort.

b. Notice too, the percentage of Sunday School attendance throughout the categories. The figures expressed are a percentage of church membership and include in attendance also the staff.

CANADIAN CONFERENCE

July 9-13, 1982

Worthy Delegates:

With David we say, "You make me (us) glad by your deeds, O Lord" (Ps. 92:4). Our Savior's work on earth included training disciples who became leaders. Without leaders, the church is paralyzed. Neither the church nor the Conference can neglect the nurture of leaders.

Thanks to your prayers, the year of 1981-82 has been an exceptionally enjoyable and profitable one. The emphasis on the spiritual life of prayer and discipline with Richard Foster in November was a highlight for many of us. Those two days set the tone. Spiritual growth continues to have high priority at the school. The decade of the 80's will focus more sharply on mission with a move "from maintenance to mission". The Board has approved in principle the establishment of a Center for Training in Mission.

GRADUATES

For the second year in a row 40 seniors graduated in June. Of these several assumed pastoral positions in Canada: Ontario - 1, Manitoba - 3, Saskatchewan - 1, British Columbia - 2. The first French Canadian M.B. Serves as teacher at the Institut Biblique Laval in Quebec. The first Mennonite Brethren Hispanic graduate will serve with BOMAS in Mexico. Another graduate returned to Paraguay, still another to Germany. International students are growing in number. Russian, German, French and Spanish are regularly spoken on campus. For next year, 10 of the 33 admitted applicants are from abroad.

FACULTY

In addition to classroom teaching and writing, faculty (12 including two on retirement basis) have ministered extensively in Bible Conferences, including various Canadian churches. George Konrad

served in the Paraguay extension work; Hans Kasdorf directs the Church Mission Institute in Winnipeg this year (with BOMAS).

In January David Ewert accepted the presidency of the Mennonite Brethren Bible College. The Seminary regrets that he is leaving but the Lord graciously supplied in the person of Hugo Zorrilla. Dr. Zorrilla has a Ph. D. degree in New Testament, is a Mennonite Brethren from Columbia where he was nurtured in Mennonite Brethren missions. Larry Martens, formerly a pastor in Kansas and known in the USA as speaker on the Words of the Gospel program, joins the faculty this fall in Practical Theology. Next year's faculty then will consist of several whose roots are in Canada, others who are American citizens and two who come from Latin America.

PROGRAM

Exciting news came following the official accreditation visit last fall. The Seminary program has been accredited by the Association of Theological Schools for a 10-year period. This vote of confidence in quality education is most reassuring.

The curriculum has been redesigned to give even more attention to the church and its ministry. A core set of courses includes Biblical Theology, Christology, Missions, Church Ministry. An internship of three months in a church will be required of those who come without former pastoral work, Christian education and mission. The two year Master of Arts program provides options in Old Testament, New Testament and Theology.

OPERATIONAL BUDGET

Through careful management, the Seminary has remained within its budget. Contributions from the churches to us through the Board of Trustees have made the necessary operating monies available. Next year's budget of \$929,000 was cut by \$30,000 in view of the economy. The subsidy from the Canadian churches for the 1982-83 year totals \$197,000, which compares to \$173,000 last year.

CAMPUS DEVELOPMENT

On March 1 construction began for a much needed Teaching/Student Center Wing of 8,800 square feet. The total project cost is \$500,000. Thanks to the contribution from churches, but more especially from a select number of large-gift donors, \$400,000 was available by March 1 in cash and pledges. By May 1 the total was \$430,000. The financial response has been marvellous. We thank you and we thank God.

The Hiebert Library (\$600,000) was completed in 1980. The campus, now landscaped, is attractive. We invite students and we invite you.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

- 1. The Seminary has moved to a semester system. Fall: September 1-December 17; Interterm of 3 weeks: January 3-21; and Spring: February 7 May 20.
- 2. The School for Ministry on the theme of Worship will be held January 26-28. Dr. LeRoy Kennel of the Mennonite Church; Bishop Don Schafer of the Brethren in Christ and Larry Martens together with other Seminary faculty are major resource persons.

3. The Educators Seminar, March 30 - April 1 (Easter) is designed for teachers (elementary - university), principals, administrators.

The stewardship of leadership training is often overwhelming as to demands. We acknowledge inefficiencies and inadequacies, but we also give testimony to the abundant grace of God and to the wonderful support by a great brotherhood.

May God continue to uphold you in your ministry."

Resolution #3 - regarding the Executive of the Conference
"As a Conference we would like to thank the Lord and our

Conference Executive for planning and leading an interesting inspirational and very profitable conference in 1982. The theme was very timely and challenging and was effectively presented throughout. The "Morning Watch" added to the spirit of prayer and expectation of God's blessing. The films and special music were very instructive and uplifting. The activities planned for younger members of the family were much appreciated. Our prayer is that God will bless the executive in their fine work and that we as a Conference will seriously become involved in 'lengthening our cords and strengthening our stakes' during the coming year."

Bi-Centennial Celebration - For 1986 a bi-centennial celebration, commemorating the arrival of the Mennonites to Canada, is being planned for the Kitchener, Waterloo, area to which all Mennonite Conferences are invited, with our Conference being one of them. This would mean that the 1986 Convention will need to be held in Ontario, Canada.

Upon motion this was accepted.

Closing - After an expression of appreciation for a fine convention,
